#### AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR ORGANIZATIONAL REFORMS IN THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990", AS AMENDED, AND REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8551, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE REFORM AND REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1998"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended, is hereby
 further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 25. Organization. - [The PNP shall be headed by a Chief 4 who shall be assisted by two (2) deputy chiefs, one (1) for operations 5 and one (1) for administration, both of whom shall be appointed by 6 the President upon recommendation of the Commission from among 7 the most senior and qualified officers in the service: Provided, 8 however, That in no case shall any officer who has retired or is 9 retirable within -six-(6) months from his compulsory-retirement age be 10 appointed as Chief of the PNP.] The PNP shall be composed of a 11

national office, **AREA COMMANDS**, regional offices, provincial offices, district offices, **CITY OFFICES** and city or municipal stations.

At the national level, the [PNP shall maintain its office in 4 Metropolitan Manila which CHIEF OF THE PNP SHALL HAVE A 5 6 COMMAND GROUP COMPOSED OF THE OFFICES OF THE 7 DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR ADMINISTRATION, THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR OPERATIONS, AND THE 8 CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF. THE NATIONAL OFFICE 9 10 shall [house the] HAVE A directorial staff, [service staff] NATIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATIONAL SUPPORT UNITS, and 11 special [support units] POLICE OFFICES. 12

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# IN CLUSTERED POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES, THE PNP SHALL HAVE AREA POLICE COMMANDS.

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At the regional level, the PNP shall have **POLICE** regional 17 offices, including that of the National Capital Region POLICE OFFICE 18 (NCRPO), which may be divided into two (2) separate regions without 19 prejudice to the pertinent provisions of the Organic Act for the 20 Autonomous Region of the Cordilleras and THE ORGANIC LAW FOR 21 THE BANGSAMORO AUTONOMOUS REGION IN Muslim Mindanao 22 relative to the creation of a [regional] [p]Police **REGIONAL** [force] 23 24 **OFFICES** in the area of autonomy. [Each of these regional offices] POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES shall be headed by [a][r]Regional 25 [d]DirectorS [for peace and order]. 26

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# AT THE METROPOLITAN LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A DISTRICT OFFICE, HEADED BY A DISTRICT DIRECTOR.

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At the provincial level, there shall be a [PNP] POLICE PROVINCIAL office, [each] headed by a [p]Provincial [d]Director. In

- the case of large provinces, police districts may be established by the Commission to be headed by a [d]**D**istrict [d]**D**irector.
- AT THE HIGHLY URBANIZED AND INDEPENDENT COMPONENT CITY LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A CITY POLICE OFFICE, HEADED BY A CITY DIRECTOR.
- 8 At the **COMPONENT** city or municipal level, there shall be a 9 [PNP] **POLICE** station, [each] headed by a chief of police.
- 11 The Chief of the PNP shall, within sixty (60) days from the 12 effectivity of this Act and in accordance with the broad guidelines set 13 forth herein, recommend the organizational structure and staffing 14 pattern of the PNP to the Commission.
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16 SEC. 2. A new Section 25-A is hereby inserted in R. A. No. 6975, as amended, 17 to read as follows:

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"SEC. 25-A. PNP DIRECTORIAL STAFF. - THE DIRECTORIAL 19 STAFF SYSTEM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED TO ENHANCE THE 20 SPAN OF CONTROL BEING EXERCISED BY THE CHIEF OF THE 21 PNP IN THE ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION, AND CONTROL 22 OF THE PNP AND TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE EFFICIENT 23 AND EFFECTIVE WORKING RELATIONSHIP OF ALL PNP 24 **OFFICES: THE FOLLOWING DIRECTORATES SHALL CONTINUE** 25 TO PERFORM THEIR SPECIFIC FUNCTIONS UNDER THE 26 SUPERVISION AND AUTHORITY OF THE CHIEF OF THE 27 **DIRECTORIAL STAFF:** 28

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30(A) THE DIRECTORATE FOR PERSONNEL AND31RECORDS MANAGEMENT SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE32CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE MANAGEMENT OF PNP UNIFORMED

1 AND NON-UNIFORMED PERSONNEL, MANPOWER PROCUREMENT AND CONTROL, PERSONNEL RECORDS AND 2 **REPORTS, DISCIPLINE, MORALE AND WELFARE, LAW AND** 3 ORDER, PERSONNEL SERVICES AND 4 PERSONNEL PROCEDURES, AND MISCELLANEOUS FUNCTIONS ASSIGNED 5 **BY THE CHIEF OF THE PNP;** 6

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(B) THE DIRECTORATE FOR INTELLIGENCE SHALL 8 ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN ATTAINING 9 OBJECTIVES 10 INTELLIGENCE THROUGH **EFFECTIVE** MANAGEMENT OF ALL **INTELLIGENCE** AND 11 **COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES OF THE PNP;** 12

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(C) THE DIRECTORATE FOR OPERATIONS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE EXERCISE OF THE COMMAND, CONTROL, DIRECTION, COORDINATION, AND SUPERVISION OF ALL ACTIVITIES CONCERNING OPERATIONS, EMPLOYMENT, AND DEPLOYMENT OF THE PNP;

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20(D) THE DIRECTORATE FOR LOGISTICS SHALL ASSIST21AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE22ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF LOGISTICS AND23ITS FUNCTIONAL AREAS;

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(E) THE DIRECTORATE FOR PLANS SHALL ASSIST AND 25 ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE AREAS OF PLANS AND 26 PROGRAMS THAT ARE **BEYOND** THE IMMEDIATE 27 **OPERATIONAL AND TACTICAL RANGE. THIS INCLUDES** 28 ORGANIZATIONAL AND FORCE DEVELOPMENT, SPECIAL 29 STUDIES, RESEARCH AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT OF INTER-30 AGENCY AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS, LEGISLATIVE AND 31 OTHER REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE NEEDED FOR THE 32

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF THE PNP;

(F) THE DIRECTORATE FOR COMPTROLLERSHIP SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP ON BUDGETING, ACCOUNTING, FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT, AND INTERNAL AUDITING MATTERS;

(G) THE DIRECTORATE FOR POLICE COMMUNITY 9 **RELATIONS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE** 10 PNP IN PLANNING, DIRECTING, COORDINATING, AND 11 SUPERVISING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUSTAINABLE 12 PROGRAMS FOR INSTITUTIONAL IMAGE **BUILDING**: 13 **CITIZENS' PARTICIPATION IN THE MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC** 14 ORDER INCLUDING PEACE POLICY FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC 15 **DEVELOPMENT: VALUE ORIENTATION AND CONTINUING** 16 EDUCATION; GENDER AWARENESS AND DEVELOPMENT; AND 17 **AUXILIARY FORCE MULTIPLIER DEVELOPMENT:** 18

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20 (H) THE DIRECTORATE FOR INVESTIGATION AND 21 DETECTIVE MANAGEMENT SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE 22 CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE INVESTIGATION ACTIVITIES OF 23 THE PNP;

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(I) THE DIRECTORATE FOR TRAINING, EDUCATION,
AND DOCTRINE DEVELOPMENT SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE
THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE FORMULATION OF POLICIES
AND IN THE PLANNING, COORDINATION, AND SUPERVISION
OF ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO TRAINING, EDUCATION
AND DOCTRINE DEVELOPMENT;

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(J) THE 1 DIRECTORATE FOR RESEARCH AND **DEVELOPMENT SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE** 2 PNP IN THE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT; 3 TEST AND EVALUATION OF CLOTHING, MATERIAL, VEHICLES, 4 5 AND EQUIPMENT; ISSUANCE OF ACCREDITATION TO MANUFACTURERS AND SUPPLIERS OF PNP UNIFORMS AND 6 ACCOUTERMENTS; FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF 7 PNP POLICIES ON THE WEARING OF PNP UNIFORMS: AND IN 8 THE IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE PNP 9 SELF-RELIANT DEVELOPMENT POSTURE PROGRAMS, WHICH 10 ARE IMPORTANT TO PEACE AND ORDER AND PUBLIC SAFETY: 11 AND 12

(K) THE DIRECTORATE FOR INFORMATION 14 AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT 15 SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE 16 FORMULATION OF POLICY AND MANAGING INFORMATION, 17 COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRONICS AND **TECHNOLOGY** 18 **RESOURCES TO** PROMOTE, DEVELOP AND 19 REGULATE INTEGRATED STRATEGIC ICT SYSTEMS AND RELIABLE AND 20 **EFFICIENT COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE. IT SHALL** 21 **PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN RELIABLE, SECURED, INTEGRATED,** 22 AND COST-EFFICIENT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND 23 COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES AND FACILITIES TO ALL PNP 24 **OFFICES AND UNITS. IT SHALL LIKEWISE BE RESPONSIBLE** 25 FOR THE DESIGN, IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE OF 26 THE DATABASE SYSTEM OF THE ORGANIZATION AND THE 27 **DEVELOPMENT OF THE ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAPABILITIES OF** 28 THE PNP TO ADDRESS THE GROWING INCIDENCE OF 29 **CYBERCRIME IN THE COUNTRY."** 30

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SEC. 3. A new Section 25-B is hereby inserted in R. A. No. 6975, as amended,
 to read as follows:

"SEC. 25-B. AREA POLICE COMMANDS (APC). - IN 4 ORDER TO ENHANCE THE CONTROL OF THE CHIEF OF THE 5 PNP, AREA POLICE COMMANDS SHALL BE ESTABLISHED IN 6 CLUSTERED POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES. THE APC SHALL 7 **ORCHESTRATE, SUPERVISE, AND CONTROL THE CONDUCT OF** 8 9 INTER-REGIONAL OPERATIONS AGAINST **INSURGENCY**, TERRORISM, AND OTHER INTERNAL SECURITY THREATS. 10 FURTHER, THE APC SHALL LIKEWISE CONDUCT SEARCH, 11 **RESCUE, AND RELIEF OPERATIONS IN TIMES OF CALAMITIES** 12 AND OTHER EMERGENCY SITUATIONS WITHIN THEIR 13 **RESPECTIVE AREAS OF JURISDICTION. FINALLY, THE APC** 14 SHALL SUPPORT THE POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES IN THE 15 CONDUCT OF INTER-REGIONAL **ANTI-CRIMINALITY** 16 **OPERATIONS AND INVESTIGATION.** 17

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19 FOR THIS PURPOSE, THE APCs SHALL HAVE **OPERATIONAL CONTROL OVER THE EXISTING REGIONAL** 20 MOBILE FORCE BATTALIONS WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE 21 AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY SUBJECT TO THE EXERCISE OF 22 THE POWER OF DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY OF THE CHIEF 23 OF THE PNP. 24

RELATIVE THERETO, IT SHALL ENJOY 4 AUTONOMY TO BUILD **INFRASTRUCTURE, ACOUIRE** 5 NECESSARY EQUIPMENT, PROVIDE FOR THE NECESSARY 6 PERSONNEL COMPLEMENT, ESTABLISH ITS CORPS OF 7 **PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS, AND RECOMMEND ITS** 8 **ANNUAL BUDGET TO THE CHIEF OF THE PNP.** 9

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THERE SHALL BE A CORPS OF PROFESSORS AND 11 INSTRUCTORS IN THE PNPA. THE PNP AND THE 12 COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE CIVIL SERVICE 13 COMMISSION AND OTHER RELEVANT AGENCIES SHALL 14 CREATE, DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A SYSTEM OF FACULTY, 15 PLACEMENT, PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT IN VIEW OF 16 EDUCATING, TRAINING, AND PREPARING THE FUTURE 17 POLICE COMMISSIONED OFFICERS WITH THE HIGHEST 18 STANDARD OF PERSONAL INTEGRITY AND PROFESSIONAL 19 COMPETENCE. UNIFORMED AND **NON-UNIFORMED** 20 PERSONNEL MAY BE APPOINTED TO THE CORPS OF 21 AND INSTRUCTORS UPON PROFESSORS THEIR 22 APPLICATION OR UPON THE DIRECTION OF THE CHIEF OF 23 THE PNP. LIKEWISE, CIVILIAN PROFESSORS MAY BE 24 ADMITTED TO THE CORPS OF PROFESSORS AND 25 INSTRUCTORS: PROVIDED, THAT THE SALARIES, GRANTS 26 HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT AND **BENEFITS**, 27 PROGRAMS, OTHER INCENTIVES, AND TERMS AND 28 **CONDITIONS OF WORK OF THE CORPS OF PROFESSORS AND** 29 INSTRUCTORS SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR IN THE 30 **GUIDELINES PROMULGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE** 31 **PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT.** 32

THE STUDENT BODY OF THE PNPA SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE CADET CORPS OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (CCPNP). 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19(C) HUMAN RIGHTS AFFAIRS OFFICE – HEADED BY20A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL SERVE21AS A MANAGEMENT FACILITY THAT WILL OVERSEE THE22IMPLEMENTATION OF PNP GUIDELINES AND POLICIES ON23HUMAN RIGHTS LAWS.

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PEACE PROCESS AND DEVELOPMENT CENTER -(D) 25 HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER 26 SHALL BE THE OFFICE PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE IN THE 27 MONITORING OF THE DEVELOPMENT AND 28 IMPLEMENTATION OF PEACE AGREEMENTS AND PERTINENT 29 LAWS. 30

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1 **(E) COMMAND CENTER - HEADED BY A POLICE** BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL BE THE MAIN 2 MONITORING FACILITY OF THE PNP OF ALL EVENTS 3 AFFECTING THE PEACE AND ORDER 4 SITUATION NATIONWIDE. SHALL SERVE 5 IT AS THE MAIN COORDINATING CENTER FOR ALL **OPERATING** AND 6 IN 7 SUPPORT UNITS PURSUANCE OF PNP LAW ENFORCEMENT, INTERNAL 8 SECURITY, SPECIAL **OPERATIONS, AND RECORDS/STATISTICS COMPILATION** 9 FUNCTIONS. 10

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**PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICE – HEADED BY A (F)** 12 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL 13 SUPERVISE, EVALUATE, AND MONITOR THE PROVISION OF 14 **RELEVANT INFORMATION ON ONGOING PNP PROGRAMS,** 15 ACTIVITIES PROJECTS AND TO ENHANCE THE 16 UNDERSTANDING OF GENERAL THE PUBLIC AND 17 ULTIMATELY GAIN COMMUNITY SUPPORT AND ACTIVE 18 **PARTICIPATION.** 19

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(G) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE 21 **PRESIDENT – HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL,** 22 THE OFFICE SHALL SERVE AS AN EXTENSION OF THE OFFICE 23 OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP TO ASSIST THE PRESIDENT AND 24 THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ON THE DIFFERENT ASPECTS 25 OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND ACT AS THE MAIN FOCAL 26 POINT OF COORDINATION BETWEEN THE PNP AND THE 27 **OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT.** 28

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30(H) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF THE31INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT - HEADED BY A32POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL ASSIST

THE SECRETARY IN HIS CAPACITY AS THE EX-OFFICIO CHAIRPERSON OF THE COMMISSION.

**LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS CENTER – HEADED BY A (I)** 4 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL ACT AS 5 THE PERMANENT **PNP** REPRESENTATIVE DURING 6 CONGRESSIONAL HEARINGS AND DELIBERATIONS AS WELL 7 AS UNDERTAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS TO PURSUE THE 8 PASSAGE OF PNP PRIORITY BILLS AND RELATED BILLS IN 9 THE CONGRESS OF THE PHILIPPINES." 10

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12 SEC. 5. Section 26 of R. A. No. 6975, as amended by R.A. No. 11200, is 13 hereby further amended to read as follows:

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"SEC. 26. (4) INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT 6 SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF 7 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE INFORMATION AND 8 TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT SERVICE SHALL BE 9 **RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DESIGN, IMPLEMENTATION, AND** 10 MAINTENANCE OF A DATABASE SYSTEM FOR THE PNP. THE 11 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND 12 CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 13

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(5) FINANCE SERVICE. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE FINANCE SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING FINANCE SERVICES TO THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

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(6) HEALTH SERVICE. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH
 THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE HEALTH
 SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING MEDICAL
 AND DENTAL SERVICES FOR THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL
 BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF,
 BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

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(7) TRAINING SERVICE. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR
 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE
 TRAINING SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR
 CONDUCTING TRAINING COURSES GEARED TOWARDS SKILLS

ENHANCEMENT, INTELLECTUAL ADVANCEMENT, AND MORAL TRANSFORMATION OF PNP PERSONNEL VITAL TO THE PURSUIT OF A RESPECTABLE AND RESPONSIVE POLICE FORCE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

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(8) RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION 8 SERVICE. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF 9 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE PNP RETIREMENT AND 10 BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION SERVICE SHALL BE 11 **RESPONSIBLE FOR ADMINISTERING THE RETIREMENT**, 12 SEPARATION, AND DEATH BENEFITS OF PNP PERSONNEL AS 13 WELL AS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANS AND PROGRAMS 14 TO UPLIFT THE MORALE AND WELFARE OF THE PNP RETIREES 15 AND THEIR BENEFICIARIES. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE 16 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, 17 BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 18

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(9) HEADQUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE. – HEADED BY 20 A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER 21 GENERAL, THE HEADQUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE SHALL BE 22 **RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING GENERAL HOUSEKEEPING** 23 CAMP SECURITY SERVICES TO THE NATIONAL AND 24 HEADQUARTERS OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE. THE 25 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 26 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, 27 AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE 28 COLONEL. 29

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31(10) CHAPLAIN SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR32WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE

CHAPLAIN SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING SPIRITUAL AND OTHER COUNSELING SERVICES FOR THE MORAL GROWTH AND ENHANCEMENT OF PNP PERSONNEL AND DEPENDENTS. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(11) ENGINEERING SERVICE. - HEADED 8 BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, 9 THE ENGINEERING SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR 10 THE OVERALL PLANNING, IMPLEMENTATION, SUPERVISION, 11 AND EVALUATION OF ALL PNP ENGINEERING PROGRAMS, 12 SUCH AS CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR PROJECTS, LAND 13 UTILIZATION PROJECTS, HOUSING AND QUARTERING 14 **PROJECTS, AND OTHER RELATED ACTIVITIES. THE DIRECTOR** 15 SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF 16 STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 17

THE DIRECTOR SHALL 7 BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, 8 BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 9

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 12 DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

THE GROUP SHALL SUPERVISE THE FIREARMS AND 16 **EXPLOSIVES OFFICE, WHICH IS HEADED BY A CHIEF WITH** 17 THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL WHO SHALL BE 18 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY CHIEF AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH 19 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 20

GROUP SHALL LIKEWISE THE SUPERVISE THE 22 SUPERVISORY OFFICE FOR SECURITY AND INVESTIGATION 23 AGENCIES, WHICH IS HEADED BY A CHIEF WITH THE RANK 24 OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL WHO SHALL BE ASSISTED 25 BY A DEPUTY CHIEF AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE 26 **RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.** 27

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(3) SPECIAL ACTION FORCE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR 29 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE SPECIAL 30 **ACTION FORCE SHALL FUNCTION AS A MOBILE STRIKE FORCE** 31 OR REACTION UNIT TO AUGMENT REGIONAL, PROVINCIAL, 32

MUNICIPAL AND CITY POLICE FORCES IN CIVIL DISTURBANCE CONTROL, COUNTERINSURGENCY, HOSTAGE-TAKING RESCUE OPERATIONS, AND OTHER SPECIAL OPERATIONS.

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(4) ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP. - HEADED BY A 11 DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE 12 ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 13 IMPLEMENTATION OF PERTINENT LAWS ON CYBERCRIMES 14 AND ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAMPAIGNS OF THE PNP. THE 15 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 16 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, 17 AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE 18 COLONEL. 19

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(5) MARITIME GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH 21 THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE MARITIME 22 **GROUP SHALL PERFORM ALL POLICE FUNCTIONS OVER** 23 PHILIPPINE TERRITORIAL WATERS AND RIVERS. THE 24 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 25 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, 26 AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE 27 COLONEL. 28

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30(6) INTELLIGENCE GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR31WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE32INTELLIGENCE GROUP SHALL SERVE AS THE INTELLIGENCE

AND COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATING UNIT OF THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(7) AVIATION SECURITY GROUP. - HEADED BY A 7 DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE 8 AVIATION SECURITY GROUP, IN COORDINATION WITH 9 AIRPORT AUTHORITIES, SHALL SECURE ALL THE COUNTRY'S 10 AIRPORTS AGAINST OFFENSIVE AND TERRORISTIC ACTS 11 THAT THREATEN CIVIL AVIATION, EXERCISE OPERATIONAL 12 CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OVER ALL AGENCIES INVOLVED 13 IN AIRPORT SECURITY OPERATION, AND ENFORCE ALL LAWS 14 AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO AIR TRAVEL PROTECTION 15 AND SAFETY. (12) POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT 7 GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF 8 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE POLICE COMMUNITY 9 AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT GROUP SHALL IMPLEMENT 10 PLANS AND PROGRAMS THAT PROMOTE COMMUNITY AND 11 **CITIZENS' PARTICIPATION IN THE MAINTENANCE OF PEACE** 12 AND ORDER AND PUBLIC SAFETY. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE 13 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, 14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, 15 ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 16

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(14) EXPLOSIVES AND ORDNANCE AND CANINE GROUP. 27 - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE 28 AND THE EXPLOSIVES BRIGADIER GENERAL, 29 **ORDNANCE/CANINE GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE** 30 AND UTILIZATION, DEPLOYMENT, MANAGEMENT, 31 **DEVELOPMENT OF EOD AND CANINE UNITS OF THE PNP. THE** 32

DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

6 (15) INTEGRITY MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT 7 GROUP. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF 8 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE INTEGRITY MONITORING 9 AND ENFORCEMENT GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR 10 INFORMATION GATHERING AND CONDUCT OF OFFENSIVE 11 OPERATIONS AGAINST ERRING PNP PERSONNEL.

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GROUP SHALL CONDUCT SPECIFICALLY, THE 13 INTELLIGENCE BUILD-UP AND LAW ENFORCEMENT 14 **OPERATIONS AGAINST PNP PERSONNEL REPORTED TO BE** 15 INVOLVED OR PROTECTING ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES SUCH AS, 16 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DRUG TRAFFICKING, HUMAN 17 FINANCIAL CRIMES, CYBERCRIME, TRAFFICKING, 18 GRAFT AND CORRUPT MALVERSATION, PILFERAGE, 19 PRACTICES, AND SECURITY VIOLATIONS. 20

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(16) WOMEN AND CHILDREN PROTECTION GROUP. –

6 SEC. 12. Section 36 of R. A. No. 6975, as amended by R.A. No. 8551 is 7 hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 36. Status of Members of the Philippine National Police. - The 9 uniformed members of the PNP INCLUDING POLICE CADETS shall 10 be considered employees of the National Government and shall draw 11 their salaries therefrom. [They shall have the same salary grade level 12 as that of public-school teachers:] THEY SHALL HAVE SALARY 13 **GRADE LEVELS PROVIDED UNDER EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 107** 14 SERIES OF 1999: Provided, That PNP members assigned in 15 Metropolitan Manila, chartered cities and first class municipalities may 16 be paid financial incentive by the local government unit concerned 17 subject to the availability of funds." 18

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20 SEC. 13. Section 39 of R. A. No. 6975, as amended by R. A. 11200, is hereby 21 further amended to read as follows:

"Section 39. Compulsory Retirement. – Compulsory retirement, for
officer and non-officer, shall be upon the attainment of age fifty-six
(56) FIFTY SEVEN (57): Provided, That, in case of any officer with
the rank of Police Brigadier General, Police Major General or Police
Lieutenant General, the Commission may allow his retention in the
service for an unextendible period of one (1) year."

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29 SEC. 14. Section 41 (b) of R. A. No. 6975, as amended by R.A. No. 8551, is 30 hereby further amended to read as follows:

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" Section 41. (a) Citizen's Complaints.

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(b) Internal Discipline. - [On dealing with minor offenses involving
 internal discipline found to have been committed by any regular
 member of their respective commands, t]The duly designated
 supervisors and equivalent officers of the PNP shall, after due notice
 and summary hearing, exercise disciplinary powers as follows:

8 "(1) Chiefs of police or equivalent supervisors may summarily 9 impose the administrative punishment of admonition or 10 reprimand; restriction to specified limits; withholding of 11 privileges; forfeiture of salary or suspension; or any of the 12 combination of the foregoing: Provided, That, in all cases, the 13 total period shall not exceed fifteen (15) days;

"(2) Provincial directors or equivalent supervisors may
summarily impose administrative punishment of admonition or
reprimand; restrictive custody; withholding of privileges;
forfeiture of salary or suspension, or any combination of the
foregoing: Provided, That, in all cases, the total period shall not
exceed thirty (30) days;

"(3) Police regional directors or equivalent supervisors shall 20 have the power to impose upon any member the disciplinary 21 punishment of dismissal from the service. He may also impose 22 the administrative punishment of admonition or reprimand; 23 restrictive custody; withholding of privileges; suspension or 24 forfeiture of salary; demotion; or any combination of the 25 foregoing: Provided, That, in all cases, the total period shall not 26 exceed sixty (60) days; 27

"(4) The Chief of the PNP shall have the power to impose the disciplinary punishment of dismissal from the service; suspension or forfeiture of salary; or any combination thereof for a period not exceeding one hundred eighty (180) days[÷ Provided, further, That the chief of the PNP shall have the authority to place police personnel under restrictive custody during the pendency of a grave administrative case filed against him or even after the filing of a criminal complaint, grave in nature, against such police personnel].

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THE CHIEF OF THE PNP SHALL ALSO HAVE THE 10 AUTHORITY TO IMMEDIATELY ORDER THE PREVENTIVE 11 PERSONNEL CONFINEMENT OF ANY PNP UNDER 12 INVESTIGATION FOR, OR CHARGED WITH A GRAVE 13 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFENSE AND/OR CRIME: PROVIDED, 14 THAT THE PLACE OF CONFINEMENT SHALL BE LIMITED TO 15 THEIR BARRACKS, QUARTERS, OR IN A DESIGNATED 16 FACILITY, UNLESS SUCH LIMITS ARE ENLARGED BY PROPER 17 AUTHORITY: PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT PREVENTIVE 18 CONFINEMENT SHALL BE FOR A MAXIMUM PERIOD OF 19 NINETY (90) DAYS REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF CASES 20 FILED AND INVESTIGATION CONDUCTED AGAINST SUCH 21 PERSONNEL. IN CASE SUCH PERSONNEL LEAVES THE PLACE 22 OF CONFINEMENT WITHOUT PROPER AUTHORITY, SUCH ACT 23 SHALL BE A GROUND FOR DISMISSAL FROM SERVICE: 24

25THE AREA POLICE COMMANDERS, REGIONAL26DIRECTORS, PROVINCIAL DIRECTORS, DISTRICT

9 Congressional Oversight Committee to monitor and oversee the implementation of 10 the provisions of this Act. The committee shall be composed of six (6) members 11 from the Senate Committee on Public Order and Dangerous Drugs and six (6) 12 members from the House Committee on Public Order and Safety, with the respective 13 Chairpersons as Joint Chairpersons. The five (5) other members from each Chamber 14 shall be designated by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House of 15 Representatives, respectively.

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SEC. 16. *Appropriations*. – The initial amount necessary to implement the provisions of this Act shall be charged against the current appropriations of the Philippine National Police. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the succeeding General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 17. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) and the PNP shall, within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Act.

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27 SEC. 18. *Separability Clause*. – If any portion of this Act is declared 28 unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby, 29 shall remain in force and effect.

SEC. 19. *Repealing Clause.* – Sections 35-A and 67-A of R. A. No. 6975, as amended by R. A. No. 11279, are hereby repealed. All laws, executive orders, rules and regulations, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby modified, amended or repealed accordingly.

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6 SEC. 20. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 7 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.

## AN ACT PROVIDING ORGANIZATIONAL REFORMS IN THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990", AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

**BACKROUND:** In the 18<sup>th</sup> Congress, the bill was prepared by the Committees on Public Order and Dangerous Drugs; Local Government; and Finance. The authors include Senators Ronald dela Rosa, Ramon Bong Revilla Jr., Joseph Victor Ejercito, Juan Miguel Zubiri and Sonny Angara. The substitute bill came about in substitution of Senate Bill Nos. 1905,1965, and 1997, taking into consideration House Bill No. 8327.

## SALIENT FEATURES OF THE SUBSTITUTE BILL

**Rationale:** The Bill aims to support the policy of the State to uphold the general welfare of the people, protection of their life, liberty and property. Likewise, the bill highlights the critical role of the PNP in ensuring the safety and security of the people. Through PNP's hard work and dedication to keep our people safe, greater visibility and accessibility is sought by creating organizational and institutional changes.

**Objective:** The bill seeks to address the current loopholes in the country's criminal justice system by ensuring systematized representation in the police forces, different approach in recruitment process which will ensure strategized delivery of service in order to promote general welfare, instituting safeguards and other mechanism to eliminate graft and corruption.

## **Key Provisions:**

- The bill seeks to give the Chief of PNP a "Command Group" which shall be composed of various PNP high-ranking officers. There will be different subgroups which aims to institutionalize better delivery of services. The Chief of PNP shall be in charge of setting the guidelines, recommend further changes in the organizational structure and staffing patter of the PNP.
- The PNP shall have a Directorial Staff System which will enhance the span of control being exercised by the chief of the PNP by designating specific functions such as:
  - Directorate for Personnel and Records Management
  - Directorate for Intelligence
  - Directorate for Operations

- Directorate for Logistics
- o Directorate for Plans

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- Directorate for Comptrollership
- Directorate for Police Community Relations
- o Directorate for Investigation and Detective Management
- o Directorate for Training, Education, and Doctrine Development
- o Directorate for Research and Development
- o Directorate for Information and Communications Technology Management
- Area Police Commands (APC) shall be instituted to enhance the control of the Chief of PNP. The APC shall enjoy control over existing regional mobile force battalions to make countermeasures against insurgency, terrorism, and other internal security threats. Lastly, the APC shall augment the existing mobile force battalions subject to power of delegation of authority by the Chief of the PNP.
- Special Police Offices shall be instituted to perform specific functions in managing the Philippine National Police Academy. The Philippine National Police Academy shall be headed by a Director with a Rank of Police Major General. The corps and professors and instructors shall be admitted in service through appointment by the Chief of PNP, in consultation with the Civil Service Commission and other relevant agencies, the Chief of PNP may deem necessary. Other offices the bill sought to institutionalize is the Strategy Management Center, Human Rights Affairs Office, Peace Process and Development Center, Command Center, Public Information Office, Liaison Office for the Office of the President and the Department of the Interior and Local Government, and Legislative Affairs Center
- The Bill also sought to expand the scope of powers and functions of the Chief of PNP, giving him/her the power to designate and assign PNP Officers in various key positions, provided however, the members of the command group shall be selected among the most senior and qualified officers in the service.
- The bill also gives discretion to the PNP Chief, in the exercise of his expanded powers, to unilaterally constitute, abolish, modify, or merge PNP Units and Officers, implement adjustments, organizational structure, staffing, functions and functional relationships, subject to various exemptions.
- The bill also seeks to give the Chief of PNP a fixed term of office of two (2) years and shall be compulsorily retired thereafter at the maximum tenure in the position. The Chief of PNP shall enjoy the maximum tenure in the office unless he/she shall be relieved by the Office of the President, or upon reaching the compulsory retirement age.
- The bill gives expanded role, responsibilities, functions and positions to various

key Positions in the PNP.

- The Philippine National Police Academy Cadets shall be appointed by the Chief of PNP or upon his authority, the PNPA Director. The Cadets shall hold the position of Police Cadet in temporary status, renewable every year in the academy until the graduation or separation. The Cadets will be entitled to salaries and emoluments enjoyed by a Police Executive Master Sergeant.
- The National Administrative and Operational Support Units shall be comprised of various support units with expanded powers and functions which can be either part of the National Administrative Support Units or the National Operational Support Units.
- Rank adjustments through promotion by any PNP personnel whose rank is lower than what is required in said position shall, upon recommendation by the commission, be entitled to rank adjustment.
- Lateral entry of Officers into the PNP shall commence with the rank of Police Lieutenant. Those who intends to enter PNP with technical qualifications shall exclusively serve the Office/Unit where he/she was accepted and must still acquire or pursue training related to his/her field of expertise. Licensed criminologists and PRC licensed professionals applying for lateral entry shall have the rank of at least Police Staff Sergeant for uniformed personnel or at least salary grade 14 for nonuniformed personnel and have served the PNP for at least five (5) years. Graduates from PNPA shall be appointed automatically.
- Uniformed members of PNP including police cadets shall have salary grade levels provided under Executive Order No. 107, Series of 1999, unless, higher emoluments may be given to them by the local government units they are assigned.
- The compulsory retirement age for officer and non-officer shall be fifty-seven (57) years of age, subject to retention of service based on the rank upon retirement.
- PNP personnel under investigation, or charged with a crime or grave administrative case, shall be immediately placed in confinement or in arrest, as may be required. Any personnel placed under confinement shall be restricted to barracks quarters or in any designated facility. If the personnel leaves the place of confinement, he/she shall be dismissed from the service. The PNP Chief shall have to power to impose the immediate confinement provided that those under his command may exercise the same.
