EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article XIV, Section 4(1) mandates the State to exercise reasonable supervision and regulation of all educational institutions. The crime incidence in campuses has steadily risen. There is a need to inform the parents and guardian, as well as their children and wards, about crimes that happened in a particular educational institution and about its security policies and procedures.

This bill aims to provide a safe and healthy environment for students by requiring educational institutions:

1. To develop security policies and procedures;
2. To report crimes on campuses; and
3. To develop policies and procedures to address violent crimes on college campuses.*

1 SECTION 4. *Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics.* –
2 Upon effectivity of this Act, each eligible campus shall begin to collect the following
3 information with respect to campus crime statistics and campus security policies and each year
4 thereafter, prepare, publish, and distribute, through appropriate publications or mailings, to all
5 current students and employees, and to any applicant for enrollment or employment upon
6 request, an annual security report containing at least the following information with respect to
7 the campus security policies and campus crime statistics of that institution:

8 (A) A statement of current campus policies regarding procedures and facilities for
9 students;

10 (B) Reports of criminal actions or other emergencies occurring on campus; and

11 (C) Policies concerning the institution’s response to such reports.

12 SECTION 5. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
13 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
14 valid and subsisting.

15 SECTION 6. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
16 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or inconsistent
17 with, the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

18 SECTION 7. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
19 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
