

AN ACT

PROVIDING THE MUSLIM FILIPINOS BETTER ACCESS TO SHARI'A COURTS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9997, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "NATIONAL COMMISSION ON MUSLIM FILIPINOS ACT OF 2009"

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Over four decades ago, former President Ferdinand E. Marcos Sr. signed Presidential Decree (P.D.) No. 1083, otherwise known as the Code of Muslim Personal Laws, with the aim of providing effective administration and enforcement of Muslim customary and personal laws through the creation of Shari'a courts in Mindanao, among others.

While P.D. No. 1083 laid the foundation for the creation of these special courts, the fact still remains that Muslim Filipinos experience challenges in accessing this legal system. Stories of our brothers and sisters attest that this plight is oftentimes due to factors such as, but not limited to: scarcity of resources, limited knowledge in filing and submitting of legal documents, and lack of Shari'a courts outside Mindanao. Needless to say, these circumstances undermine our country's commitment to promoting fair and equal treatment to all of its citizens under the law.

In order to address this predicament, this measure is being filed to expand the powers and functions of the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) by way of amending Republic Act No. 9997, otherwise known as the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos Act of 2009. Specifically, this bill allows the NCMF to provide legal assistance and services which includes the filing or submission of appropriate

documents with the proper Shari'a Court for Muslim Filipino litigants who are in a region without an existing Shari'a Court.

This measure also introduces provisions for the creation of a digital platform that allows the paperless filing of routine documents to and from Shari'a courts, as well as the collection of statistical data for Muslim Filipinos at the national, regional, provincial, city, and municipal levels.


To ensure that all citizens of this country are able to access an effective, efficient, and non-discriminatory legal system, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	Section 1. Section 8 of Republic Act No. 9997 is hereby amended as follows:

17	(g) Bureau of Legal Affairs. — The Legal Affairs Bureau shall be
18	responsible for providing Muslim Filipinos with legal education and
19	assistance in case of litigation involving their persons or interests;
20	act as the legal counsel of the Commission; and investigate cases
21	involving its personnel and submit appropriate recommendations
22	pertaining thereto. The Bureau shall also investigate valid
23	complaints brought before the Commission.
24	THE BUREAU OF LEGAL AFFAIRS SHALL ALSO ENSURE
25	THAT MUSLIM FILIPINOS HAVE EQUITABLE ACCESS TO
26	SHARI'A COURTS. THUS, IT MAY FACILITATE THE FILING
27	OR SUBMISSION OF APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTS WITH
28	THE PROPER SHARI'A COURT FOR MUSLIM FILIPINO
29	LITIGANTS WHO ARE IN A REGION WHERE THERE IS NO
30	EXISTING SHARI'A COURT.
31	THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF PERSONNEL AND LEGAL
32	OFFICERS FOR THE EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF

COMMISSION. 2 3 THE COMMISSION SHALL, IN COORDINATION WITH THE SUPREME COURT, ESTABLISH A MECHANISM FOR THE FILING OR SUBMISSION OF LEGAL DOCUMENTS WITHIN 5 6 THE JURISDICTION OF THE SHARI'A CIRCUIT AND DISTRICT COURTS, INCLUDING THOSE PROVIDED 7 UNDER TITLE VI CHAPTER ONE OF PRESIDENTIAL 8 DECREE NO. 1083, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "CODE 9 ON MUSLIM PERSONAL LAWS OF THE PHILIPPINES." THE 10 11 MECHANISM MAY BE FACILITATED AND ADMINISTERED BY THE COMMISSION THROUGH THE BUREAU OF LEGAL 12 AFFAIRS TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO MUSLIM FILIPINOS 13 WHO HAVE NO ACCESS TO SHARI'A COURTS IN THEIR 14 REGION. 15 THE MECHANISM SHALL CONSIDER THE PREVAILING 16 RULES OF THE PROCEEDINGS IN THE SHARI'A COURT OF 17 THE PLACE WHERE THE COURT IS LOCATED. 18 A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE 19 COMMISSION AND THE SUPREME COURT MAY BE 20 21 ENTERED INTO FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION WHICH SHALL NOT BE 22 23 CONSTRUED AS AN IMPEDIMENT ON THE JURISDICTION OF THE COURTS. 24 Sec. 3. 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DIGITAL PLATFORM THAT ALLOWS PAPERLESS FILING

1 OF ROUTINE DOCUMENTS, SUCH AS MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE, BIRTH CERTIFICATE, DEATH CERTIFICATE 2 AND THE COLLECTION OF APPROPRIATE COURT FEES 3 FOR THIS PURPOSE. THE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED 4 TO ENTER INTO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS TO 5 FACILITATE THE FILING OF DOCUMENTS AS PROVIDED 6 IN THIS ACT. 7 ANY INFORMATION OR DATA OBTAINED BY THE 8 COMMISSION AND DICT THROUGH A **DIGITAL** 9 PLATFORM ALLOWING PAPERLESS FILING FOR THE 10 SHALL ABOVE DOCUMENTS BE **TREATED** WITH 11 **CONFIDENTIALITY AND THE RIGHT TO PRIVACY OF THE** 12 PARTIES SHALL BE OBSERVED. 13 Sec. 4. A new section denominated as Section 17-A is hereby inserted after 14 Section 17 of the same Act to read as follows: 15 SEC. 17-A. STATISTICAL DATA ON MUSLIM FILIPINOS. — 16 THE PSA AND THE COMMISSION SHALL COORDINATE ON 17 THE COLLECTION OF STATISTICAL DATA FOR MUSLIM 18 FILIPINOS IN THE NATIONAL, REGIONAL, PROVINCIAL, 19 CITY, AND MUNICIPAL LEVELS. THE COMMISSION AND 20 21 THE PSA SHALL PREPARE AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE MUSLIM FILIPINO POPULATION. THE ANNUAL REPORT 22 SHALL INCLUDE THE LATEST CENSUS OF POPULATION OF 23 MUSLIM FILIPINOS, MUSLIM BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, AND 24 25 DEATHS FOR THE YEAR. 26 Sec. 5. A new section denominated as Section 23-A is hereby inserted after Section 23 of the same Act to read as follows: 27 SEC. 23-A. REPORTORIAL REQUIREMENTS. — THE 28 SECRETARY SHALL SUBMIT TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE 29 SENATE, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE 30 REPRESENTATIVES, THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE SENATE 31

1	AFFAIRS, AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE HOUSE

4	Sec. 6. Within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, the Commission,
5	in coordination with the Department of Budget and Management and the Supreme
6	Court of the Philippines, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations to
7	implement the provisions of this Act.
8	Sec. 7. All existing laws, executive orders, presidential decrees, rules and
9	regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are repealed
10	or modified accordingly.
11	Sec. 8. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the
12	Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
