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

AN ACT
UPGRADING THE POSITION OF SANITATION INSPECTOR TO A HIGHER
SALARY GRADE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Sanitation Inspectors are responsible for inspecting and regulating public and private establishments to ensure compliance with health and sanitation standards. Following Article II, Section 15 of the 1987 Constitution stating the State's duty to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness, they help prevent the spread of diseases, promote hygiene, and contribute significantly to the overall well-being of the community.


However, as professionals in public health, the salary grade of Sanitation Inspectors does not adequately reflect the importance and complexity of their duties. Thus, to address the disparity in compensation of the health workers, this measure seeks to upgrade the position of Sanitation Inspector a next higher salary grade. By offering a more competitive salary, this measure aims to attract skilled professionals to the role and retain experienced inspectors, thus ensuring continuity and expertise in public health services.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 Section 1. The position of sanitation inspector is hereby upgraded to the next
2 higher salary grades (SG) as follows:

Sanitation Inspector II	SG 08	SG 11
Sanitation Inspector III	SG 11	SG 13
Sanitation Inspector IV	SG 13	SG 15

Sanitation Inspector VI	SG 18	SG 19

1 Sec. 2. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the
2 Interior and Local Government shall, in coordination with the Department of Budget and
3 Management, issue the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation
4 of this Act.

5 Sec. 3. The amount needed for the effective implementation of this Act shall be
6 charged to the appropriations of the respective local government units.

7 Sec. 4. *Separability Clause.* – If for any reason, any section or provision of this Act
8 is declared unconstitutional, other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall
9 continue to be in full force and effect.

10 Sec. 5. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof
11 inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

12 Sec. 6. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
13 in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
