## AN ACT

## TO PROMOTE ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS THROUGH ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION, STRENGTHENING FOR THIS PURPOSE SECTION 53 OF PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1152, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE PHILIPPINE ENVIRONMENT CODE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. – *Title*. – This Act shall be known as **The Environmental Awareness** 

2 and Education Act of 2007.

Section 2. - Declaration of Policy. - It shall be a policy of the State to protect 3 and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with 4 the rhythm and harmony of nature. In recognition of the vital role of youth in nation 5 building and the role of education to foster patriotism and nationalism, accelerate social 6 progress, and promote total human liberation and development, the State shall promote 7 national awareness on the role of natural resources in economic growth and the 8 importance of environmental conservation and ecological balance towards sustained 9 national development among the Filipino youth. 10

11 Section 3. Scope. - Pursuant to the foregoing policy, the Department of 12 Education (DepEd), Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and Technical Education 13 and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), in coordination with the Department of 14 Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) shall ensure that the curricula of primary,

secondary and tertiary public and private educational institutions, including non-formal, 1 indigenous learning and out-of-school program, incorporate the state of the Philippine 2 and global environment, the threats of environmental degradation and its impact on 3 human well-being, and the value of natural resources conservation and protection in the 4 5 context of sustainable development. It shall incorporate actual activities to conserve natural resources, including, but not limited to, tree planting activities; recycling and 6 composting programs; marine conservation programs; forest management and 7 conservation; and other such programs to aid the implementation of the different 8 9 environmental protection laws.

10 Section 4. Environmental Education and Activities as Part of National 11 Service Training Program. - The CHED and TESDA shall include environmental 12 education and awareness programs and activities in the National Service Training 13 Program under Republic Act No. 9163, as part of the Civic Welfare Training Service 14 component required for all Baccalaureate degree courses and vocational courses with a 15 curriculum of at least two years.

16 Section 5. Declaration of Environmental Awareness Day. – In line with the 17 principles and mandates set by the Philippine Constitution, the month of January of 18 every year throughout the Philippines shall be known as the "Environmental Awareness 19 Month."

20 Section 6. Inter-Agency and Multi-Sectoral Effort. – The DepEd, CHED, 21 TESDA, DENR and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), in consultation 22 with experts in the environmental sector and the academe, shall lead in the 23 implementation of a comprehensive public education and awareness program on 24 environmental protection and conservation through collaborative inter-agency and multi-25 sectoral effort at all levels.

The DENR shall have the primary responsibility of periodically updating all agencies concerned on current environmental updates, including identifying priority environmental education issues for national action and providing strategic advice on the environmental education activities. 1 The DepEd, CHED and TESDA shall ensure that the information is disseminated 2 to the students of all levels.

The DOST is mandated to create programs that will ensure that students receive science-based quality information on environmental issues to encourage the development of environmentally-friendly solutions, devices, equipment and facilities.

6 Section. 7. Separability Clause. - If any part, section, or provision of this Act 7 shall be held invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions shall not be affected 8 thereby.

9 Section. 8. *Repealing Clause.* - All other acts, laws, executive orders, 10 presidential issuances, rules and regulations or any part thereof which are inconsistent 11 herewith are hereby deemed repealed or modified accordingly.

Section. 9. *Effectivity.* - The provisions of this Act shall take effect fifteen days
from its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspapers of
general circulation.
