RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY IN AID OF LEGISLATION ON THE STATE OF CALAMITY STATUS OF SAMAL ISLAND DUE TO THE POWER CRISIS WITH AN END IN VIEW OF FINDING SHORT AND LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO THE DEFICIENCY OF ELECTRICITY SUPPLY IN THE ISLAND

1 WHEREAS, the Island Garden City of Samal is currently experiencing a severe power crisis, leading to frequent power outages and disruptions in the daily lives of its 2 residents; 3 WHEREAS, Samal Island is now under a state of calamity due to the prolonged 4 power crisis, causing significant hardships to its population; 5 6 WHEREAS, the Northern Davao Electric Cooperative (NORDECO) has been identified as a potential contributor to the power crisis in Samal Island, allegedly due 7 to its negligence and failure to adequately address the increasing electricity demand 8 9 in the area; WHEREAS, the power outages on Samal Island have been ongoing since last 10 year, with an average duration of seven (7) to eight (8) hours during peak load and 11 two (2) to three (3) hours during off-peak periods; 12 WHEREAS, the rise of tourist establishments, such as resorts, restaurants, and 13 14 markets, has led to a significant increase in electricity demand on Samal Island, from 3 megawatts (MW) to 9MW; 15

WHEREAS, Samal Island is connected to the Pantukan Grid via a submarine cable owned by NORDECO, which was installed in the 1980s and can no longer support the entire capacity of the island;

WHEREAS, the current electricity supply in Samal Island is insufficient to meet the demand, with the Mindoro Grid Corporation (MGC) providing an installed capacity of 6.962MW and NORDECO with 3MW installed capacity but only 6.12MW is available for dispatch for demand of 9MW;

WHEREAS, NORDECO, formerly known as Davao del Norte Electric Cooperative, Inc. (DANECO), has faced criticism from its consumer cooperatives for its failure to provide a stable power supply to its area coverage;

WHEREAS, there is a need to investigate the power crisis in Samal Island and hold accountable those responsible for the deficiency in electricity supply;

WHEREAS, it is crucial to find a long-term solution to the power crisis on Samal Island to ensure reliable and stable electric service for its residents and the growing tourism industry;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, that the Senate Committee on Energy is requested to conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation on the state of calamity status of Samal Island due to the power crisis, with an end in view of finding short and long-term solutions to the deficiency of electricity supply in the island;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee on Energy shall investigate the NORDECO and assess its negligence, if any, in failing to address the increasing electricity demand on Samal Island;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee on Energy shall explore potential solutions to the power crisis, including the replacement of the antiquated submarine cable and the establishment of a more reliable and sustainable power supply system;

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Committee on Energy shall consider the inclusion of provisions in the Power Supply Agreement that require replacement power, such as modular generator sets, to ensure uninterrupted and reliable electric service, and that the "causer's pay" clause be included therein to hold the responsible

- 1 party accountable for any power service failures, thereby relieving the consumers from
- 2 the burden of additional charges.
