AN ACT
DECLARING THE 22nd OF MAY OF EVERY YEAR AS A
SPECIAL DAY FOR THE COMMEMORATION OF THE
“PHILIPPINES – AUSTRALIA FRIENDSHIP DAY”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Republic of the Philippines and Commonwealth of Australia established formal diplomatic relations on May 22, 1946. Seventy-seven (77) years later, both countries recognize the importance of fostering friendship to promote mutual prosperity, and diplomatic cooperation.

Trade between the two countries yielded \$4.1 billion in 2023, with around 40,000 Filipino workers employed by more than 300 Australian companies.¹ The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) also shared that it had garnered \$1.53 billion in Australian investments to the Philippines from 12 business agreements signed by the stakeholders of the two nations.²

Moreover, the ASEAN-Australia-New Zealand Free Trade Area (AANZFTA) and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) seek to benefit trade growth between the Philippines and Australia from a regional perspective.

This bill seeks to dedicate May 22 as a special day to honor the long-standing relationship between the Republic of the Philippines and the Commonwealth of Australia.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this measure is earnestly sought.

1 **SEC 4. *Special Day Status.*** - The Special Day status of the date
2 herein referred to in Section 2 shall not affect its classification as either
3 a working or a non-working day as determined by some other more
4 specific law.

5
6 **SEC. 5. *Appropriations.*** - The amount necessary for the initial
7 implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current
8 appropriations of the DFA. Thereafter, such amount necessary for the
9 continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual
10 General Appropriations Act.

12 **SEC. 6. *Repealing Clause.*** - All laws, decrees, orders,
13 proclamations, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, which are
14 inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified
15 accordingly.

17 **SEC. 7. *Effectivity.*** - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
18 after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in at least two (2)
19 newspapers of general circulation.
