RESOLUTION

COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE PHILIPPINE DELEGATION TO THE 32ND SOUTHEAST ASIAN GAMES FOR ABLY REPRESENTING THE COUNTRY AND BRINGING HOME 58 GOLD, 85 SILVER AND 117 BRONZE MEDALS FROM THE BIENNIAL MEET

1 WHEREAS, the Senate of the Philippines has consistently recognized 2 outstanding Filipino athletes who ably represented the country and won in prestigious 3 international sports competitions, thereby bringing honor and pride to the Filipino 4 nation;

5 WHEREAS, the 32nd edition of the Southeast Asian Games (SEA Games) was 6 held for the first time in Phnom Penh, Cambodia from 05 to 17 May, 2023. Over 6,200 7 athletes from eleven countries across the Southeast Asian region participated in a total 8 of 584 events in 37 sports in the biennial meet;

9 WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the multi-sports event, the Philippine delegation 10 composed of 846 athletes, finished fifth place overall as it garnered 58 gold, 85 silver 11 and 117 bronze medals or a total of 260 medals, surpassing the country's medal output 12 last year during the 31st SEA Games in Hanoi, Vietnam, and delivering the country's 13 best overseas performance since 1987 when it won 59 golds in Indonesia;

14 WHEREAS, the following Filipino athletes and national teams bagged the 15 highest honors and gold medals in the SEA Games:

10 WHEREAS, national and regional records in various sports events were 11 shattered by Filipino athletes during the SEA Games, as in the victories of Ando who 12 raised the bar in her weightlifting class, Obiena who smashed his standing pole vault 13 mark, and Salvino who registered a record time in swimming;

WHEREAS, the Taekwondo national team captured six gold medals, a significant leap from their previous two gold medal output in the Hanoi meet. The national team of Arnis also impressed with six gold medals, as the Filipino martial arts discipline debuted as a medal sport outside of the country;

18 WHEREAS, the Gilas Pilipinas Men's team reclaimed the regional championship 19 title and reaffirmed the country's stature as a basketball powerhouse following a 20 second-place finish in the 31st SEA Games in Vietnam;

21 WHEREAS, the wrestling team copped a total of four gold medals, its strongest 22 showing since collecting five golds in the 2005 SEA Games. Meanwhile, Team 23 Philippines swept all four gold medals and topped the men's and women's individual 24 and team events in obstacle course races;

25 WHEREAS, the boxing team exemplified Filipino courage and agility as it 26 garnered four gold medals, while the gymnastics team scored four golds, two of which 27 courtesy of world champion Yulo;

28 WHEREAS, the inspiring stories of our athletes, such as Ubas who finally 29 claimed his first SEA Games gold medal in men's long jump following runner-up 30 finishes in four previous editions of the Games, and jiu-jitsu fighter Lim who clinched 31 gold in his third bid, motivate the Filipinos that they can accomplish anything with 32 consistent hard work and perseverance; 1 WHEREAS, the Filipino athletes, medallists, coaching teams, and delegates to 2 the Southeast Asian Games successfully demonstrated before the international stage the athletic prowess, sportsmanship and indomitable spirit of the nation, as they 3 competed and ruled in their respective sports events; 4

WHEREAS, the athletes and the entire Philippine contingent devoted months of preparation and personal training to hone their skills, self-discipline, physical strength, 6 and fortitude ultimately to become their best and proudly represent the country before 7 8 the regional tournament;

9 WHEREAS, the remarkable achievements and the great performance of the 10 Philippine team in the SEA Games brought immense glory, inspiration and pride to the country, thus truly deserving of commendation from the Philippine Senate; 11

12 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate, to commend and congratulate the Philippine delegation to the 32nd Southeast Asian 13 14 Games for ably representing the country and bringing home 58 gold, 85 silver and 117 15 bronze medals from the biennial meet.
