## AN ACT DECLARING THE 22<sup>nd</sup> OF MAY OF EVERY YEAR AS A SPECIAL DAY FOR THE COMMEMORATION OF THE "PHILIPPINES – AUSTRALIA FRIENDSHIP DAY"

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Republic of the Philippines and Commonwealth of Australia established formal diplomatic relations on May 22, 1946. Seventy-seven (77) years later, both countries recognize the importance of fostering friendship to promote mutual prosperity, and diplomatic cooperation.

Trade between the two countries yielded \$4.1 billion in 2023, with around 40,000 Filipino workers employed by more than 300 Australian companies. The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) also shared that it had garnered \$1.53 billion in Australian investments to the Philippines from 12 business agreements signed by the stakeholders of the two nations.

Moreover, the ASEAN-Australia-New Zealand Free Trade Area (AANZFTA) and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) seek to benefit trade growth between the Philippines and Australia from a regional perspective.

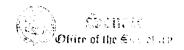
This bill seeks to dedicate May 22 as a special day to honor the long-standing relationship between the Republic of the Philippines and the Commonwealth of Australia.

# AN ACT DECLARING THE 22<sup>nd</sup> OF MAY OF EVERY YEAR AS A SPECIAL DAY FOR THE COMMEMORATION OF THE "PHILIPPINES – AUSTRALIA FRIENDSHIP DAY"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** Declaration of Policy. - It is the policy of the State to pursue an independent foreign policy in its relations with other States. It is also the policy of the State to put value to its existing bilateral relations with other States and to commemorate and celebrate these bilateral relations annually, and on their special occasions like the 50<sup>th</sup>, 75<sup>th</sup>, and 100<sup>th</sup> year anniversaries of the said bilateral relations.

**SEC. 2.** Diplomatic Relations. - The Philippines and Australia established their diplomatic relations on May 22, 1946. Therefore, the 22<sup>nd</sup> of May of every year is hereby declared as a Special Day for the commemoration of the "Philippines – Australia Friendship Day".

**SEC. 3.** Implementing Agency. - The Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) shall lead the Government in the commemoration and celebration of the "Philippines – Australia Friendship Day" annually, and on other special occasions such as the 100<sup>th</sup> year anniversary.

- **SEC 4.** Special Day Status. The Special Day status of the date herein referred to in Section 2 shall not affect its classification as either a working or a non-working day as determined by some other more specific law.
- **SEC. 5.** Appropriations. The amount necessary for the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current appropriations of the DFA. Thereafter, such amount necessary for the continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- **SEC. 6.** Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, proclamations, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 7. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
