### INTRODUCED BY SENATOR JOSEPH VICTOR G. EJERCITO

## AN ACT ESTABLISHING A CENTER FOR AUTISM AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a brain-based disorder that affects a child's behavior, communication skills and social skills. It includes Asperger's Syndrome, Rett Syndrome, Childhood disintegrative disorder, Kanner's syndrome and PDD-not otherwise specified (PDDNOS). Recent data from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), autism affects about one (1) out of every sixty-eight (68) persons. In the Philippines, it is said that one (1) in 100 Filipinos or 1.2 million are on the autism spectrum.<sup>1</sup>

Thus, it is but proper to give significance and emphasis on the role of the government to take care of our children and adults who have autism and intellectual disabilities.

Accordingly, this measure seeks for the creation of a Center for Autism in the country which will help create diagnostic, therapeutic and rehabilitation clinics, provide vocational training programs for autistic adults provide free diagnosis and rehabilitation services to indigent autistic, provide

continuing training programs for teachers, therapists, and other medical professionals, provide other services such as counseling, orientation and referral, and increase public awareness and concern on autism by spearheading advocacy programs.

The Center for Autism shall be governed by the National Autism Board which shall be under the Office of the President. The Board shall be composed of the representatives from the Department of Health, Department of Education, Department pf Social Welfare and Development, National Council for the Welfare of Disabled Persons, Autism society of the Philippines, and parents of children and adults with autism.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

## INTRODUCED BY SENATOR JOSEPH VICTOR G. EJERCITO

# AN ACT ESTABLISHING A CENTER FOR AUTISM AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Declaration of Policy -* It is hereby declared the policy of the state to promote and protect the right of all individuals to live a full, healthy, holistic and quality life. This includes individuals who are suffering from autism or any kind of developmental disability. Therefore, the state shall promote and protect the rights of autistic individuals by providing them adequate support through easy access to health care, educational and other services.

- Sec. 2. *Definition of Terms* For purposes of this Act, the terms below shall be constructed to mean, except where explicitly indicated or where the text clearly indicates otherwise as follows:
  - a. *Autism*—is a developmental disability that appears during the first three years of life; the result of a neurological disorder that affects the functioning of the brain;
  - b. Disability shall mean 1) a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more psychological, physiological or anatomical function of an individual or activities of such individual; 2) a record of such an impairment; or 3) regarded as having such an impairment;

1	C.	Disabled Girted - persons who demonstrate superior performance
2		capabilities in intellectual, creative, specific academic areas, leadership,
3		or in the arts in spite of physical, sensory or psychological disabilities;
4	d.	Disabled Worker- means a worker whose earning capacity is impaired
5		by mental, physical, or sensory deficiency or injury;
6	e.	Handicap - refers to disadvantage for given individual, resulting from
7		an impairment of disability that limits or prevents the function of
8		activity, that is considered normal given the age and sex of the
9		individual;
10	f.	Impairment - is any loss, diminution or aberration of psychological,
11		physiological, or anatomical structure of function;
12	g.	Indigent patient- a disabled person whose level of income falls below
13		poverty threshold;
14	h.	Rehabilitation - an integrated approach to physical, psychological,
15		cultural, spiritual, educational, or vocational, measures that create
16		conditions for individual to attain the highest possible level of functional
17		ability; and,
18	i.	Special Education (SPED) - type of education specifically designed for
19		learners with special needs who cannot profit maximally from regular
20		education such that they require trained personnel modifications in the
21		curricula, teaching methods, instructional materials and adaptations in
22		facilities equipment.
23	Sec. 3	. Creation of a Center for Autism - There is hereby created a Center for
24	Autism which	shall be tasked to perform the following functions:
25	a.	Formulate and implement an integrated and comprehensive master
26		plan;
27	b.	Create a diagnostic, therapeutic and rehabilitation clinic;
28	C.	Provide vocational training programs for autistic adults;
29	d.	Provide free diagnosis and rehabilitation services to indigent autistic;
30	e.	Provide continuing training programs for teachers, therapists, and other
31		medical professionals;

1	f.	Provide other services such as counseling, orientation and referral; and
2	g.	Increase public awareness and concern on autism by spear heading
3		advocacy programs.
4	Sec.	4. Governing Board Composition, Term, Functions - There is hereby
5	created a Na	ational Autism Board, hereby referred to as the Board, which shall be
6	under the Of	ffice of the President. The Board shall govern the Center for Autism and
7	shall be com	posed of the following:
8	a.	One (1) representative from the Department of Health, who shall sit as
9		Chairperson;
10	b.	One (1) representative from the Department of Education who shall sit as the Vice-Chairperson;
12	C	One (1) representative from the Department of Social Welfare and
13	Ci.	Developmental as Member;
4	d.	Two (2) representatives from the National Council for the Welfare of
5		Disabled Persons as Members;
6	e.	Two (2) representatives from the Autism Society of the Philippines as
7		Members; and,
8	f.	Two (2) representatives from the Parents of Children and Adults with
9		Autism as Members.
20	Sec. 5	5. Secretariat - The Board shall have a Secretariat under an Executive
21	Officer who	shall be appointed by the President. The Executive Officer shall manage
22	the day-to-d	ay operations of the Board and shall be assisted by a Deputy Executive
23	Officer who	shall likewise be appointed by the President.
24	The E	xecutive Officer shall have the following powers and functions:
25	a.	Execute, administer and implement the policies and measures approved
26		by the Board;
27	b.	Direct and supervise the affairs and operations of the Board;
28	c.	Submit within thirty (30) days after the close of every calendar year an
29		annual report to the Board and such other reports it may require;

- d. Submit an annual budget and such supplementary budgets as may be necessary to the Board for its consideration and approval;
- e. Represent the Board in all transactions with other offices, agencies, instrumentalities of government and with all persons and other entities, public or private, domestic or foreign; and,
- f. Appoint, subject to confirmation of the Board, and discipline in accordance with Civil Service laws, rules and regulations, the officers and personnel below the level of Deputy Executive Officer.

The Deputy Executive Officer shall perform the following functions:

- a. Assist the Executive Officer in the discharge of his powers and functions;
- b. Act as the Executive Officer during the Executive Officer's absence; and,
- c. Discharge such other powers and functions as may be required by the Executive Officer and the Board.
- Sec. 6. *Appropriations* For the initial operating expenses of the Center, the amount of Fifty Million Pesos (50,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the available funds of the Office of the President. Thereafter, it shall submit to the Department of Budget and Management, its proposed budget for inclusion in the General Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 7. *Transitory Provisions* Within the period of one hundred and eighty (180) days after the approval of this Act, the Board constituted shall start its operation. All other government offices having functions similar to the Board shall then cease to perform such functions. Henceforth, these functions shall be deemed transferred to the board.
- Sec. 8. *Implementing Rules and Regulations* The Board in consolation with appropriate agencies from the private and government sectors shall issue guidelines and prescribe rules and regulations within one hundred (100) days after the effectivity of this Act. A copy of such guidelines, rules and regulations shall be furnished to the Congress of the Philippines.

- Sec. 9. *Separability Clause* Should any provision of this Act, be declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions of this Act which are not affected hereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
- Sec. 10. *Repealing Clause* All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations and other issuances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
- Sec. 11. *Effectivity* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines.
