## **AN ACT**

ESTABLISHING CENTRAL KITCHENS TO IMPROVE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11037, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "MASUSTANSYANG PAGKAIN PARA SA BATANG PILIPINO ACT", APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Republic Act No. 11037, otherwise known as the "Masustansyang Pagkain Para sa Batang Pilipino Act", was enacted in 2017 to stem the rising tide of malnutrition among children.

The program has mostly been satisfactory. Around 2.30 million elementary students in public schools have been provided with hot meals every year since its enactment.<sup>1</sup> 99.21% of parent-respondents to a DepEd survey noted that their children became more enthusiastic and energetic, gained weight, and had a strengthened immune system because of the program.

But here is always room for expansion and improvement. A recent DepEd-backed study revealed that only 74% of public schools have a designated cooking place. Many public schools in the Visayas and Mindanao regions have only dirty kitchens, which are fueled with charcoal or firewood. Very few schools have dedicated

cooking staff. Many rely on teachers and parents to buy and cook food on a voluntary basis.<sup>2</sup>

These shortcomings prevent prevents the full realization of the goals of this Act. The current measure thus proposes to amend R.A. No. 11037 to establish a network of central kitchens. These kitchens will be established by the DepEd based on clusters of geographically approximate clusters of schools. Each kitchen will be staffed by a food service supervisor and two cooks.

Finally, this measure clarifies the roles of LGUs, the private sector, and non-government organizations in the implementation of this law. This is done in recognition of the importance of multisectoral participation in the establishment and operation of central kitchens.<sup>3</sup>

Immediate passage of this measure is eagerly sought.

(a) Pursuant to Section 4 of this Act, exercise supervision and control over the establishment and maintenance of the central kitchens and issue guidelines on their location, staffing, and design and equipment standards;

- (b) Assist the Secretary in identifying clusters of geographically proximate public schools which may be served by a single central kitchen;
- (c) Conduct information campaigns and establish linkages with the private sector and civil society organizations under Section 6 of this Act, and pursuant thereof, facilitate their participation through the formation of a task force;
- (d) Assist the DepEd Secretary in formulating a joint memorandum circular with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) which will institutionalize the role of LGUs under Section 5 of this Act;
- (e) Coordinate with the appropriate units of the DOH for the delivery of supplementary health services, and the DA for the establishment of instructional gardens, and the supply and delivery of pasteurized or sterilized milk and milk-based products to school feeding program beneficiaries;
- (f) Such other powers and functions as may be necessary and proper for the full implementation of this Act;
- SEC. 7. Structure and Staffing Pattern. Subject to the approval of the DBM, the DepEd shall determine the organizational structure of and the central kitchens and create new divisions or units as it may deem necessary, and shall appoint officers and employees in accordance with the civil service law, rules, and regulations.

New divisions may also be created, and new personnel may also be hired, under the Bureau of Learner Support Services to fulfill the goals of this Act, subject to the approval of the DBM and in accordance with civil service law, rules, and regulations.

SEC. 8. *Appropriations.* – The amount necessary to carry out the initial implementation of this Act shall be sourced from the Contingent Fund. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continuous implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual budget of the Department of Education under the General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 9. Implementing Rules and	Regulations. – Within ninety (90) days from
the effectivity of this Act, the DepEd, the	e DA, DOH, DILG, the FNRI, and such other
relevant government agencies, nongo	vernment organizations, and development
partners shall promulgate their respective	e rules and regulations for the efficient and
effective implementation of this Act.	
SEC. 10. Separability Clause. – If a	any provision or part hereof is held invalid or
unconstitutional, the remainder of law of	or the provision not otherwise affected shall
remain valid and subsisting.	
Section 11. Repealing Clause. – Al	laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations
or other issuances or parts inconsistent	with the provision of this Act are hereby
repealed or modified accordingly.

publication in the Official Gazette;
