## **Introduced by SEN. WIN GATCHALIAN**

## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ALLEGED HUMAN TRAFFICKING, SERIOUS ILLEGAL DETENTION, AND PHYSICAL ABUSE AND TORTURE IN THE PREMISES OF AN INTERNET GAMING LICENSEE OF PHILIPPINE AMUSEMENT GAMING CORPORATION (PAGCOR) IN TARLAC, WITH AN END VIEW OF CRAFTING A LEGISLATION OR POLICY RECOMMENDATION, AS MAY BE NECESSARY

- WHEREAS, on 13 March 2024, the Presidential Anti-Organized Crime
- 2 Commission (PAOCC) led the team that conducted a raid on the premises of Zuan
- 3 Yuan Technology, Inc., a grantee of a provisional internet gaming licensee (IGL) of
- 4 PAGCOR as of 07 March 2024<sup>1</sup>, located in Tarlac City<sup>2</sup>. The operating units accounted
- for 875 workers, of which 371 are Filipinos, 432 are Chinese, 57 are Vietnamese, 8
- are Malaysians, 2 are Rwandans, 2 are Indonesians and 3 Taiwanese<sup>3</sup>;
  - WHEREAS, the raid was based on two search and seizure warrants<sup>4</sup> issued by
- 8 Presiding Judge Hermenegildo Dumlao II of the Regional Trial Court Third Judicial
- 9 Region Branch 81 in Malolos, Bulacan<sup>5</sup>, due to a complaint for physical injuries and

serious illegal detention<sup>6</sup> filed by a Vietnamese national who escaped from the compound of the Philippine Offshore Gaming Operator (POGO) on 28 February 2024<sup>7</sup>;

WHEREAS, the aforementioned Vietnamese escapee was allegedly manhandled and electrocuted naked while being held in the compound<sup>8</sup>;

WHEREAS, the Malaysians rescued likewise bore signs of physical torture and physical abuse<sup>9</sup>;

WHEREAS, the same POGO compound in Bamban town, Tarlac province, was also raided last 01 February 2024. The raid was based on a warrant to search, seize, and examine computer data, issued by Judge Maria Roma Flor Ortiz of the Regional Trial Court Branch 63 in Tarlac, for alleged operation of a fraudulent cryptocurrency investment scams shielded under the guise of a legitimate, licensed offshore gaming operation. Hongsheng Gaming Technology, Inc., a PAGCOR licensed has allegedly violated provisions of the Securities Regulations Code of the Philippines and of the Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012<sup>10</sup>;

WHEREAS, based on the new Internet Gaming Licensing Regulations issued by PAGCOR which took effect on 12 July 2023<sup>11</sup>, one of the qualifications for eligibility of an internet gaming licensee is (1) to be of good repute, considering character, honesty, and integrity and (2) it must not be associated with any person who is not of good repute or has undesirable or unsatisfactory financial resources. The good repute requirement was mandatory even when the old PAGCOR Offshore Gaming Regulatory Manual<sup>12</sup> was in effect; yet despite consistent and specific regulations,

PAGCOR fails to prevent its licensees and accredited service providers from engaging in illegal activities;

WHEREAS, there is a need to review the capacity of PAGCOR to implement its own regulations covering the offshore gaming industry as well as the capability of other law enforcement agencies to abate the commission of human trafficking, serious illegal detention, and physical abuse and torture in the country;

WHEREAS, the failure of the concerned government agencies to stop these large-scale human trafficking serious illegal detention, and physical abuse and torture in the country continues to undermine and pose threat to the country's safety and security;

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, there is a need to reiterate the call for action on these human trafficking, serious illegal detention, and physical abuse and torture incidents being linked to IGLs or POGOs;

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the alleged human trafficking, serious illegal detention, and physical abuse and torture perpetuated in Tarlac which is linked to a PAGCOR licensee, with an end view of crafting a legislation or policy recommendation, as may be necessary.
