## AN ACT

## ESTABLISHING THE SOUTHERN LUZON STATE UNIVERSITY-CATANAUAN CAMPUS-COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** *Establishment.* – There is hereby established a College of Veterinary Medicine in the Catanauan Campus of the Southern Luzon State University in the Municipality of Catanauan, Province of Quezon, to be known as the "Southern Luzon State University-Catanauan Campus-College of Veterinary Medicine".

SEC. 2. General Mandate. – The Southern Luzon State University-Catanauan Campus-College of Veterinary Medicine, hereinafter referred to as the "College", shall primarily offer a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) Program. It shall be a six-year course consisting of a two-year preparatory veterinary medicine curriculum, including general education courses, and a four-year professional veterinary medicine curriculum consisting of basic animal sciences, and veterinary medical sciences, and using learning competency-based standards and outcomes-based approach. The primary goal of the College shall be to develop a corps of professional veterinary physicians who are adept in the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and control of animal diseases, including terrestrial and aquatic animals.

SEC. 3. [Implementation of Programs and Projects] GOVERNANCE. – [The DVM program shall be implemented by the Board of Trustees in accordance with] THE GOVERNANCE OF THE COLLEGE SHALL BE VESTED IN THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE SLSU (THE BOARD), WHOSE POWERS ARE DEFINED UNDER Republic Act No. 9395, entitled "An Act Converting the Southern Luzon Polytechnic College in the Municipality of Lucban, Province of Quezon, its Units and Satellite Campuses in the Municipalities of Sampaloc, Infanta, Polillo, Tagkawayan, Alabat and Tiaong, and the Lucena Dual-Tech Livelihood and Training Center in the City of Lucena, all in the Province of Quezon, into a State University to be Known as the Southern Luzon State University (SLSU) and Appropriating Funds Therefor". [Moreover, all

other]THE DVM PROGRAM, AND ALL programs, projects and activities to be implemented in the College shall be in accordance with state policies on education, other pertinent provisions of the Philippine Constitution, as well as the policies, standards, guidelines, and the thrust of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED).

[SEC. 4. Compliance with CHED Requirements. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Act, the establishment of the College shall become effective only upon the determination and declaration by the CHED, based on the recommendation of a panel of experts constituted for the purpose, that the SLSU-Catanauan Campus has complied with the policies, standards, and guidelines of the CHED Memorandum Order No. 01, series of 2018, for the DVM Program: Provided, That the panel may issue such recommendation when the SLSU-Catanauan Campus has substantially complied with the minimum requirements for the program.]

SEC. 4. COMPLIANCE WITH CHED REQUIREMENTS. – THE SLSU, PRIOR TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COLLEGE AND THE OFFERING OF NEW AND REVISED COURSES AND PROGRAMS RELATED THERETO, SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE APPLICABLE POLICIES, STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES OF THE CHED.

SEC. 5. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS AND ADMISSION. – THE COLLEGE SHALL PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIPS AND OTHER AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAMS TO ASSIST POOR BUT DESERVING STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE. STUDENTS AVAILING THEMSELVES OF NATIONALLY-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS TO COMPLETE THE DVM PROGRAM UNDER THE COLLEGE SHALL BE REQUIRED TO RENDER A RETURN SERVICE AS PROVIDED FOR BY APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS, OR THE CONTRACT TO BE SIGNED BETWEEN THE STUDENT AND THE COLLEGE.

NO STUDENT SHALL BE DENIED ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE BY REASON OF SEX, GENDER, RELIGION, CULTURAL OR COMMUNITY AFFILIATION, PHYSICAL DISABILITY, ETHNIC ORIGIN, OR ANY OTHER FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION.

**SEC.** [5]6. *Duty and Tax Exemptions.* – The importation by the College of medical, scientific, and technical books or publications, medical equipment or instruments which are for medical, laboratory or scientific and technical purposes shall, upon certification by the CHED, be exempt from customs duties in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10863, otherwise known as the "Customs Modernization and Tariff Act".

All grants, bequests, endowments, donations, and contributions made to and used actually, directly, and exclusively for educational purposes by the College, shall be exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from gross income for purposes of computing the taxable income of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.

**SEC.** [6]7. Appropriations. – The amount necessary for the effective implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

1	SEC. [7]8. Suppletory Application. – The provisions of Republic Act No. 8292,

SEC. [10]11. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
