RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the chivalry, humility and magnanimity of deceased MAXIMO V. SOLIVEN have gained him the compelling reward of being buried with honors at the Libingan ng mga Bayani in Fort Bonifacio, Taguig, Metro Manila; .
