RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ALLEGED IMPROPER, UNFAIR, NON-TRANSPARENT, AND ABUSIVE GRADING PRACTICES OF AND IMPROPER AND FRAUDULENT CREDITING OF UNITS BY PRIVATE HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS IN POSSIBLE VIOLATION OF BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 232 OR THE "EDUCATION ACT OF 1982" AND OTHER LAWS, AND REGULATIONS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION (CHED)

WHEREAS, on July 21, 2023, 140 graduating Civil Engineering students from the University of Manila, a private, non-sectarian co-educational basic and higher education institution, complained about the improper, unfair, non-transparent, and abusive grading practices by the University of Manila which resulted to their inability to graduate on time;

WHEREAS, based on the complaint by the graduating students, they took two (2) final examinations during the second (2nd) semester of School Year (SY) 2022 – 2023. The first exam was administered by the President's Office on April 25, 2023. The second exam was administered by their professor, Engineer Romero, on April 27, 2023. However, the results of the two (2) exams were never communicated nor released to the graduating students, leading to great confusion and uncertainty as to the status of their academic performance;

WHEREAS, it appears that University of Manila is severely under-staffed and has only around two (2) active professors teaching under its Engineering department

or course for its entire student population from 1st year students to 4th or 5th year students. Worse, Engr. Romero was teaching more than seven (7) major subjects in one semester and even resigned immediately after he has belatedly submitted the grades of his students;

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2023, the deadline for the filing of the Application of Candidacy for Graduation, or after almost three (3) months after the final examinations, the University of Manila informed the graduating Civil Engineering Students that their grades were belatedly submitted by their professor and was told to return on July 10, 2023;

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2023, the University of Manila plainly informed around 140 graduating students that they have failed in four (4) subjects, all taught by one and the same professor, with a uniform failing grade of 70, without showing any breakdown including the results of the two (2) final examinations;

WHEREAS, high-ranking officials of the University of Manila, including Deans, are not even aware of the weight of the final examinations administered by the President's Office to the final grades of students. Worse, the administration of the final examinations by the President's Office appears to be a blatant and patent violation of the Student Handbook promulgated by the University of Manila itself;

WHEREAS, despite the unscrupulous practice of the University of Manila, it still refuses to disclose the breakdown of the grades and the results of the final examinations to the graduating students and even insisted that the graduating students should re-take the final examinations for the four (4) major subjects without properly informing them if they truly passed or failed the four (4) subjects;

WHEREAS, after complaining about what appeared to be fraudulent practices by the University of Manila, a number of the graduating students who complained received serious threats about their safety and academic status in the University of Manila;

WHEREAS, Furthermore, on July 25, 2023, around 170 Accountancy Students of the University of Manila also complained about the improper, unfair, non-transparent, and abusive grading practices, and improper and fraudulent crediting of units by the University of Manila;

WHEREAS, the University of Manila already allowed these 170 Accountancy Students to graduate. However, when the students requested for their transcripts of records and diplomas, the University of Manila informed them that they still have to re-take two (2) examinations in two (2) courses which they have already passed;

WHEREAS, fearing that the release of their transcripts of records and diplomas will be further delayed, the students hesitantly re-took the two (2) examinations, despite the fact that they were already given passing marks for the two (2) subjects;

WHEREAS, the University of Manila released the grades of the students which showed a uniform grade of 70 for all students in one subject and another uniform grade of 75 for all students in the other subject. The University of Manila then just informed them that their only recourse is to re-enroll the subject that they now freshly "failed" after their graduation;

WHEREAS, contrary to what appeared to be fraudulent grades released by the University of Manila, the Accountancy Professor of the students in fact have provided a grading sheet which shows that all of the students passed the examinations;

WHEREAS, there were even allegations that the grades submitted by the Accountancy Professor were not accepted by the University of Manila because of an alleged personal conflict between the President of the University of Manila and the Accountancy Professor, which does not involve the aggrieved Accountancy Students;

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the possible violations of Batas Pambansa Blg. 232 or the "Education Act of 1982" and other laws, and regulations issued by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), with the end in view of recommending further measures to ensure and promote full compliance to the law and CHED regulations.
