MODERNIZING THE PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD, CREATING FOR THE PURPOSE THE PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD MODERNIZATION TRUST FUND, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) is mandated to, among others, enforce regulations in accordance with all relevant maritime international conventions, treaties or instruments and national laws for the promotion and safety of life property at sea within the maritime jurisdiction of the Philippines and conduct port state control implementation, and to assist in the enforcement of laws on fisheries, immigration, tariff and customs, forestry, firearms and explosives, human trafficking, dangerous drugs and controlled chemicals, transnational crimes, and other applicable laws within the maritime jurisdiction in the Philippines.<sup>1</sup>

In compliance with its mandate and in the whole-of-nation approach being implemented by the national government in addressing the regional security challenges posed by territorial disputes in the West Philippine Sea,<sup>2</sup> the PCG has been one of the country's front liners in protecting the country's sovereign rights with respect to its exclusive economic zone.

Considering the current developments in the West Philippine Sea which includes harassment by the Chinese Coast Guard through engaging in "dangerous maneuvers" aimed at obstructing resupply missions to Ayungin Shoal and other threats in our maritime jurisdiction, there is a need to modernize the PCG in order for them to effectively carry out their mandate and to further realize the whole-of-nation approach in addressing the dispute over the West Philippine Sea.

In view thereof, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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## **AN ACT**

MODERNIZING THE PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD, CREATING FOR THE PURPOSE THE PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD MODERNIZATION TRUST FUND, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Philippine Coast
- 2 Guard Modernization Act."

- 3 Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
  - develop the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), and ensure the continued protection and
- 5 defense of our maritime border, economy, and environment. Toward this end, the
- 6 Modernization Program under this Act shall develop and enhance the capabilities of
- 7 the PCG to effectively perform under the following functional areas:
- 8 a. Maritime Safety;
- b. Maritime Search and Rescue;
- 10 c. Maritime Security;
- d. Maritime Law Enforcement; and
- e. Maritime Environment Protection.

1	Sec. 3. Philippine Coast Guard Modernization Program The PCG shall
2	implement the Philippine Coast Guard Modernization Program, hereinafter referred
3	to as the "Program"; Provided, however, That payments for the amortization of
4	outstanding multi-year contract obligations incurred under Section 7 of this Act may
5	extend beyond this period.

- Sec. 4. *Objectives.* The Program shall be implemented in accordance with the following objectives:
- a. Minimize, if not totally eliminate, accidents at sea;

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- Reduce the search efforts and hasten response time during search and rescue operations;
- c. Contribute substantially to securing maritime zones and territorial waters from terrorism, lawlessness and other threats to national security and territory;
- d. Effectively contribute to the enforcement of the Philippine criminal and other special laws within maritime zones and territorial waters; and
- e. Minimize, if not totally eliminate, pollution in the maritime zones or areas and hasten response time in cases of emergencies.
- Sec. 5. Components of the Modernization Program. The components of the PCG Modernization program shall be divided into four tiers in line with its capabilities, as follows:
- (a) First Tier: Development of PCG Response Bases and Enhancement of Maritime Domain Awareness Capabilities.
  - i. Response Bases. -The PCG modernization program shall entail the construction and development of permanent response bases to house all

PCG operational units, such as Marine Laboratories, Search and Rescue
Vessels (SARVs), Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPV), Maritime Pollution
Vessels (MARPOL vessels), and others to allow the PCG to rapidly
respond to maritime emergency calls in the most efficient and effective
manner;

- ii. Maritime Domain Awareness (MDA) Capabilities. -The PCG modernization program shall entail the acquisition and upgrade of equipment and systems such as Radar Stations, Lighthouses, Unmanned Aerial Vehicles, Unmanned Underwater Vehicles, and SARVs to enhance MDA capabilities;
- (b) Second Tier: Development of Infrastructure and Interdiction Capabilities.
  - Interdiction Capabilities. The PCG modernization program entails the acquisition of state-of-the-art vessels and equipment to enhance interdiction and law enforcement capabilities;
  - ii. Coast Guard Stations and Substations. The PCG modernization program entails the improvement and development of infrastructures and facilities of Coast Guard stations and substations: Provided, that each shoreline municipality shall have its own substations, be fully equipped, and have constant or uniform stations: Provided further, that substations will serve as its smaller unit;
  - iii. MARPOL (Maritime Pollution) Vessels. The PCG modernization program shall acquire MARPOL vessels to strengthen the marine environment protection mandate of the PCG.

1	(c) Third Her: Acquisition and Development of Patrol Vessels and Air
2	Capabilities
3	i. Offshore Patrol Vessels The PCG modernization program shall develop
4	and acquire new OPVs to strengthen coastal defense and the
5	management of the country's EEZ. The acquisition of OPVs shall enable
6	the PCG to:
7	1. Patrol, detect, intercept, engage, and challenge, if necessary, any
8	vessel illegally intruding into or passing through the Philippines' EEZ,
9	up to areas near or around the Philippine territorial limits;
10	2. Provide transportation of personnel and material in times of natural
11	disaster and rescue operations;
12	3. Conduct search and rescue operations during maritime incidents; and
13	4. Support the Philippine naval armed forces.
14	ii. Aircrafts The PCG modernization shall acquire and develop aircrafts to
15	enable the PCG to:
16	1. Strengthen maritime and airspace security in different areas and
17	stations;
18	2. Patrol, detect, and challenge, if necessary, any vessel and aircraft
19	illegally intruding into or passing through the Philippines' EEZ
20	management, up to areas near or around the Philippine territorial
21	limits;
22	3. Support its operations as a law enforcement arm and a nautical
23	service; and
24	4. Support the Philippine naval armed forces.

(d) Fourth Tier: Infrastructure and Facilities Development.

- i. Development and Improvement of Training Facilities. -The PCG modernization program shall entail the development and improvement of training facilities for study, training, professional progress, and exercise. This shall allow the PCG to obtain game changing equipment and facilities that will assist and empower PCG personnel;
  - ii. Construction and Development of Shipyards. The PCG modernization program shall provide for the construction and development of shipyards that can contribute to regional industrial infrastructure and national security interests; and
  - iii. Construction and Development of Hangars. The PCG modernization program shall entail the construction and expansion of hangars that serves as protection from the weather and direct sunlight, and for maintenance, repair, production, assembly, and storage of aircraft.
- SEC. 6. *Period of implementation*. The modernization program under this Act shall be implemented every three (3) years, reflecting the four (4) tiers as stated under Section 5 of this Act, for a total period of twelve (12) years: *Provided, however,* That payments for the amortization of outstanding multi- year contract obligations incurred under this Act may extend beyond this period.
- SEC. 7. Submission to Congress. Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the President, upon the recommendation of the Secretaries of the Department of Transportation, Department of Budget and Management, and the Department of Finance, shall submit the PCG Modernization Program to Congress. It shall contain the following:

- 2 i. Personnel strength and inventory of facilities and equipment during the various phases of the modernization program;
  - ii. Modernization projects and activities to be undertaken, including any major weapon and non-weapon equipment and technology acquisitions, any major infrastructure construction or improvement to be undertaken, and the particular objective(s) and component(s) under Sections 3 and 4, respectively, of this Act to which such intended acquisition, construction or improvements belongs; and
- iii. Priorities, schedules, and phases of implementation of modernization
   projects and activities; and
- iv. Estimated average cost for each modernization project or activity to be undertaken.
  - Thereafter, the PCG shall, through the DOTr Secretary, submit to the Office of the President and Congress, an annual report containing the progress and status of the implementation of the BFP Modernization Program.
  - Sec. 8. *Self-Reliance Program.* In the implementation of the Program, the PCG shall, as far as practicable, give preference to Filipino contractors and suppliers, and secondly to foreign contractors or suppliers, willing and able to locate a substantial portion of, if not the entire, production process of the terms involved with the Philippines.
  - In order to generate local employment opportunities, and enhance technology transfer to the Philippines, the Secretary of the DOTr shall, as far as practicable, incorporate in each contract or agreement special foreign exchange reduction

schemes such as countertrade, in-country manufacture, co-production, or other innovative arrangements or combination thereof.

The PCG shall likewise ensure that in negotiating all applicable contracts or agreements, provisions on the transfer to the PCG of the principal technology involved, as well as the training of the PCG personnel to operate and maintain such equipment and technology are incorporated therein.

Sec. 9. *Philippine Coast Guard Modernization Trust Fund.* – There is hereby created a trust fund to be known as the "*Philippine Coast Guard Modernization Trust Fund*", to be administered by the Secretary of the DOTr in accordance with laws, rules and regulations. The trust fund shall be used exclusively for the Program, excluding salaries and allowances. The trust fund shall be funded out of the following:

a. Appropriation for the Program;

- b. The proceeds from the sale, ease, or joint development of coast guard properties and lighthouse reservations, as may be authorized by Congress, including such immovable and other facilities as may be found therein, not covered by the Bases Conversion and Development Authority, as provided for in Republic Act No. 7227, as amended, otherwise known as *the "Bases Conversion and Development Act of 1992"*;
- c. Share of the PCG from the proceeds of the sale of the coast guard properties provided for under the Bases Conversion and Development Act of 1992;
- d. The proceeds from the disposal of excess of uneconomically repairable equipment and other moveable properties in the PCG arsenal;

- e. Funds from budgetary surplus, if any, as may be authorized by Congress subject to the provisions of Section 13 of this Act;
  - f. Loans, grants, bequests, or donations from local and foreign sources,
     specifically earmarked for the Program;
  - g. Dues, fines, and penalties collected by the PCG in the exercise of its functions; and
    - h. All interest income of the trust fund.

- Sec. 10. Equipment Acquisition Per Function Area. In order to further specialize PCG capabilities, equipment acquisition shall be initiated within the respective functional areas as mentioned in Section 2 of this Act but integrated into the Program to allow interoperability and ensure a greater degree of reliability.
- Sec. 11. *Contract Negotiation.* The procurement process shall be governed in accordance with Republic Act No. 9184, otherwise known as the "*Government Procurement Reform Act*". The procurement process shall be exercised by the PCG General Headquarters, unless delegated to the next lower-management by the PCG Commandant.
- Sec. 12. *Progress Report.* The Secretary of the DOTr shall submit to the President and Congress, an annual report on the status of the Philippine Coast Guard Modernization Act Trust Fund, as provided for in Section 9 of this Act, not later than the end of the first quarter of the succeeding year.
- The Commandant of the PCG shall also submit to the President and Congress, an annual status report containing the process of the implementation of the modernization program under this Act, including the PCG modernization activities

implemented prior to the approval of this Act not later than the end of the first quarter of the succeeding year.

Sec. 13. *Appropriations*. – The amount necessary to implement the provisions of this Act shall be sourced from the PCG Modernization Trust Fund as provided in Section 9 of this Act. In addition, the annual appropriations for the Program shall include the amount necessary to support the funding requirements for all modernization projects submitted to the Congress. The funds to be appropriated to implement the provisions of this Act shall be included in the General Appropriations Act under the DOTr.

Sec. 14. *Joint Congressional Oversight Committee.* – A joint Congressional Oversight Committee is hereby created to monitor and oversee the implementation of the provisions of this Act. It shall be composed of six (6) senators and six (6) representatives to be appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, respectively. It shall be co-chaired by the Chairperson of the Committee on Transportation for both Houses. The minority parties of both houses shall have at least two (2) representatives therein.

Sec. 15. *Sunset Review.* – Five (5) years after the effectivity of this Act, the Joint Congressional Oversight Committee shall conduct a systematic evaluation of the accomplishments and impact of this Act as well as the performance and organizational structures of the PCG.

Sec. 16. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall remain in effect.

- 1 Sec. 17. Repealing Clause. All other laws, decrees, executive orders and
- 2 rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
- 3 hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- 4 Sec. 18. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days from Its
- 5 publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
