



## AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR THE RANK CLASSIFICATION AND ORGANIZATION OF KEY POSITIONS IN THE BUREAU OF FIRE PROTECTION (BFP) AND THE BUREAU OF JAIL MANAGEMENT AND PENOLOGY (BJMP), AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9263, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "BUREAU OF FIRE PROTECTION AND BUREAU OF JAIL MANAGEMENT AND PENOLOGY PROFESSIONALIZATION ACT OF 2004", AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9592

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 9263, as amended, is hereby
 amended to read as follows:

3 "SEC. 3. Organization and Key Positions of the BFP and the

BJMP. – The BFP and the BJMP shall be respectively headed by a Chief
 who shall be assisted by two (2) [d]Deputy [c]Chiefs, one (1) for
 [a]Administration and one (1) for [o]Operations, all of whom shall be
 appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Secretary of
 the DILG from among the qualified officers with at least the rank of
 [senior superintendent] FIRE/JAIL BRIGADIER GENERAL in the

service: Provided, That in no case shall any officer who has retired or is 1 2 retirable within six (6) months from his/her compulsory retirement age be appointed as Chief of the Fire Bureau or Chief of the Jail Bureau, as 3 the case may be: *Provided, further,* That the Chief of the Fire Bureau 4 5 and Chief of the Jail Bureau shall serve a tour of duty not to exceed four (4) years: Provided, however, That in times of war or other national 6 7 emergency declared by Congress, the President may extend such tour of duty. 8

9 The heads of the BFP and the BJMP with the rank of [director] FIRE/JAIL GENERAL shall have the position title of Chief of Fire 10 Bureau and Chief of the Jail Bureau, respectively. The second officers in 11 command of the BFP and the BJMP with the rank of [chief 12 superintendent] FIRE/JAIL LIEUTENANT GENERAL shall have the 13 14 position title of Deputy Chief for Administration of the Fire Bureau and Deputy Chief for Administration of the Jail Bureau, respectively. The third 15 officers in command of the BFP and the BJMP with the rank of [chief 16 superintendent] FIRE/JAIL LIEUTENANT GENERAL shall have the 17 position title of Deputy Chief for Operations of the Fire Bureau and 18 Deputy Chief for Operations of the Jail Bureau, respectively. The fourth 19 officers in command of the BFP and the BJMP with the rank of [chief 20 superintendent] FIRE/JAIL LIEUTENANT GENERAL shall have the 21 respective position title of Chief of Directorial Staff of the Fire Bureau 22 and Chief of Directorial Staff of the Jail Bureau, who shall be assisted by 23 the fd]Directors of the fd]Directorates in the respective fn]National 24 [h]Headquarters [o]Office with at least the rank of [senior 25 superintendent] FIRE/JAIL MAJOR GENERAL. 26

The BFP and the BJMP shall **CONSTRUCT**, establish, operate and maintain their respective regional offices in each of the administrative regions of the country which shall be respectively headed by a Regional Director for Fire Protection and a Regional Director for Jail Management and Penology with the rank of [senior superintendent] **FIRE/JAIL BRIGADIER GENERAL**. He/she shall be [respectively] assisted by the

1following officers with the rank of [superintendent]FIRE/JAIL2COLONEL: Assistant Regional Director for Administration, Assistant3Regional Director for Operations, and Regional Chief of Directorial Staff:4PROVIDED, THAT IN THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, THE5AFOREMENTIONED OFFICERS SHALL HAVE THE RANK OF6FIRE/JAIL BRIGADIER GENERAL.

SEC. 2. Section 5, paragraph d) of Republic Act No. 9263, as amended, is
hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 5. Appointment of Uniformed Personnel to the BFP and
 the BJMP. – The appointment of uniformed personnel to the BFP and
 the BJMP shall be effected in the following manner:

12 **XXX XXX XXX** 13 d) *Fire/ Jail [Chief Superintendent]* **BRIGADIER GENERAL** to
 14 *Fire/Jail Director.* - Appointed by the President upon[7] recommendation
 15 of the Secretary of the DILG, with the proper endorsement by the
 16 Chairman of the CSC."

- SEC. 3. Section 7 of Republic Act No. 9263, as amended, is hereby amended
   to read as follows:
- "SEC. 7. Professionalization and Upgrading of Qualification Standards in
   the Designation of Uniformed Personnel of the BFP and the BJMP to Key
   Positions. -
- a) No person shall be designated to the following key positions of theBFP unless he/she has met the qualifications provided therein:
- Municipal Fire Marshal. Should have the rank of [senior
   inspector] FIRE LIEUTENANT COLONEL, who must have
   finished at least second year Bachelor of Laws or earned at least
   twelve (12) units in a [m]Master's [d]Degree [p]Program in
   [p]Public [a]Administration, [m]Management, [e]Engineering,
   [p]Public [s]Safety, [c]Criminology or other related disciplines
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from a recognized institution of learning, and must have satisfactorily passed the necessary training or career courses for such position as may be established by the Fire Bureau;

2) City Fire Marshal. - Should have the rank of [chief inspector] 4 5 FIRE COLONEL, who must have finished at least second year Bachelor of Laws or earned at least twenty-four (24) units in a 6 7 [m]Master's [d]Degree [p]Program in [p]Public [a]Administration, [m]Management, [e]Engineering, [p]Public 8 9 [s]Safety, [c]Criminology or other related disciplines from a recognized institution of learning, and must have satisfactorily 10 passed the necessary training or career courses for such position 11 as may be established by the Fire Bureau; 12

13 [3) District Fire Marshal, Provincial Fire Marshal, Assistant 14 Regional Director for Administration, Assistant Regional Director for Operations and Regional Chief of Directorial Staff. - Should 15 have the rank of superintendent, who must be a graduate of 16 17 Bachelor of Laws or a holder of a master's degree in public administration, management, engineering, public safety, 18 criminology or other related disciplines from a recognized 19 institution of learning, and must have satisfactory passed the 20 necessary training or career courses for such position as may be 21 established by the Fire Bureau;] 22

[4) District Fire Marshal for the National Capital Region, Regional 23 Director for Fire Protection and Director of the Directorate of the 24 National Headquarters Office. - Should have at least the rank of 25 senior superintendent, who must be a graduate of Bachelor of 26 Laws or a holder of master's degree in public administration, 27 management, engineering, public safety, criminology or other 28 related disciplines from a recognized institution of learning, and 29 must have satisfactory passed the necessary training or career 30

<del>course for such position as may be established by the Fire</del> <del>Bureau;]</del>

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3) DISTRICT FIRE MARSHAL, DISTRICT FIRE MARSHAL 3 FOR THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, PROVINCIAL FIRE 4 MARSHAL, ASSISTANT REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR 5 ADMINISTRATION, ASSISTANT REGIONAL DIRECTOR 6 FOR OPERATIONS AND REGIONAL CHIEF OF 7 **DIRECTORIAL STAFF. – SHOULD HAVE THE RANK OF FIRE** 8 COLONEL, WHO MUST BE A GRADUATE OF BACHELOR OF 9 LAWS OR A HOLDER OF A MASTER'S DEGREE IN PUBLIC 10 ADMINISTRATION, MANAGEMENT, ENGINEERING, 11 PUBLIC SAFETY, CRIMINOLOGY OR OTHER RELATED 12 13 DISCIPLINES FROM A RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION OF LEARNING, AND MUST HAVE SATISFACTORILY PASSED 14 THE NECESSARY TRAINING OR CAREER COURSES FOR 15 SUCH POSITION AS MAY BE ESTABLISHED BY THE FIRE 16 **BUREAU:** 17

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9 [5] 6) Deputy Chief for Administration of the Jail Bureau, Deputy Chief for Operations of the Jail Bureau and Chief of Directorial 10 Staff of the Jail Bureau. - Should have the rank of [chief 11 superintendent] JAIL LIEUTENANT GENERAL, who must be a 12 member of the Philippine Bar or a holder of a [m]Master' 13 [d]Degree [p]Program in [m]Management, [p]Public 14 [c]Criminology, 15 <del>[a]</del>Administration, [p]Public <del>[s]</del>Safety, [s]Sociology, [n]National [s]Security [p]Penology, 16 [a]Administration, [d]Defense [s]Studies or other related 17 disciplines from a recognized institution of learning, and must 18 have satisfactorily passed the necessary training or career 19 courses for such position as may be established by the Jail 20 Bureau; and 21

[6] 7) Chief of the Jail Bureau. - Should have the rank of 22 [director] JAIL GENERAL, who must be a member of the 23 Philippine Bar or a holder of a [m]Master' [d]Degree [p]Program 24 in [m]Management, [p]Public [a]Administration, [p]Public 25 [s]Safety, [c]Criminology, [p]Penology, [s]Sociology, [n]National 26 [s]Security [a]Administration, [d]Defense [s]Studies or other 27 related disciplines from a recognized institution of learning, and 28 must have satisfactorily passed the necessary training or career 29 courses for such position as may be established by the Jail 30 Bureau. 31

1[Any uniformed personnel of the BFP and the BJMP who is currently2occupying such position but lacks of the qualifications mentioned therein3shall be given three (3) years upon the effectivity of this Act to comply4with the requirements, otherwise he/she shall be relieved from the5position.]"

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SEC. 4. Section 12 of Republic Act No. 9263, as amended, is hereby amended
to read as follows:

"SEC. 12. RANK CLASSIFICATION, Standardization of the Base Pay, 8 Retirement and Other Benefits of the Uniformed Personnel of the BFP 9 and the BJMP. – In order to enhance the general welfare, commitment 10 to service and professionalism of the uniformed personnel of the BFP and 11 the BJMP, they shall receive the minimum starting salary equivalent to 12 the salary grade level of the corresponding rank classification of their 13 counterparts in the PNP, as provided under Section 36 of [the] Republic 14 Act No. 8551, and in the AFP, as provided under Section 2 of Republic 15 Act No. 9166. 16

17[The rate of base pay of the uniformed personnel of the BFP and18the BJMP shall be adjusted in accordance with the following salary grade19schedule:] FOR PURPOSES OF EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION,20SUPERVISION AND CONTROL, THE RANK CLASSIFICATION AND21THE CORRESPONDING RATE OF THE BASE PAY OF THE22UNIFORMED PERSONNEL OF THE BFP AND THE BJMP SHALL BE23AS FOLLOWS:

11 *Provided*, That all benefits currently received by the uniformed 12 personnel of the BFP and the BJMP under other existing laws shall 13 continue to be received by them: *Provided, further*, That their retirement 14 pay shall be subject to the adjustment/s based on the prevailing scale of 15 base pay of the uniformed personnel in the active service.

**SEC. 5.** *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The DILG, in coordination with the BFP, the BJMP, the CSC, and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) shall, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the rules and regulations necessary to implement the provision of this Act.

20 **SEC. 6.** *Separability Clause.* - If any portion or provision of this Act is 21 declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the 22 other provisions not affected thereby.

23 **SEC. 7.** *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, 24 executive order, letter of instruction, rule and regulation, inconsistent with the 25 provisions of this Act is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 8. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
 complete publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation,
 whichever comes earlier.
