MANIFESTATION OF SENATOR BIAZON

Senator Biazon called on the Body to review the security measures being undertaken by the Senate Sergeant-at-Arms in the wake of the tragic bombing at the House of Representatives.

Senator Biazon said that the adoption of stricter security measures in the Senate, particularly in the two approaches to the Senate premises, had delayed him many times in coming to the Senate, stretching to as long as 30 minutes. He noted that while Rule VI, Section 8, paragraph (c) of the Rules of the Senate limits the duties and responsibilities of the Sergeant-at-Arms only to areas within the Senate building, the new security measures had become much broader in scope, and has even included the deployment of K-9 units within the building by members of the Philippine National Police. He asked for a clear delineation between the responsibilities of the Sergeant-at-Arms and the PNP security who are detailed outside the building because the security measures currently in place have affected the work of the Members.

Senator Biazon noted that the Sergeant-at-Arms in the Bigger House is not only responsible for what happens within its offices but even for those that occur in the immediate vicinity of the building. He suggested that a review be made on the duties and powers of the Sergeant-at-Arms, specifically those mandated by the *Rules of the Senate*, underscoring the need for having a clear delineation of responsibility between the Office of the Sergeant-at-Arms and any agency providing security for the Senate, particularly as to the areas being handled by each one.

Senator Biazon also stressed the importance of having security cameras monitoring the area. He noted that the material from the security cameras at the Bigger House could have helped in the bombing incident investigation were it not for the fact that the video coverage of the cameras lasted for only eight hours.

REPLY OF THE SENATE PRESIDENT

The Senate President assured Senator Biazon that the security of the Senate is being reviewed but in the meantime, interim measures, including the setting up of a checkpoint, are being implemented. He added that the Sergeant-at-Arms has already made recommendations on how to address delays that have resulted from these stricter security

measures. He conceded that while such inspections cannot be lifted, some physical changes would be made to solve the problem. He also acknowledged the other issues that have also arisen as a result of tightened security in the Senate, but he requested that these should not be discussed in public.

The Senate President stated that the matter shall be referred to the Committee on Rules, as he disclosed that he has already compared notes with the House Speaker on how to bolster the security of both institutions and the possibility of using a system similar to what is being implemented at the Capitol Hills, where it has its own police force. He added that he would apprise Senators Honasan and Trillanes who might be interested in helping improve the security of the Senate.

As a former soldier, Senator Biazon stated that the value of command responsibility should be taken into consideration, especially in pinpointing responsibilities between the Senate Sergeant-at-Arms and the commander of the Philippine National Police to avoid confusion.

REFERRAL OF SENATOR BIAZON'S MANIFESTATION

Upon motion of Senator Pangilinan, there being no objection, the Chair referred Senator Biazon's manifestation primarily to the Office of the Senate President, and secondarily to the Committee on Rules.
