MR. PRESIDENT:

The Committees on Higher, Technical and Vocational Education; Ways and Means; and Finance to which were referred **House Bill No. 7397**, introduced by Representatives Cabredo, Go (M.), Salceda, Macapagal-Arroyo, Ty, *et al*; entitled:

"AN ACT

ESTABLISHING IN THE CITY OF LIGAO, PROVINCE OF ALBAY,
A COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE OF THE BICOL
UNIVERSITY, TO BE KNOWN AS THE BICOL UNIVERSITYCOLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, AND APPROPRIATING
FUNDS THEREFOR"

have considered the same and have the honor to report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that House Bill No. 7397 be approved with the following amendments:

- On page 1, line 15, after the figure "3" and period ".", delete the word "Implementation" and insert the word, to serve as title of Section 3, "GOVERNANCE";
- On the same page, lines 15 to 16, delete the phrase "The implementation of the DVM program shall be in accordance with" and insert the phrase "THE GOVERNANCE OF THE COLLEGE SHALL BE VESTED IN THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE BU (THE BOARD), WHOSE POWERS ARE DEFINED UNDER";
- 3. On the same page, lines 17 to 20, replace the comma "(,)" after the word "Purposes" with a period "(.)", delete the phrase "and existing provisions of the Bicol University Code of 2016, particularly Chapter II, Section 4, which allows the Bicol University, through its Board of Regents, to promulgate and implement programs, projects and activities", and insert the phrase "THE DVM PROGRAM, AND ALL PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, AND ACTIVITIES TO BE IMPLEMENTED IN THE COLLEGE SHALL BE";
- 4. On page 2, lines 1 to 7, delete the entire section 4 and replace with the following:
 - COMPLIANCE **CHED** "SEC. 4. WITH BU, REOUIREMENTS. THE PRIOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COLLEGE AND THE OFFERING OF NEW AND REVISED COURSES AND PROGRAMS RELATED THERETO, SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH **STANDARDS** POLICIES, THE APPLICABLE **GUIDELINES OF THE CHED."**

5. Finally, on the same page, lines 9 to 18, delete the entire section 5 and replace with the following:

"SEC. 5. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS AND ADMISSION. — THE COLLEGE SHALL PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIPS AND OTHER AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAMS TO ASSIST POOR BUT DESERVING STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE. STUDENTS AVAILING THEMSELVES OF NATIONALLY-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS TO COMPLETE THE DVM PROGRAM UNDER THE COLLEGE SHALL BE REQUIRED TO RENDER A RETURN SERVICE AS PROVIDED FOR BY APLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS, OR THE CONTRACT TO BE SIGNED BETWEEN THE STUDENT AND THE COLLEGE.

"NO STUDENT SHALL BE DENIED ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE BY REASON OF SEX, GENDER, RELIGION, CULTURAL OR COMMUNITY AFFILIATION, PHYSICAL DISABILITY, ETHNIC ORIGIN, OR ANY OTHER FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION."



AN ACT

ESTABLISHING IN THE CITY OF LIGAO, PROVINCE OF ALBAY, A COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE OF THE BICOL UNIVERSITY, TO BE KNOWN AS THE BICOL UNIVERSITY-COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Establishment. – There is hereby established a College of Veterinary Medicine in the Bicol University, to be located in the City of Ligao, Province of Albay, which shall be known as the "Bicol University-College of Veterinary Medicine".

SEC. 2. General Mandate. – The Bicol University (BU)-College of Veterinary Medicine, hereinafter referred to as the "College", shall primarily offer a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) Program. The program shall be a six-year course consisting of a two-year preparatory veterinary medicine curriculum, including general education courses, and a four-year professional veterinary medicine curriculum consisting of basic animal sciences, and veterinary medical sciences, and using learning competency-based standards and outcomes-based approach. The primary goal of the College shall be to develop a corps of professional veterinary physicians who are adept in the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and control of animal diseases, including terrestrial and aquatic animals.

SEC. 3. Implementation. – The implementation of the DVM program shall be in accordance with Republic Act No. 5521, entitled "An Act Establishing the Bicol University, Defining its Powers, Functions, and Duties, Appropriating Funds Therefor, and for Other Purposes", and existing provisions of the Bicol University Code of 2016, particularly Chapter II, Section 4, which allows the Bicol University, through its Board of Regents, to promulgate and implement programs, projects and activities in accordance with state policies on education, other pertinent provisions of the Philippine Constitution, as well as the policies, standards and the thrust of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED).

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SEC. 4. Compliance with CHED Requirements. – The provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the establishment of the College shall become effective only upon the determination and declaration by the CHED, based on the recommendation of a panel of experts constituted for the purpose, that the BU has complied with the policies, standards, and guidelines of the CHED Memorandum Order No. 01, series of 2018, for the establishment of a College of Veterinary Medicine and the offering of a DVM Program: *Provided*, That the panel may issue such recommendation when the BU has substantially complied with the minimum requirements for the program.

SEC. 5. Scholarship Programs and Admission. – The College shall provide scholarships and other affirmative action programs to assist poor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the College. Students who have availed themselves of the scholarship program under Republic Act No. 11509, otherwise known as the "Doktor Para sa Bayan Act", shall render a return service in accordance with the said law. Students availing themselves of other nationally-funded scholarship programs to complete the veterinary medicine degree program under the College may be required to render a return service depending on the contract to be signed between the student and the College.

No student shall be denied admission to the College by reason of gender, religion, cultural or community affiliation, physical disability, or ethnic origin.

SEC. 6. *Duty and Tax Exemptions.* — The importation by the College of medical, scientific, and technical books or publications, medical equipment or instruments which are for medical, laboratory or scientific and technical purposes shall, upon certification by the CHED, be exempt from customs duties in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10863, otherwise known as the "Customs Modernization and Tariff Act".

All grants, bequests, endowments, donations, and contributions made to and used actually, directly, and exclusively for educational purposes by the College, shall be exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from gross income for purposes of computing the taxable income of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.

- **SEC. 7.** *Appropriations.* The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- **SEC. 8.** Suppletory Application. The provisions of Republic Act No. 8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997", shall form part of this Act.
- **SEC. 9.** Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.
- **SEC. 10.** Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are amended, repealed, or modified accordingly.
- **SEC. 11.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
