## **Introduced by SEN. WIN GATCHALIAN**

## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE HUMAN TRAFFICKING INSIDE THE CLARK FREEPORT ZONE WHICH ARE BEING LINKED TO PHILIPPINE OFFSHORE GAMING OPERATORS (POGO), WITH AN END VIEW OF CRAFTING A LEGISLATION OR POLICY RECOMMENDATION, AS MAY BE NECESSARY.

- WHEREAS, on May 4, 2023, law enforcers conducted a raid on the Colorful and
- Leap Group Company located at Clark Sun Valley Hub<sup>1</sup>, Clark Freeport Zone<sup>2</sup> which
- led to the rescue of 1,090 individuals, of which, 389 are Vietnamese, 307 are Chinese,
- 4 171 are Filipinos, 143 are Indonesians, 40 are Nepalese, 25 are Malaysians, 7 are
- 5 Burmese, 5 are Thai, 2 are Taiwanese, and 1 from Hong Kong<sup>3</sup>;
- 6 WHEREAS, the raid was based on six search warrants and a warrant to search,
- 7 seize, and examine computer data issued by the Bulacan Regional Trial Court Branch
- 8 81 dated May 04, 2023, for violation of Republic Act (RA) No. 10364, or the Expanded
- 9 Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2012, in relation to Section 6 of RA No. 10175, or
- the Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012<sup>4</sup>;

WHEREAS, it is alleged that the rescued foreign nationals were forced to work in a "fraudulent cyber-enabled industry" whose modus operandi is to lure victims to invest in cryptocurrencies;

WHEREAS, the raided compound, where Colorful and Leap Group Company is located, is suspected to be a POGO hub inside the Clark Freeport Zone<sup>5</sup>;

WHEREAS, the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corp. (PAGCOR) will take a look at the licenses issued to POGOs following a recent raid on a business processing company suspected to be involved in illegal activities<sup>6</sup>;

WHEREAS, based on the information submitted by the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI), there are 113 POGO-related cases recorded from 2017 to March 2023 and 65 of which are being investigated by the Anti-Human Trafficking Group of the NBI;

WHEREAS, one of the state policies enunciated in no less than the 1987 Philippine Constitution is that "[t]he State values the dignity of every human person and guarantees full respect for human rights"<sup>7</sup>;

WHEREAS, further to the foregoing, the 1987 Philippine Constitution prohibits all forms of involuntary servitude except as a punishment for a crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted<sup>8</sup>;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the above-mentioned state policy, there is a need to determine the lapses and loopholes in government processes that led to the facilitation of human trafficking in Philippine soil that undermines the human dignity of the trafficked persons and also violates their rights against involuntary servitude;

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, the continued existence of POGOs and its service providers, whether legitimate or illegitimate, that are involved in criminalities continue to smear the name of the Philippines in the international community, pose a threat to the peace and order in the country; and undermine the safety of the Filipinos and foreign nationals in the Philippines

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing and on the alarming increase of human trafficking incidents being linked to POGOs, there is a need to re-examine the framework of the POGO operations in the Philippines, combat and stop the crimes linked to POGOs, close down the POGOs involved in the commission of these crimes, and arrest the persons behind it;

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate, to direct the appropriate Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the alleged human trafficking perpetuated inside the Clark Freeport Zone which are being linked with POGOs, with an end view of crafting a legislation or policy recommendation, as may be necessary.
