AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PHILIPPINE SCIENCE HIGH SCHOOL SYSTEM, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippine Science High School (PSHS) System plays a critical role in nurturing the country's future leaders in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). Since its inception, the PSHS System has produced a pool of graduates who have excelled in various scientific disciplines, contributing significantly to the country's development. However, as the demands of the modern world evolve, so too must our educational institutions, especially those catering to science and technology.

This proposed bill, titled the "Expanded Philippine Science High School (PSHS) System Act", seeks to address several gaps in the current PSHS system and expand its reach and impact. By strengthening the governance and management of the PSHS system, the bill envisions a more comprehensive, equitable, and competitive STEM education framework in the Philippines.

Currently, many talented and deserving students across the country, especially those from far-flung regions, face difficulties accessing PSHS campuses. This bill addresses this disparity by establishing a limit of two PSHS campuses per administrative region outside the National Capital Region (NCR), ensuring that regions with large populations and high demand for STEM education are adequately served. Additionally, it mandates that every province should have no more than one campus, balancing accessibility with strategic campus location.

The PSHS System offers free secondary education with a specialized curriculum focused on science and mathematics to students with high aptitude in these fields. This bill ensures that deserving students, identified through a rigorous admission process and other alternative methods, are given the opportunity to benefit from the program regardless of their geographic location.

To ensure that all PSHS campuses maintain a high level of academic performance, the bill outlines specific objectives for the uniformity of quality standards across campuses. It integrates all current and future PSHS campuses under a single system of governance and management, thereby ensuring that every campus operates under the same academic standards and administrative guidelines.

The bill likewise emphasizes the importance of international collaboration, both in research and development and in creating opportunities for students and faculty to participate in academic exchanges, competitions, and symposia. Such initiatives are crucial for enhancing the quality of education and research at the PSHS System, ensuring that its graduates remain competitive globally.



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1AN ACT2STRENGTHENING THE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE3PHILIPPINE SCIENCE HIGH SCHOOL SYSTEM, AND APPROPRIATING4FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

5 SECTION 1. *Short Title*. — This Act shall be known as the "Expanded Philippine
6 Science High School (PSHS) System Act."

SEC 2. *Declaration of Policy.* — "The State shall give priority to research and development, invention, innovation, and their utilization; and to science, technology, engineering and mathematics education, training and services. It shall support appropriate, and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, and their application to the country's productive systems and national life. To achieve these, the State hereby establishes a PSHS System that will assume a leadership role in secondary Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Education."

14 The State shall support the admission process of the PSHS System by 15 establishing test centers all over the regions, to enhance equitable admissions and 16 access for deserving students.

The State shall also ensure that every region is given equal opportunity to benefit from the establishment of the PSHS System. Towards this end, not more than two (2) PSHS campuses inclusive of the existing PSHS Campuses shall be established

in each of the administrative regions of the country outside NCR where PSHS-Main
Campus is located. Provided that, all establishment of PSHS Campuses shall be in
accordance with the criteria as set by the PSHS System Board of Trustees (Board).
Provided further, not more than one (1) PSHS Campus shall be established per
province. After 15 years of implementation of this law, the Board may consider
establishment of more than two (2) PSHS campuses per region.

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SEC. 3. *Objectives*. — In implementing the foregoing policy, the State shall pursue the following objectives:

- 9 1. Establish a PSHS Campus that offers on a free scholarship basis a
 10 secondary course with special emphasis on Science and Technology,
 11 Engineering and Mathematics to students with high aptitude or gifted in
 12 science and mathematics;
- 13 2. Establish campuses that are strategically accessible to the public;
- 14 3. Ensure uniformity in quality standards and systematic operations of15 schools under the PSHS system;
- 4. Operationalize the establishment of PSHS campuses as defined in this
 Act;
- 18 5. Integrate existing and future campuses into one system of governance
 19 and management that may be established by this law;
- 6. Ensure that students with high aptitude or gifted in science and
 mathematics are given equal scholarship opportunities to enroll in the
 Philippine Science High School System;
- 7. Increase the pool of high school graduates who will pursue
 undergraduate courses to conduct researches and prepare scholars for
 career in Science and Technology (S&T) to become leaders in the field
 of STEM;
- 8. Establish international collaboration for holistic development of its
 student, staff and leaders; and
- Support scholar's and teachers' participation in local and international
 competition, academic symposia, research projects, and similar other
 scholarly activities necessary for the attainment of its objective, subject

- 1 to availability of funds and usual government accounting and audit 2 regulations.
- 3 SEC. 4. *Definition of Terms*. —

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- Administrative Regions refer to the administrative regions where the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) holds regional offices.
- 6 2. *Careers in S & T* pertains to the enrollment of scholars in college or
 7 university courses in the fields of basic and applied sciences,
 8 mathematics, engineering, technology, science education and such
 9 other disciplines approved by the Board.
- 103. Deserving Students refers to those who qualify for admission through11the PSHS National Competitive Examination, or similar other admission12process approved by the Board such as Lateral Admission Qualifying13Examination (LAQE), Requirement for Admission, Criteria, and14Evaluation (RACE).
- 4. *Philippine Science High School (PSHS)* refers to a school under the supervision of the PSHS System offering secondary education on scholarship basis to students with high aptitude or are gifted in science and mathematics using a specially designed curriculum focusing on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.
- 20 5. *Philippine Science High School System (PSHS System)* consists of the
 21 Office of the Executive Director and the PSHS campuses under its
 22 supervision.
- 23 6. *Term of Office* refers to the period fixed by this Act within which a
 24 public official may hold office;
- 7. *Tenure of Office* refers to the period within which a public official
 actually held office within a prescribed term.

SEC. 5. *Scope*. — The Philippine Science High School System shall be composed of the existing PSHS campuses herein mentioned and future campuses which shall be established under this Act. The existing sixteen (16) campuses shall be known as follows:

In the establishment of future PSHS campuses, the Board may consider the following locations: 1st district of Aklan; Daraga, Albay; Ubay, Bohol; Laoag, Ilocos Norte: and Labangan, Zamboanga Del Sur; Third District, Cagayan and General Santos City, South Cotabato. Provided that there shall be established PSHS campuses per region and not more than one (1) campus per province according to the criteria as set by the PSHS Board of Trustees:

SEC. 6. *Restriction on the Conversion of High Schools into a Philippine Science High School System.* — In addition to the criteria as set by the Board in the establishment and operation of PSHS System, the conversion and inclusion of existing high schools into the PSHS system shall not be allowed.

SEC. 7. *Overall Coordinating Authority.* — The PSHS System shall be under the administrative supervision of the DOST. The Board shall be the Governing Board of all the PSHS campus. The Board shall formulate the staffing pattern of the PSHS System in coordination with the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and the Civil Service Commission (CSC).

19 SEC. 8. *PSHS Board of Trustees.* — There shall be a Board of Trustees (Board) 20 composed of the Secretary of the Department of Science and Technology as ex officio 21 Chairperson, the Secretary of Department of Education as ex officio Vice Chairperson 22 and the following members: the President of the University of the Philippines, The Executive Director of PSHS, the Director of Science Education Institute (SEI), the 23 24 President of the PSHS National Alumni Association, and the Chairpersons of the Committees on Science and Technology of the Senate and the House of 25 Representatives as ex officio members; and one (1) representative each from the 26 27 private sector representing higher education, child development professionals or 28 practitioners, agriculture and new emerging technologies. The private sector 29 representatives shall be appointed by the Board upon recommendation of a duly

constituted search committee. The private sector representatives shall serve a fixed
 term of four (4) years.

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3	The Board shall exercise the following powers:
4	1. Ensure that the provisions of the laws pertaining to the creation and
5	operation of the PSHS System are implemented;
6	2. Approve policies and guidelines necessary in the establishment and
7	operation of science high schools under the PSHS System in order to
8	maintain the quality and uniform standard in all PSHS Campuses;
9	3. Approve the curricula submitted by the Executive Director;
10	4. Formulate policies for the expansion of enrollment in the campuses
11	under the PSHS System;
12	5. Approve the criteria for the selection and admission of students;
13	6. Approve the grant and termination of PSHS scholarships including
14	stipend and such allowances for students;
15	7. Approve the graduation of successful candidates from the various PSHS
16	campuses;
17	8. Approve the appointment of Executive Director, Deputy Executive
18	Director(s) and Campus Director(s);
19	9. Approve appointment, promotion, retention, renewal, rewards and
20	incentives for faculty and non-teaching positions, fix their compensation
21	and other conditions of employment, and remove them for cause after
22	proper investigation and hearing;
23	10. Approve the extension of services of faculty members over the age of
24	65 up to 70 years of age and enjoy the rights and benefits under
25	Republic Act No. 8439 as amended by Republic Act 11312 otherwise
26	known as "Magna Carta for Scientists, Engineers, Researchers and other
27	Science and Technology Personnel in the Government".
28	11. Draw up a position classification and compensation plan for its faculty
29	and staff, and, any law to the contrary notwithstanding, to create
30	positions and fix and adjust salaries and benefits of the faculty members
31	and other employees and to determine the minimum hours of service of

1 faculty and such other terms and conditions of employment as it may 2 deem proper; 12. Receive grants whether cash, land, buildings, and improvements 3 thereof; donations, contributions, bequests, gifts, and to formulate 4 policies for the administration thereof in accordance with applicable 5 internal revenue laws; 6 7 13. Approve the use of income generated by the PSHS System in the pursuit of its functions and donations received in trust by individual campuses, 8 according to the purpose of the donor and intention of the donation. In 9 cases where income/donation received is not intended for a particular 10 campus, the Board shall likewise appropriate the same for the benefit of 11 12 the System or any part thereof; 14. Approve policies and rules of discipline for students, faculty and staff; 13 15. Approve partnership of PSHS System with local and international 14 institutions; 15 16. Approve policies and guidelines to rationalize the establishment and 16 17 operation of a campus under the System, for its assessment, evaluation and approval including the naming or renaming of existing or future 18 PSHS Campuses; 19 17. Approve criteria in the search for Executive Director (ED), Deputy 20 21 Executive Directors (DED) and Campus Directors (CD), and the selection of teaching and non-teaching personnel; 22 23 18. Create and reorganize the composition of the Executive Committee; 19. Approve the organizational and governance structure of the PSHS 24 System recommended by the ED. 25 SEC. 9. Executive Director — There shall be an Executive Director (ED) for the 26

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26 SEC. 9. Executive Director — There shall be an Executive Director (ED) for the
27 PSHS System who shall be appointed by the Board and shall have a rank of an
28 Executive Director V, with a Salary Grade of 30. The ED shall have a tenure of five (5)
29 years renewable for another term, but with a maximum of three (3) terms.

1 The ED shall exercise academic and administrative supervision within the PSHS 2 and shall be the Chief Executive Officer and primary implementor of policies and 3 guidelines set by the Board.

The ED shall perform the following roles and functions: 4 1. Coordinate core curriculum planning activities and research-based 5 development to be implemented by various campuses; 6 7 2. Conduct a continuing evaluation of the implementation of the approved 8 curriculum; 3. Oversee research projects of PSHS campuses which shall include 9 monitoring, coordinating, and evaluating research programs of 10 campuses; 11 4. Manage the IP registration, prototype development and 12 commercialization or adoption of research outputs of scholars and 13 14 students: 15 5. Provide legal and technical support to members of the PSHS System. Towards this end, the Office of the Executive Director shall be provided 16 with legal and technical staff who shall provide legal, technical and 17 administrative services to PSHS campuses; 18 6. Establish strategic linkages and coordinate student and faculty exchange 19 programs with foreign and local institutions to upgrade the level of 20 expertise of both faculty and students; 21 22 7. Facilitate networking among the campuses of the PSHS System with 23 other institutions in terms of sharing resources, expertise, and 24 equipment; 8. Oversee the development of a systemwide outreach program to upgrade 25 the teaching of STEM and provide support within the capabilities and 26 27 resources of various science high school campuses; 9. Recommend for approval of the Board the organizational and 28 29 governance structure of the PSHS System; 30 10. Coordinate the implementation of Board approved admission process, criteria, and standards; and 31

1 11. Provide secretariat services to the Board;

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2 The Executive Director shall be provided with the necessary staff for the 3 efficient and effective implementation of the above functions.

In view of the expansion of the PSHS System, the OED shall be provided with additional *plantilla* positions to be determined by the Executive Director and approved by the Board.

SEC. 10. *Deputy Executive Director.* — There shall be three (3) Deputy
Executive Directors (DED) with the rank of Deputy Executive Director IV and with
Salary Grade 28 who shall be appointed by the Board. They shall serve for a tenure
of five (5) years, renewable for another term but with a maximum of three (3) terms.

SEC. 11. *Campus Director*. — There shall be a Campus Director (CD) for each PSHS campus appointed by the Board with the rank of Director III and Salary Grade 27. The CD shall serve for a fixed term of five (5) years, renewable for another term but with a maximum of three (3) terms on the basis of a search process.

The CD shall be the administrative and academic head of a campus and will be responsible for its smooth operations. The CD may constitute a consultative body which may act as a citizen's arm to interpret the educational needs of the service area of the campus.

19 SEC. 12. *Executive Committees* (Execom). – There shall be an Executive 20 Committee in the PSHS System composed of the ED as *ex officio* chairperson, DED as 21 ex officio members and the CD representatives as members. The Execom is collegial 22 in nature.

Sec. 13. *Faculty Members Qualification*. – Faculty members of the PSHS System shall be exempt from any civil service examination or regulations as a requisite to appointment. They shall be selected in accordance with such criteria as may be established by the Board which shall include, if necessary and practicable, screening and competitive examination.

SEC. 14. *Curriculum.* – There shall be a PSHS System STEM Curriculum from
 Grades 7 to 10, and Grades 11 to 12 which shall be recognized as Junior High School,
 and Senior High School Levels, respectively.

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SEC. 15. *Exemption from Tax.* — All grants, bequests, endowments, gifts, donations, and contributions made to and used actually, directly, and exclusively for educational purposes by the PSHS shall be exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from gross income for purposes of computing the taxable income of the donee in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.

The importation of scientific and research equipment for educational purposes made by the PSHS upon certification by the DOST shall be exempt from customs duties in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10863, otherwise known as the "Customs Modernization and Tariff Act."

SEC. 16. *Trust Fund.* – Income generated from school fees collected shall be reported and deposited to an authorized government depository bank as a trust fund of the PSHS System to be used for priority programs and activities.

SEC. 17. *Appropriations*. — The amount necessary for the implementation of
this act shall be included in the annual general appropriations act.

SEC. 18. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. — The Board shall formulate,
 within ninety (90) days from effectivity of this Act, and issue the necessary
 Implementing Rules and Regulations to carry out the implementation of this Act.

SEC. 19. *Separability Clause*. — If any provision or part of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

25 SEC. 20. *Transitory Provision*. – Upon approval of this law, the following 26 incumbent key officials of the PSHS System shall acquire new term of office, as follows:

27 Non-*ex-officio* members of the Board are eligible to assume a term of 4 years;

Executive Director, and Deputy Executive Director, subject to meritorious performance and upon approval of the Board are eligible to assume a maximum of three (3) terms;

4 Campus Directors, subject to meritorious performance and approval of the 5 Board are eligible to assume a maximum of three (3) terms.

6 Further, the Board thru the Executive Committee shall submit a reclassification 7 or staffing modification and/ or position classification plan to fix the qualifications and 8 upgrade the salary grades of its personnel particularly of its faculty that will recognize 9 their specialized science teacher status subject to the existing policies of the DBM and 10 the CSC rules and regulations.

SEC. 21. *Fallback Position.* — At the end of his/her term, the Executive Director,
Deputy Executive Director, or Campus Director may opt to remain with the PSHS
System and occupy the highest available faculty rank in the PSHS System without
diminution in salary.

SEC. 22. *Repealing Clause*. — Republic Act Nos. 3661, 8436 and 9036 are hereby repealed. All laws, proclamations, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby amended, repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 23. *Effectivity*. — This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
 publication in at least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
