MR. PRESIDENT:

The Committees on Higher, Technical and Vocational Education; Ways and Means; and Finance to which was referred **House Bill No. 7089**, introduced by Representatives Rodriguez (R.), Go (M.), Suansing (M.A), Eudela, Rodriguez (E.), *et al.*, entitled:

"AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A COLLEGE OF MEDICINE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY CAMPUS LOCATED IN CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL, TO BE KNOWN AS THE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-COLLEGE OF MEDICINE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR"

taking into consideration **Senate Bill No. 1949**, introduced by Senator Marcos, entitled:

"AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A COLLEGE OF MEDICINE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY CAMPUS IN THE CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL, TO BE KNOWN AS THE 'UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-COLLEGE OF MEDICINE', AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR"

have considered the same and have the honor to report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that House Bill No. 7089, taking into consideration Senate Bill No. 1949, be approved with the following amendments:

- 1. On page 2, line 7, Section 2, delete the phrase "Region X" and insert the phrase "THE NORTHERN MINDANAO REGION";
- On the same page, line 12, Section 3, delete the phrase "Being an institution within the USTSP system, the governance of the College shall be vested in" and insert the phrase "THE COLLEGE, AS AN INSTITUTION WITHIN THE USTSP SYSTEM, SHALL BE GOVERNED BY";
- 3. On the same section and page, line 18, delete the phrase "as amended" and the punctuation mark comma "(,)" thereafter;
- On the same page, line 22, Section 4, delete the phrase "Chancellor of the USTSP-Cagayan de Oro City Campus", and insert the phrase "DEAN OF THE COLLEGE";
- 5. On the same section and page, line 23, delete the phrase "and the President of the University";

- 6. On the same page, lines 26 to 27, Section 5, delete the phrase "its guidelines on qualifications standards, and based on the recommendation of the Chancellor" and insert the phrase "THE GUIDELINES, QUALIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS SET BY THE BOARD, AND UPON THE RECOMMENDATON OF THE CHANCELLOR OF THE USTSP-CAGAYAN DE ORO CAMPUS":
- 7. On page 3, line 5, Section 6, insert the word "**SEX**" and the punctuation mark comma "(,)" between the words "belief" and "gender" then delete the word "preference";
- 8. On the same section and page, line 8, delete the phrase "guidelines on qualification standards" and insert the phrase "GUIDELINES, QUALIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS";
- 9. On the same section and page, line 9, delete the phrase "church or religious sect" and insert the phrase "**RELIGIOUS DENOMINATION**";
- 10.On the same page, line 20, Section 7, insert the word "SEX" and a comma "(,)" after the preposition "of";
- 11.On the same section and page, line 21, delete the conjunction "or" after the word "disability", then after the word "origin", insert a comma "(,)" and the phrase "OR ANY OTHER FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION";
- 12. On the same page, lines 27 to 35, delete the entire Section 9 and replace with a new section 9 to read as follows:
 - "SEC. 9. LOAN OR TRANSFER OF SUPPLIES,
 APPARATUSES AND EQUIPMENT AND DETAIL OF
 PERSONNEL TO THE COLLEGE. HEADS OF NATIONAL

GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND INSTRUMENTALITIES MAY, UPON THE REQUEST OF THE BOARD THROUGH THE PRESIDENT OF THE USTSP, LOAN OR TRANSFER SUPPLIES, APPARATUSES OR EQUIPMENT, AND DETAIL PERSONNEL TO THE COLLEGE: *PROVIDED*, THAT SUCH LOAN, TRANSFER OR DETAIL SHALL NOT BE DETRIMENTAL TO PUBLIC SERVICE.

THE PERSONNEL TO BE DETAILED TO THE COLLEGE SHALL PERFORM SUCH DUTIES AS MAY BE DEEMED REQUIRED BY THE DEAN OF THE COLLEGE AND THE TIME SPENT FOR SUCH DUTIES SHALL BE COUNTED AS PART OF THE DETAILED PERSONNEL'S REGULAR SERVICE."

13. On page 4, line 10, insert a new Section 12 to read as follows:

"SEC. 12. COMPLIANCE WITH CHED REQUIREMENTS. — THE USTSP, PRIOR TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COLLEGE AND THE OFFERING OF NEW AND REVISED COURSES AND PROGRAMS RELATED THERETO, SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE APPLICABLE POLICIES, STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES OF THE CHED."

- 14. Renumber the succeeding sections accordingly; and
- 15. Finally, on the same page, lines 27-28, Section 17, insert the word "AFTER" between the words "effect" and "fifteen", thereafter delete the word "after" between the words "days" and "its" and in lieu thereof insert the word "FOLLOWING".

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A COLLEGE OF MEDICINE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY CAMPUS LOCATED IN CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL. TO BE KNOWN AS THE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES-COLLEGE OF MEDICINE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Schate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION I. Establishment. There is hereby established a medical school in the University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines (USTSP)-Cagayan de Oro City Campus located in Cagayan de Oro City, Province of Misamis Oriental, which shall be known as the "University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines-College of Medicine".

 SEC. 2. General Mandate. The University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines-College of Medicine, hereinafter referred to as the "College", shall primarily offer a Doctor of Medicine Program, including an Integrated Liberal Arts and Medicine Program, consisting of basic science and clinical courses, and using a learner-centered, competency-based, and community-oriented approach. The primary goal of the College shall be to develop a corps of professional physicians to strengthen the healthcare system of the country, as well as to respond to the human resource development needs of the Province of Misamis Oriental and Region X.

The College is also mandated to undertake research and extension services and provide progressive leadership in these areas

- SEC. 3. Governance. Being an institution within the USTSP system, the governance of the College shall be vested in the Board of Regents of the USTSP, hereinafter referred to as the Board, whose powers are defined under Republic Act No. 10919, entitled "An Act Establishing the University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines (USTSP), Providing for the Purpose the Amalgamation of the Mindanao University of Science and Technology (MUST) and the Misamis Oriental State College of Agriculture and Technology (MOSCAT), and Appropriating Funds Therefor", as amended, and other applicable laws and regulations, unless otherwise provided or amended elsewhere in this Act.
- **SEC. 4.** *Administration.* The administration of the College shall be vested in the Chancellor of the USTSP-Cagayan de Oro City Campus insofar as may be authorized by the Board and the President of the University.
- **SEC. 5.** The College Dean. The College shall be headed by a Dean who shall be appointed by the Board, subject to its guidelines on qualifications standards, and based on the recommendation of the Chancellor, following a process of consultation with the constituents of the College. The Dean shall render full-time service, serve a term of three (3) years, and may be reappointed to another term.

Within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act, the Chancellor of the USTSP-Cagayan de Oro City Campus shall constitute the Search Committee for the Deanship.

The powers and duties of the Dean of the College, in addition to those specifically provided for in this Act, shall include those usually pertaining to the Office of the Dean of similar state universities and colleges and those delegated by the Chancellor.

The salary of the Dean of the College shall be in accordance with Republic Act No. 11466, otherwise known as the "Salary Standardization Law of 2019", and such other laws amendatory thereto, which may hereinafter be enacted, and shall be comparable to that being received by the Deans of similar educational institutions.

In case of vacancy in the Office of the Dean by reason of death, compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause, or incapacity of the Dean to perform the functions of the office, the Board shall, upon the recommendation of the Chancellor, designate an Officer-in-Charge of the College, pending the appointment of a new Dean: *Provided*. That the Officer-in-Charge shall serve only during the unexpired portion of the term.

The Dean of the College shall be assisted by a College Secretary, who shall be appointed

SEC. 6. The Faculty. The Board shall, upon the recommendation of the Chancellor and the nomination by the President of the University, appoint the faculty members of the College: Provided, That no political belief, gender preference, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin, nor religious opinion or affiliation shall be a matter of inquiry in the appointment of faculty members of the College: Provided, further, That said appointment shall be subject to the guidelines on qualification standards set by the Board: Provided, finally, That no member of the faculty shall teach for or against any particular church or religious sect.

SEC. 7. Scholarship Programs and Admission. The College shall provide scholarships and other affirmative action programs to assist poor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the College. Students who have availed themselves of the scholarship program under Republic Act No. 11509, otherwise known as the "Doktor Para sa Bayan Act", shall render a return service in accordance with the said law. Students availing themselves of other nationally-funded scholarship programs to complete the medicine degree program under the College may be required to render a return service depending on the contract to be signed between the student and the College.

No student shall be denied admission to the College by reason of gender, religion, cultural or community affiliation, physical disability, or ethnic origin.

- **SEC. 8.** Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy. The College shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant to Paragraph 2, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution.
- SEC. 9. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus, Equipment or Supplies, and Detail of Personnel. Upon the request of the Chancellor and the Board, through the President of the USTSP, the heads of the bureaus and offices of the national government may loan or transfer to the college such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be needed by it, and detail employees for duty therein when, in the judgment of the head of bureau or office, the apparatus, equipment, supplies or services of such employees can be spared without serious detriment to public service.

The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as required of them by the Dean of the College, and the time so served shall be counted as part of their regular service.

SEC. 10. Assets, Liabilities, and Personnel. - All appropriations, assets, both real and personal, personnel, and records of the College, as well as its liabilities or obligations, shall be titled or named after the USTSP.

All parcels of land belonging to the government to be occupied by the College shall be the property of the USTSP, and titled under its name: *Provided*, That should the USTSP cease to exist or be abolished or should such aforementioned parcels of land be no longer needed by the USTSP, the same shall revert to the Cagayan de Oro City or to the Republic of the Philippines, as the case may be.

SEC. 11. Duty and Tax Exemptions.—The importation by the College of medical books or publications, medical equipment or instruments which are for medical, laboratory or scientific purposes shall, upon certification by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), be exempt

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
from customs duties in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10863, otherwise known as the "Customs Modernization and Tariff Act".

All grants, bequests, endowments, donations, and contributions made to and used actually, directly, and exclusively for educational purposes by the College, shall be exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deduction from gross income for purposes of computing the taxable income of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.

- **SEC. 12.** Suppletory Application. The provisions of Republic Act No. 8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997", shall form part of this Act
- **SEC. 13.** Appropriations. The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- **SEC. 14.** Implementing Rules and Regulations. Within sixty (60) days from the approval of this Act, the Board shall, in consultation with the CHED, issue rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act.
- **SEC. 15.** Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected are in full force and effect.
- **SEC. 16.** Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are amended, repealed, or modified accordingly.
- **SEC. 17.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 17 of the 1987 Constitution provides that "the State shall give priority to education." The Constitution further declares that the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all.

The University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines (USTSP) was established by virtue of Republic Act No. 10919. The USTSP is a state university established through the amalgamation of the Mindanao University of Science and Technology (MUST) in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental and the Misamis Oriental State College of Agriculture and Technology (MOSCAT) in Claveria, Misamis Oriental. Both campuses are located in Northern Mindanao, the Gateway to Mindanao, which offers a strategic locational advantage for the institution to train and develop students from all the other regions of Mindanao.

The bill seeks to create a USTSP-College of Medicine to address the shortage of physicians in the Region X. This will also give potential doctors in Northern Mindanao another high-quality medical school, especially those deserving and qualified students who do not have the financial resources to go to private medical schools.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. SEC. 2. General Mandate. – The USTSP – College of Medicine, hereinafter referred to as the "College", shall primarily offer a Doctor of Medicine Program, including Integrated Liberal Arts and Medicine (INTARMED) Program, consisting of basic science and clinical courses, and using learner-centered and competency-based approach. The primary goal of the College shall be to develop a corps of professional physicians to strengthen the healthcare system of the country, as well as to respond to the human resource development needs of the Province of Misamis Oriental and Region X.

The College is also mandated to undertake research and extension services and provide progressive leadership in these areas.

SEC. 3. SEC. 8. Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy. – The College shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant to paragraph 2, section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution.

SEC. 9. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus, Equipment or Supplies and Detail of Personnel. – Upon the recommendation of the chancellor and the request of the board, through its president, the heads of the bureaus and offices of the national government may loan or transfer to the college such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be needed by it, and detail employees for duty therein when, in the judgement of the head of bureau or office, the apparatus, equipment, supplies or services of such employees can be spread without serious detriment to public service.

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The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as required of them by the Dean of the College, and the time so served shall be counted as part of their regular service.

SEC. 10. Assets, Liabilities, and Personnel. – All appropriations, assets, both real and personal, personnel, and records of the College, as well as its liabilities or obligations, shall be titled or named after the USTSP.

All parcels of land belonging to the government to be occupied by the College shall be the property of the USTSP, and shall be titled under its name: Provided, that should the College cease to exist or be abolished or should such aforementioned parcels of land be no longer needed by the USTSP, the same shall revert to the concerned local government unit or to the Republic of the Philippines, as the case may be.

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SEC. 11. *Duty and Tax Exemptions*. – The importation by the College of medical books or publications, medical equipment or instruments which are for medical, laboratory or scientific purposes shall, upon certification by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), be exempt from customs duties in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10863, otherwise known as the "Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA)",

All grants, bequests, endowments, donations, and contributions made to and used actually, directly and exclusively for educational purposes by the College shall be exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deduction from gross income for purposes of computing the taxable income of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.

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- SEC. 12. Suppletory Application. The provisions of Republic Act No. 8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997", shall form part of this Act.
- **SEC. 13.** Appropriations. The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- SEC. 14. Implementing Rules and Regulations. Within sixty (60) days from the approval of this Act, the Board shall, in consultation with the CHED, issue the rules and regulations to fully implement the provisions of this Act.
- SEC. 15. Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected are in full force and effect.
- SEC. 16. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Act are deemed amended, repealed, or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 17. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following completion of its publication in the Official Gazette and in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
