# Introduced by SENATOR RAMON BONG REVILLA, JR.

AN ACT DECLARING THE VERDE ISLAND PASSAGE, LOCATED IN THE PROVINCES OF BATANGAS, MARINDUQUE, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO, ORIENTAL MINDORO AND ROMBLON, AND ECOTOURISM ZONE

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Verde Island Passage is globally known as the *center of the center of marine shorefish biodiversity*. With an international point and oil and gas facilities, it is considered one of the busiest shipping corridors in the country. The Passage is more than 1.4 million hectares which traverses five (5) provinces: Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque and Romblon.

The Verde Island Passage is known for its rich biodiversity; being home to 1700 fish species and 300 coral species. Furthermore, it houses 54 marine protected areas, especially so that is also home to various endangered and threatened species; which includes: hawksbill turtles, whale sharks, manta rays, dugongs, humphead wrasses, giant groupers, and giant clams.


One can easily see how productive an ecosystem Verde Island Passage is. Being central to both fishing and shipping, it is definitely an economic asset.

This bill seeks to declare the Verde Island Passage as an ecotourism zone so that it will be considered in the Department of Tourism's annual planning for the better preservation and conservation of the Passage.

## AN ACT

# DECLARING THE VERDE ISLAND PASSAGE, LOCATED IN THE PROVINCES OF BATANGAS, MARINDUQUE, OCCIDENTAL MINDORO, ORIENTAL MINDORO AND ROMBLON, AND ECOTOURISM ZONE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Verde Island Passage
 Ecotourism Act"

Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
promote a sustainable tourism industry and to implement responsible tourism
strategies and programs which shall protect and conserve its natural resources.

8 Towards this end, considering that the Verde Island Passage is recognized as 9 the world's center of marine biodiversity, the State shall ensure the optimal resource 10 utilization, conservation, protection and promotion of the sustainable coastal and 11 marine development of the areas covered by the Verde Island Passage.

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Sec. 3. Verde Island Passage as Ecotourism Zone. – The Verde Island
 Passage, located in the Provinces of Batangas Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro,
 Oriental Mindoro and Romblon is hereby declared an ecotourism zone. Pursuant

thereto, its development and promotion shall be prioritized and supported by the
 Department of Tourism (DOT), subject to the rules and regulations governing
 ecotourism zones.

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Sec. 4. Verde Island Passage Ecotourism Council. – There is hereby created
the Verde Island Passage Ecotourism Council, hereinafter referred to as the Council,
which shall be the primary policy-making, planning and coordinating body in the
development and administration of the ecotourism zone.

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The Council shall be composed of the following members:

- 11 (a) Secretary of the DOT, or a duly authorized representative as Chairperson;
- (b) Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR),
   or a duly authorized representative, as Co-chairperson;
- (c) Governors of the Provinces of Batangas, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro,
   Oriental Mindoro and Romblon, who shall elect form among themselves the
   Vice-chairperson;
- 17 (d) Mayors of the municipalities and cities comprising the ecotourism zone;
- (e) Regional directors for Region IV-A and Region IV-B of the DOT, DENR,
  Department of Science and Technology, Department of Health, Department of
  Interior and Local Government, Department of Justice, Department of Energy,
  Department of Public Works and Highways, Department of Finance,
  Department of Labor and Employment, Department of Social Welfare and
  Development, Department of Transportation, Department of Trade and
  Industry, Department of National Defense, and the Philippine National Police;
- 25 (f) Chief Operating Officer of the Tourism Promotions Board;
- 26 (g) Chief Operating Officer of the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone
   27 Authority;
- (h) Regional Directors of the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources for
   Region IV-A and Region IV-B;
- 30 (i) Regional Directors of the National Economic and Development Authority for
   31 Region IV-A and Region IV-B;
- 32 (j) Executive Director of the Philippine Commission on Sports Scuba Diving;
- 33 (k) Director of the Biodiversity Management Bureau of the DENR;

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- (I) A representative from the private sector who is distinguished in a profession or field of interest relevant to marine protection and management; and
- 3 (m)A representative from an academic institution, with proven track record or
   4 related to marine protection and management.
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6 The sectoral members of the Council shall be selected by the Council in a fair 7 and transparent manner. They shall each serve a term of three (3) years and may be 8 reappointed for another term.

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10 The Council may call on the other government agencies and offices to provide 11 advice and assistance on matters relating to the performance of its functions and the 12 development of ecotourism in said provinces.

The provincial governments of Batangas, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro and Romblon shall provide a secretariat for the Council, including the funding necessary to cover expenses for the performance of its official functions and activities.

19 Sec. 5. Ecotourism Development Plan. – Within one (1) year after the approval 20 of this Act, the Council, in consultation with concerned agencies of the government 21 and stakeholders prepare a tourism development plan that shall include the 22 construction, installation and maintenance of such appropriate infrastructure and 23 facilities to enhance tourism in the area: Provided, That said development plan shall 24 ensure the preservation and conservation of the natural beauty and resources of the 25 area: Provided, further, That pertinent and existing policies, management plans and 26 efforts to protect and conserve marine biodiversity thereat shall be taken into account 27 in the preparation of the tourism development plan.

**Sec. 6.** *Role of the DOT.* – The DOT shall assist the provincial governments of Batangas, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro and Romblon in the implementation of the tourism development plan by providing technical assistance in tourism capacity building. It shall also include the Verde Island Passage in its national and regional promotion programs.

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1	Sec. 7. Appropriations. – The funding for the implementation of this Act shall
2	be included in the respective annual budgets of the provincial governments of
3	Batangas, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro and Romblon. The DOT
4	may augment shall allocation with internally-generated funds.
5	
6	Sec. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations Within sixty (60) days from the
7	effectivity of this Act, the Council shall, in consultation with the concerned agencies of
8	the government, promulgate the rules and regulations to implement this Act.
9	
10	Sec. 9. Separability Clause if any provision of this Act shall be declared
11	unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full
12	force and effect.
13	
14	Sec. 10. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances or
15	portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby
16	repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
17	
18	Sec. 11. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
19	in a newspaper of general circulation.
