

JOINT RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE (DOJ), THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (PNP), THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DILG), ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TASKED TO ENFORCE PEACE AND ORDER TO ISSUE RULES AND REGULATIONS ON PRESENTATION OF SUSPECTS UNDER THEIR CUSTODY TO THE MEDIA

WHEREAS, the practice of law enforcement officers and other personnel such as members of the PNP in presenting to the public, through print and broadcast media, suspects of criminal acts, which are still being investigated should be regulated as such acts subject them to unwanted publicity thereby besmirching their name and reputation and that of their family;

WHEREAS, the right of the public to be informed with respect to issues and incidents of public interest, especially those affecting security of their persons and property and the exercise of press freedom, shall be guaranteed at all times;

WHEREAS, Section 12 (1), Article III of the Constitution provides that "Any person under investigation for the commission of an offense shall have the right to be informed of his right to remain silent and to have competent and independent counsel preferably of his own choice. If the person cannot afford the services of counsel, he must be provided with one. These rights cannot be waived except in writing and in the presence of counsel";

WHEREAS, so as not to infringe these fundamental rights of both the suspects vis a vis the right of the people to information and to press freedom. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled: To direct the Department of
Justice (DOJ), the Philippine National Police (PNP), the Department of the
Interior and Local Government (DILG), and other engaged in law

enforcement to issue the necessary rules and regulations on presentation of suspects under their custody to the media including, but not limited to imposable administrative sanctions in cases of violations that may arise there from. The necessary rules and regulations must be issued to regulate the presentation of suspects to the media in order to reunite and/or harmonize these aforementioned rights.
