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Subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations, the [Rice Fund] RCEF shall be allocated and disbursed to rice producing areas, as follows:

(a) Farm Machineries Rice and Equipment – [fifty percent (50%)] NINE BILLION PESOS (P9,000,000,000.00) of the [Rice Fund] RCEF shall be released to and implemented by the Philippine Center for Postharvest Development and Mechanization (PhilMech) as grant in kind to eligible farmers associations, registered rice cooperatives and [local government units (LGUs)] LGUs, ACCORDING TO THEIR CHOICE, in the form of rice farm equipment, such as tillers, tractors, seeders, threshers, rice planters, harvesters, irrigation pumps, small solar irrigation,

1	reapers, [driers] DRYERS, millers, and [the
2	like, for purposes of improving farm
3	mechanization] POSTHARVEST, AND
4	PROCESSING FACILITIES SUCH AS
5	WAREHOUSES, GRAIN STORAGE

8	feasible,] procure from accredited local

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- (b) Rice Seed Development, Propagation, DISTRIBUTION, and Promotion -[Thirty SIX BILLION PESOS percent (30%) (P6,000,000,000.00) of the [Rice Fund] RCEF shall be released to and implemented by the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice) used for the development, and shall be propagation, and promotion of HIGH QUALITY inbred rice seeds to rice farmers and the organization of rice farmers into seed growers associations and/or cooperatives engaged in seed production and trade;

Provided, further, That preferential attention should be given to rice farmers, cooperatives, and associations adversely affected by the tariffication of the quantitative import restriction on rice in accordance with the thrust and priorities of [R. A.] REPUBLIC ACT No. 8435, as amended, otherwise known as the "Agriculture and Fisheries Modernization Act OF 1997" and the Philippine Development Plan (PDP). The increase or decrease of farmers' incomes shall be the primary benchmark in granting these interventions.

[Provided, furthermore, That if the annual tariff revenues from rice importation exceeds

Ten Billion Pesos (P10,000,000,000.00) in any given year within the six (6) year period following the effectivity of this Act, the excess tariff revenues shall be earmarked by Congress

and included in the General Appropriations Act
(GAA) of the following year:

- (a) Rice Farmer Financial Assistance A portion of the excess rice tariff revenues shall be released to the DA and shall be used for providing direct financial assistance to rice farmers who are farming two (2) hectares and below regardless of whether they continue farming rice or not as compensation for the projected reduction or loss of farm income arising from the tariffication of the quantitative import restrictions on rice;
- (b) Titling of Agricultural Rice Lands A portion of the excess rice tariff revenues shall be released to the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and Land Registration Authority (LRA), and shall be used for the subdivision and titling of agricultural rice lands or parts thereof awarded to farmer

1	beneficiaries under the Comprehensive Agrarian
2	Reform Program (CARP) and other similar
3	programs of the government;
4	(e) Expanded Crop Insurance Program on
5	Rice A portion of the excess tariff revenues
6	shall be released to the Philippine Crop
7	Insurance Corporation (PCIC) and shall be used
8	for the provision of crop insurance to qualified
9	rice farmer-beneficiaries under its existing
10	agricultural insurance programs; and
11	(d) Crop Diversification Program A portion
12	of the excess tariff revenues shall be released to
13	the DA and shall be used for productivity-
14	enhancement programs for rice farmers seeking
15	to diversify production towards other crops.]
16	The Congressional Oversight Committee on
17	Agricultural and Fisheries Modernization
18	(COCAFM) shall conduct a periodic review of
19	the use of the [Rice Fund] RCEF.

1	THE PHILIPPINE INSTITUTE FOR
2	DEVELOPMENT STUDIES (PIDS) SHALL
3	CONDUCT AN INDEPENDENT MID-TERM
4	AND END-TERM EVALUATION OF THIS ACT
5	TO ASSESS ITS EFFECTIVENESS, THE
6	RESULT OF WHICH SHALL BE SUBMITTED
7	TO THE COCAFM."
8	SEC. 6. Section 14 of Republic Act No. 8178, as
9	amended by Republic Act No. 11203, is hereby further
10	amended as follows:
11	"Sec. [14]17. Beneficiaries of the [Rice
12	Fund] RCEF. – The beneficiaries of the [Rice
13	Fund] RCEF shall be those farmers and
14	farmworkers [and their dependents] listed in
15	the RSBSA and rice cooperatives and
16	associations accredited by the DA. Within one
17	hundred eighty (180) days from the effectivity of
18	this Act, the DA, in consultation with farmers'
19	cooperatives and organizations and LGUs, shall
20	validate and update the masterlist of eligible

1	beneficiaries, AND THEREAFTER DO THE
2	SAME ANNUALLY, to ensure that those listed
3	are legitimate farmers, farmworkers, and rice
4	cooperatives and associations.
5	xxx."
6	SEC. 7. Separability Clause If any provision of this
7	Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder thereof not
8	otherwise affected shall remain in full force and effect.
9	SEC. 8. Repealing Clause All laws, presidential
10	decrees, executive orders, letters of instruction,
11	proclamations, or administrative regulations that are
12	inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
13	repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
14	SEC. 9. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect after
15	fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official
16	Gazette, or in a newspaper of general circulation.
