EXPLANATORY NOTE

In the newspapers, on television and radio, our people continuously read, watch and hear the continuing appeals of our police agencies to their sense of patriotism and civic pride to report crimes and criminals. In this country of relative mass unemployment and soaring prices, our people have long ago discovered that patriotism and civic pride alone cannot keep body and soul together. This bill provides a remedy – a monetary incentive, a reward, a just and reasonable compensation.

This bill seeks to provide an effective method to detect and subdue lawbreakers. At the same time, this bill would generate the much needed funds to help balance a deficit-driven budget and relieve the pressures on our much beleaguered National Treasury; add policemen and undercover agents for our peace agencies without the need of a budgetary outlay; and provide temporary employment and refuge for an equal number of our unemployed citizens.

Approval, therefore, of this bill is earnestly sought.

INTRODUCED BY HON. MANNY VILLAR

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A UNIFORM REWARD SYSTEM IN THE CAMPAIGN AGAINST CRIME AND LAWLESSNESS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines

in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Any person, a group of persons, define for purposes of this Act 1 as government-informer, having knowledge of frauds upon and violations of any law 2 of the Republic of the Philippines, may voluntarily submit, personally or by registered 3 mail to any responsible government official a sworn statement or affidavit stating the 4 time, place, manner and other circumstances of any act which is in his best and 5 honest judgment is patently in violation of the law, or furnishing information which 6 may lead to the arrest and apprehension of a fugitive or a wanted criminal. For such 7 information, a government informer shall be entitled to receive compensation or 8 9 reward as hereinafter provided.

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SECTION 2. The compensation from the Government of a government-11 informer shall be limited to the payment of a reward equivalent to twenty-five per 12 centum of the total revenue collection directly resulting from a sworn statement 13 furnished by a government informer. The balance of the total revenue collections 14 equivalent to seventy-five per centum shall be used to augment appropriations set 15 16 aside in the General Appropriations Act to subsidize and standardize the salaries of policemen. The revenue collections may consist of the proceeds from the sales of 17 any property forfeited or confiscated, fines, indemnities, assessments, duties, taxes, 18 fees, surcharges, penalties and compromises. 19

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SECTION 3. Private persons and corporations shall pay also a governmentinformer a reward equivalent to twenty-five *per centum* of their collections directly resulting from a sworn statement furnished by a government-informer. The collections of private persons or corporations may consist of damages, indemnities, contributions, fees and premium refunds, adjustments, salaries and commissions.

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27 SECTION 4. The total revenue collections of the Government and the cash 28 benefits due private persons and corporation directly resulting from a sworn 29 statement furnished by a government-informer shall be collected by the Secretary of Finance or his authorized representatives only upon the order of a court of competent jurisdiction after trial and conviction.

SECTION 5. The cash benefits due private persons and corporations and 4 reward due government-informers shall be tax-exempt and payable promptly. 5 through brokers of their choice and confidence, by the Secretary of Finance or his 6 authorized representatives in the form of registered Progress Bonds issued by the 7 Development bank of the Philippines which shall not convertible into cash within five 8 years from the date of issue: *Provided, however,* That a government-informer may 9 in writing exercise the option to have his reward paid in cash subject to the payment 10 of income tax, or to have all or any portion thereof donated to the government to 11 augment the appropriations set aside in the General Appropriations Act to subsidize 12 and standardize the salaries of the policemen. The broker's commission shall also 13 14 be tax exempt if paid in the form of Progress Bonds Certificates.

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16 SECTION 6. Should the sworn statement later turn or be proven to be false 17 or have been made only for the purpose of harassing, molesting or any way 18 prejudicing the person so denounced, the person so denounced shall be entitled to 19 any action, criminal or civil as the circumstances and the facts may warrant: 20 *Provided, however,* That the identity of the government-informer shall not be 21 revealed without his consent except when the sworn statement is proven to be 22 malicious of false.

24 SECTION 7. Any person violating any provision of this Act shall suffer an 25 imprisonment for not less than one year and one day to pay a fine of not less than 26 two thousand pesos (P2,000.00).

SECTION 8. Republic Act Numbered Two Thousand Three Hundred and Thirty Eight and all other laws providing for the payment of reward to the informers of frauds upon and violations of any law of the Republic of the Philippines are hereby repealed

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- SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
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
