FURTHER AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7836, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'PHILIPPINE TEACHERS PROFESSIONALIZATION ACT OF 1994' AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9293

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 7836 or the Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act of 1994 was enacted in recognition of the "vital role of teachers in nation-building and development through a responsible and literate citizenry". In fulfilling this objective, the law established the Board for Professional Teachers (Board), under the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), which is tasked to regulate and supervise the teaching profession through the licensure examination and teacher professionalization.

The teachers are considered as the largest group of professionals. Of which, more than 850,000 are employed in the public school system. They play a role not only in the nurturing of the minds of the youth, but also, in the bigger scheme of things, in the shaping of the future of this nation.

Acknowledging the significance of this role, it is imperative that teachers, similar to all professionals, be accorded with opportunities for professional development to improve their skills. For it cannot be denied, that the professional gains of our teachers ultimately redound to the benefit of the Filipino youth on whose hands the Philippines of tomorrow rely.

Through the Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET) administered by the PRC and the Board the level of preparedness of future educators is defined. However, data from Philippine Institute for Development Studies shows that LET performance has been dismal - with the average passing rate at 33% and 40% for elementary and secondary levels, respectively. Correspondingly, a number of studies have emphasized that teacher effectiveness is the "most important school-based predictor of student learning." Considering all of these contexts, there is more opportune time than now to revisit the "Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act of 1994".

This measure seeks to amend Republic Act No. 7836 or the Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act, as amended by Republic Act No. 9293, by extending the responsibility to nominate members of the Board of Professional Teachers to Teachers Education Council, Department of Education, Commission on Higher Education, among others. It likewise tasks the PRC to issue appropriate rules in order to address conflict of interest in the conduct of licensure examinations, including releasing of results.

Furthermore, under this measure, additional qualifications will be implemented for those who will take the LET. Once enacted into law, those who fail in the licensure exam will be required to take a refresher course.

In view of ensuring that the existing policy on teacher professionalization is aligned with the current context, the passage of this measure is hereby earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. Section 5 of Republic Act No. 7836 is hereby amended as follows:

² "SEC. 5. Creation and Composition of the Board. - There is hereby ³ created under this Act a Board for Professional Teachers, hereinafter called the ⁴ Board, a collegial body under the general supervision and administrative control ⁵ of the Professional Regulation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the ⁶ Commission, composed of five (5) members who shall be appointed by the ⁷ President of the Philippines from among the recommendees chosen by the ⁸ Commission.

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10 The recommendees, WHO MUST POSSESS THE OUALIFICATION STIPULATED IN SECTION 3 OF THIS ACT, shall be chosen from the list of 11 nominees [selected by] SCREENED, EVALUATED AND SHORTLISTED BY 12 THE TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL (TEC), DEPARTMENT OF 13 EDUCATION (DEPED), COORDINATING COUNCIL OF PRIVATE 14 EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS (COCOPEA), COMMISSION 15 ON HIGHER EDUCATION (CHED), ASSOCIATION OF LOCAL COLLEGES 16 17 AND UNIVERSITIES (ALCU), PHILIPPINE ASSOCIATION OF STATE

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6	"THE FINAL LIST OF NOMINEES SHALL BE MADE PUBLIC AND
7	POSTED IN THE WEBSITE OF THE COMMISSION."
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9	"The chairperson and the vice-chairperson of the Board shall be
10	appointed from these five (5) members by the President: Provided, That the
11	members of the first Board appointed under this Act shall be automatically
12	registered as professional teachers and issued with the certificate of registration
13	and professional license upon payment of the fees for examination, registration,
14	and other fees prescribed by the Commission."
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16	Sec. 2. Section 7 of the same Act is hereby amended as follows:
17	"SEC. 7. Term of Office The members of the Board shall hold office for
18	a term of three (3) years from the date they assume office: Provided, That the
19	[first appointces to the Board under this Act shall hold office according to the
20	following terms: one (1) member shall serve for one (1) year; one (1) member
21	for two (2) years; the chairman, vice chairman, and one (1) member for three
22	(3) years.] CHAIRPERSON SHALL NOT BE REAPPOINTED.
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24	Vacancies shall be served for the unexpired term only. No person who
25	has served AS MEMBER OF THE BOARD for two (2) consecutive terms shall
26	be eligible for reappointment. Appointment to fill an unexpired term shall be
27	considered an appointment to a complete term.
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30	Sec. 3. Section 8 of Republic Act No. 7836 is hereby amended as follows:
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- "SEC. 8. Qualifications of Board Members. Each Board member must
 at his **OR HER** appointment:
- 3 "(a) Be a citizen and resident of the Philippines;
- 4 "(b) Be at least thirty-five (35) years of age, of proven integrity, and possessed
 5 of high moral values in his **OR HER** personal as well as professional conduct
 6 and has not been convicted of any offense involving moral turpitude;
- "(c) Be a holder of [the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in
 Education and preferably a holder of a master's or doctorate degree in
 education, or their equivalents,] AT LEAST A MASTER'S DEGREE,
 PREFERABLY EARNED A DOCTORATE DEGREE, IN EDUCATION OR
 ALLIED FIELDS, from a [university, school, college, academy or institute duly

12 constituted, recognized and/or accredited by the Philippine government;]

- DULY RECOGNIZED AND ACCREDITED EDUCATION INSTITUTION BY
 THE GOVERNMENT;
- "(d) Be a professional teacher with a valid certificate of registration and valid
 professional license, save those members who shall compose the first Board for
 Professional Teachers;
- "(e) Has been a professional teacher in the active practice of the teaching
 profession for at least ten (10) years in the elementary [and] OR secondary
 LEVELS OR A FACULTY IN A TEACHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS
 FOR AT LEAST TEN (10) YEARS; and
- "(f) Not be an official or member of the faculty of, nor have pecuniary interest
 in any university, college, school, or institution conferring a bachelor's degree
 in education or its equivalents [for at least three (3) years prior to his
 appointment,] and neither connected with a review center or with any group
 or association where review classes or lectures in preparation for the licensure
 examination are offered or conducted, NOR HAVE PECUNIARY INTEREST
 IN SUCH.
- PROVIDED, THAT THE COMMISSION SHALL ISSUE THE
 APPROPRIATE GOVERNING RULES ON THE PRACTICE OF MEMBERS
 OF THE BOARD TO ENSURE THAT NO CONFLICT OF INTEREST SHALL

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ARISE IN THEIR FUNCTIONS RELATED TO THE CONDUCT OF THE LICENSURE EXAMINATION AND THE RELEASE OF THE RESULTS.

"Provided, [however]**FURTHER**, That the membership to the Board shall be evenly distributed to cover all levels of education, including equitable representation of the different fields of specialization.

"PROVIDED, FINALLY, THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL ALSO HAVE THE NECESSARY EXPERTISE IN IMPLEMENTING TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS THAT ARE MANDATED BY CHED.'

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Sec. 4. Section 13 of Republic Act No. 7836 is hereby amended as follows:

"SEC. 13. Examination, Registration and License Required. [Except as 11 otherwise specifically allowed under the provisions of this Act, all applicants for 12 registration as professional teachers shall be required to undergo a written 13 14 examination which shall be given at least once a year in such places and dates as the Board may determine upon approval by the Commission, a valid 15 16 certificate of registration and a valid professional license from the Commission are required before any person is allowed to practice as a professional teacher 17 in the Philippines, except as otherwise allowed under this Act.] 18

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20 21 **"APPLICANTS FOR REGISTRATION AS PROFESSIONAL TEACHERS SHALL BE REQUIRED TO UNDERGO:**

²² "A WRITTEN LICENSURE EXAMINATION WHICH SHALL BE
 ²³ GIVEN AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR IN SUCH PLACES AND DATES AS THE
 ²⁴ BOARD MAY DETERMINE UPON APPROVAL BY THE COMMISSION. A
 ²⁵ WRITTEN EXAMINATION WILL BE REQUIRED FOR:

26 "(A) GRADUATES OF EDUCATION COURSES, CONSISTENT

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A VALID CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION AND A VALID 1 **PROFESSIONAL LICENSE FROM THE COMMISSION ARE REQUIRED** 2 PERSON IS ALLOWED TO PRACTICE AS 3 **BEFORE ANY** A PROFESSIONAL TEACHER IN THE PHILIPPINES, EXCEPT 4 AS OTHERWISE ALLOWED UNDER SECTION 8 OF R.A. NO. 10533, OR THE 5 ENHANCED BASIC EDUCATION ACT OF 2013": PROVIDED, THAT THEY 6 PASS THE LICENSURE EXAMINATION WITHIN THREE (3) YEARS 7 FROM THE DATE OF HIRING." 8

Sec 5. Section 15 of Republic Act No. 7836, as amended, is hereby further 26
 amended as follows:

"SEC. 15. Qualification Requirements of Applicant. - No applicant shall
 be admitted to take the examination unless, on the date of the filing of the
 application, [he or she] **THE APPLICANT** shall have complied with the
 following requirements:

- "(a) A citizen of the Philippines or an alien whose country has reciprocity
 with the Philippines in the practice of the teaching profession:
 - "(b) At least eighteen (18) years of age;

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- "(c) In good health and of good reputation with high moral values;
- "(d) Has not been convicted by final judgment by a court for an offense
 involving moral turpitude;
- "(e) A graduate of a school, college or university recognized by the
 government and possesses the minimum educational qualifications IN LINE
 WITH THE STANDARDIZED TEACHER EDUCATION CURRICULUM;
 AND [as follows:
- 26 (1) For teachers in preschool, a bachelor's degree in early childhood
 27 education (BECED) or its equivalent;
- 28 (2) For teachers in the elementary grades, a bachelor's degree in
 29 elementary education (BSEED) or its equivalent;
- 30 (3) For teachers in the secondary grades, a bachelor's degree in
 31 education or its equivalent with a major and minor, or a bachelor's degree in
 32 arts and sciences with at least eighteen (18) units in professional education;

(1) For teachers of vocational and two-year technical courses, a
 bachelor's degree in the field of specialization or its equivalent, with at least
 eighteen (18) units in professional education;

4 "(F) HAS COMPLETED A REFRESHER COURSE IN A CHED 5 RECOGNIZED TEACHER EDUCATION INSTITUTE, WITHIN ONE YEAR
 6 PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE EXAMINATION FOR APPLICANTS WHO
 7 FAILED TO PASS THE LICENSURE EXAMINATION THREE (3) TIMES,
 8 BEFORE BEING ALLOWED TO RETAKE THE EXAMINATION."

10 Sec. 6. Section 16 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 16. RELEASE OF THE QUESTIONS AND Report of the Results
 of the Examination. - THE BOARD SHALL, IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE
 EXAM ADMINISTRATION, RELEASE THE QUESTIONS, ANSWERS AND
 RELEVANT INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC."

THE EXAM SHALL BE VALIDATED THROUGH A THIRD-PARTY 16 ASSESSMENT BEFORE AND AFTER **ADMINISTRATION.** 17 ITEM ANALYSIS IS RECOMMENDED TO BE DONE AFTER EXAM 18 **ADMINISTRATION.** 19

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***ADDITIONALLY,** the Board shall, within one hundred twenty (120)
 days after the examination, report the ratings obtained by each candidate by
 exam component to the Commission for approval and appropriate action.

25 "THE BOARD SHALL ALSO MAKE PUBLIC THE LICENSURE 26 EXAMINATION PERFORMANCE OF SCHOOLS WITH A TEN (10) YEAR 27 TRACK RECORD ANALYSIS."

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29 Sec. 7. *Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).* - Within sixty (60) days 30 from the effective date of this Act, the Professional Regulation Commission shall 31 update its IRR necessary for the effective implementation of this Act. *Sec. 8. Transitory Provision.* - The Professional Regulation Commission and the Board of Professional Teachers shall update its existing policies and issuances relevant to this Act and ensure its alignment with the same within a period of six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act and report the same to Congress, through the Senate Committee on Higher Education and on the first year of its implementation.

Sec. 9. *Separability Clause.* - If any part, section, or provision of this Act is held
invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full
force and effect.

9 Sec 9. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, decrees, circulars, administrative orders, 10 rules and regulations, and other issuances which are inconsistent with the provisions 11 of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

12 Sec. 10. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 13 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
