AN ACT CONVERTING THE MUNICIPALITY OF BATAC IN THE PROVINCE OF ILOCOS NORTE INTO A COMPONENT CITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE CITY OF BATAC

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

ARTICLE I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

3 SECTION 1. *Title* – This Act shall be known as the "Charter of the 4 City of Batac".

5 SEC. 2. The City of Batac. – The Municipality of Batac shall be 6 converted into a component city to be known as the City of Batac, hereinafter 7 referred to as the City, which shall comprise the present territory of the 8 Municipality of Batac, Province of Ilocos Norte. The territorial jurisdiction of 9 the City shall be within the present metes and bounds of the Municipality of 10 Batac.

The foregoing provision shall be without prejudice to the resolution by
 the appropriate agency or forum of existing boundary disputes or cases
 involving questions of territorial jurisdiction between the City of Batac and the

adjoining local government units: *Provided*, That, the territorial jurisdiction of the disputed area or areas shall remain with the local government unit, which has existing administrative supervision over said area or areas until the final resolution of the case.

5 SEC. 3. Corporate Powers of the City. - The City constitutes a 6 political body corporate and as such is endowed with the attributes of 7 perpetual succession and possessed of the powers which pertain to a municipal 8 corporation to be exercised in conformity with the provision of this Charter. 9 The City shall have the following corporate powers:

(a) To have a continuous succession in its corporate name;

- (b) To sue and be sued;
- 12 (c) To have and use a corporate seal;
- 13 (d) To acquire, hold and convey real or personal property;
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- (e) To enter into any contract and/or agreement; and
- 15 (f) To exercise such other powers, prerogatives or authority subject to16 the limitations provided in this Act or laws.
- 17 SEC. 4. General Powers. - The City shall have a common seal and may alter the same at pleasure. It shall exercise the powers to levy taxes: to 18 close and open roads, streets, alleys, parks or squares; to take, purchase. 19 receive, hold, lease, convey and dispose of real and personal property for the 20 general interests of the City; to expropriate or condemn private property for 21 22 public use; to contract and be contracted with; to sue and be sued; to prosecute and defend to final judgment and execution suits wherein the City is involved 23 or interested in; and to exercise all the powers as are granted to corporations 24 25 or as hereinafter conferred.
- SEC. 5. Liability for Damages. The City and its officials shall not be
 exempt from liability for death or injury to persons or damage to property.

1 SEC. 6. Jurisdiction of the City. – The jurisdiction of the City of Batac, 2 for police purposes only, shall be coextensive with its territorial jurisdiction 3 and for the purpose of protecting and ensuring the purity of the water supply 4 of the City, such police jurisdiction shall also extend over all the territory 5 within the drainage area of such water supply, or within one hundred meters 6 (100 m.) of any reservoir, conduit, canal, aqueduct or pumping station used in 7 connection with the city water service.

The city court of the City of Batac shall have concurrent jurisdiction 8 9 with the city or municipal court of the adjoining municipalities or cities, to try 10 crimes and misdemeanors committed within said drainage area or within said spaces of one hundred meters (100 m.). The court first taking cognizance of 11 12 such an offense shall have jurisdiction to try said cases to the exclusion of 13 others. The police force of several municipalities and cities concerned shall 14 have concurrent jurisdiction with the police of the City for the maintenance of 15 good order and the enforcement of ordinances throughout said zone, area or spaces. But any license that may be issued within said zone, area or spaces 16 17 shall be granted by the proper authorities of the city or municipality concerned, and the fees arising therefrom shall accrue to the treasury of the 18 19 said city or municipality concerned and not to the city.

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ARTICLE II

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CITY OFFICIALS IN GENERAL

SEC. 7. The Officials of the City of Batac. – (a) There shall be in the City of Batac: a city mayor, a city vice mayor, sangguniang panlungsod members, a secretary to the sangguniang panlungsod. a city treasurer and an assistant city treasurer, a city assessor and an assistant city assessor, a city accountant, a city budget officer, a city planning and development officer, a city engineer, a city health officer, a city civil registrar, a city administrator, a

city legal officer, a city social welfare and development officer, a city 1 2 veterinarian and a city general services officer.

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(b) In addition thereto, the city mayor may appoint a city environment and natural resources officer, a city architect, a city information officer, a city 4 cooperatives officer, a city population officer and a city agriculturist. 5

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(c) There shall be established in the City, a city fire station to be headed by a city fire marshal, a city jail to be headed by a city jail warden and 7 8 a city schools division to be headed by a city school division superintendent.

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(d) The City of Batac may:

(1) Maintain existing offices not mentioned in subsections (a), (b) and 10 11 (c) hereof:

(2) Create such other offices as may be necessary to carry out the 12 purposes of the City; or - 13

(3) Consolidate the functions of any office with those of another in the 14 interest of efficiency and economy. 15

(e) Unless otherwise provided herein, heads of departments and offices 16 shall be appointed by the city mayor with the concurrence of the majority of 17 all the members of the sangguniang panlungsod, subject to civil service law. 18 rules and regulations. The sangguniang panlungsod shall act on the 19 20 appointment within fifteen (15) days from the day of its submission, otherwise 21 the same shall be deemed confirmed.

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ARTICLE III

THE CITY MAYOR AND CITY VICE MAYOR

24 SEC. 8. The City Mayor. - (a) The city mayor shall be the chief 25 executive of the City. He shall be elected at large by the qualified voters of the 26 City. No person shall be eligible for the position of city mayor unless at the 27 time of the election, he is at least twenty-one (21) years of age, an actual 28 resident of the City for at least one year prior to his election, and a qualified voter therein. He shall hold office for three years, unless sooner removed, and
 shall receive a minimum monthly compensation corresponding to Salary
 Grade thirty (30) as prescribed under Republic Act No. 6758, otherwise
 known as the Salary Standardization Law, and the implementing guidelines
 issued pursuant thereto.

6 The city mayor, as the chief executive of the city government. shall 7 exercise such powers and perform such duties and functions as provided 8 herein.

9 (b) For efficient, effective and economical governance, the purpose of 10 which is the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants, the city mayor 11 shall:

(1) Exercise those powers expressly granted to him by law, those
necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate or
incidental for the efficient and effective governance of the City, and those
which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare:

16 (i) Determine the guidelines of city policies and be responsible to the17 sangguniang panlungsod for the program of government:

(ii) Direct the formulation of the city development plan, with the
assistance of the city development council, and upon approval thereof by the
sangguniang panlungsod, implement the same;

(iii) Present the program of government and propose policies and projects for the consideration of the sangguniang panlungsod at the opening of the regular session of the sangguniang panlungsod every calendar year and as often as may be deemed necessary as the general welfare of the inhabitants and the needs of the city government may require;

26 (iv) Initiate and propose legislative measures to the sangguniang
 27 panlungsod and as often as may be deemed necessary, provide such

1 information and data needed or requested by said sanggunian in the 2 performance of its legislative functions;

3 (v) Appoint all officials and employees whose appointments are not
4 otherwise provided for in this Act, as well as those he may be authorized by
5 law to appoint;

6 (vi) Represent the City in all its business transactions and sign on its 7 behalf all bonds, contracts and obligations, and such other documents upon 8 authority of the sangguniang panlungsod or pursuant to law or ordinance:

9 (vii) Carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary during 10 and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;

(viii) Determine the time, manner and place of payment of salaries or
wages of the officials and employees of the City, in accordance with law or
ordinance:

(ix) Allocate and assign office space to the City and other officials and
employees who, by law or ordinance, are entitled to such space in the city hall
and other buildings owned or leased by the city government;

(x) Ensure that all executive officials and employees of the City
faithfully discharge their duties and functions as provided by law and this Act,
and cause to be instituted administrative or judicial proceedings against any
official or employee of the City who may have committed an offense in the
performance of his official duties;

(xi) Examine the books, records and other documents of all offices, officials, agents or employees of the City and, in aid of his executive powers and authority, require all national officials and employees stationed in or assigned to the City to make available to him such books, records and other documents in their custody except those classified by law as confidential:

27 (xii) Furnish copies of executive orders issued by him to the Office of
28 the President and the Office of the Secretary of the Department of the Interior

1 and Local Government (DILG) within seventy-two (72) hours after their 2 issuance;

3 (xiii) Visit component barangays of the City at least once every six 4 months to deepen his understanding of problems and conditions, listen and 5 give appropriate counsel to local officials and inhabitants of general laws and 6 ordinances which especially concern them, and otherwise conduct visits and 7 inspections to ensure that the governance of the City will improve the quality 8 of life of the inhabitants;

9 (xiv) Act on leave applications of officials and employees appointed by 10 him and the commutation of the monetary value of their leave credits in 11 accordance with law:

(xv) Authorize official trips of city officials and employees outside of
the City for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days: *Provided*, That the trips
abroad or for a longer period may be authorized in accordance with the Local
Government Code of 1991;

16 (xvi) Call upon any national official or employee stationed in or 17 assigned to the City to advise him on matters affecting the City and to make 18 recommendations thereon: coordinate with said officials and employees in the 19 formulation and implementation of plans, programs and projects: and, when 20 appropriate, initiate an administrative or judicial action against a national 21 government official or employee who may have committed an offense in the 22 performance of his official duties while stationed in or assigned to the City;

23 (xvii) Authorize payment for medical care, necessary transportation,
 24 subsistence, hospital or medical fees of city officials and employees who are
 25 injured while in the performance of their official duties and functions, subject
 26 to the availability of funds;

27 (xviii) Solemnize marriages, any provision of law to the contrary28 notwithstanding;

(xix) Conduct an annual palarong panlungsod, which shall feature
 traditional sports and disciplines included in national and international games,
 in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd); and

4 (xx) Submit to the provincial governor the following reports: (a) an 5 annual report containing a summary of all matters pertinent to the 6 management, administration, and development of the City and all information 7 and data relative to its political, social and economic conditions, and, (b) 8 supplemental reports when unexpected events and situations arise at any time 9 during the year, particularly when man-made or natural disasters or calamities 10 affect the general welfare of the City.

(2) Enforce all laws and ordinances relative to the governance of the
City and in the exercise of its appropriate corporate powers, as well as
implement all approved policies, programs, projects, services and activities of
the City; and shall:

(i) Ensure that the acts of the City's component barangays and of its
officials and employees are within the scope of their prescribed powers, duties
and functions;

(ii) Call conventions, conferences, seminars or meetings of elective or
appointive officials of the City, including national officials and employees
stationed in or assigned to the City, at such time and place and on such subject
as he may deem important for the promotion of the general welfare of the local
government unit and its inhabitants:

(iii) Issue such executive orders for the faithful and appropriate
 enforcement and execution of laws and ordinances;

25 (iv) Be entitled to carry the necessary firearms within his territorial26 jurisdiction;

(v) Act as the deputized representative of the National PoliceCommission, formulate the peace and order plan of the City and upon its

approval, implement the same; and as such exercise the general and
 operational control and supervision over the police forces in the City in
 accordance with Republic Act No. 6975, otherwise known as the Philippine
 National Police Law; and

5 (vi) Call upon the appropriate law enforcement agencies to suppress 6 disorder, riot, lawless violence, rebellion or sedition, or apprehend violators of 7 the law when public interest so requires and the city police forces are 8 inadequate to cope with the situation or the violators.

9 (3) Initiate and maximize the generation of resources, and revenues, 10 and apply the same to the implementation of development plans. program 11 objectives and priorities, particularly those resources and revenues 12 programmed for agro-industrial development and countryside growth and 13 progress; and shall:

(i) Require each head of an office or department to prepare and submit
an estimate of appropriations for the ensuing calendar year, in accordance with
the budget preparation process enshrined under Republic Act No. 7160,
otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

(ii) Prepare and submit to the sanggunian for approval the executive
and supplemental budgets of the City for the ensuing calendar year in the
manner provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991;

(iii) Ensure that all taxes and other revenues of the City are collected.
and that city funds are applied to the payment of expenses and settlement of
obligations of the City, in accordance with law or ordinance;

(iv) Issue licenses and permits and suspend or revoke the same for any
violation of the conditions upon which said licenses or permits had been
issued, pursuant to law or ordinance;

(v) Issue permits, without need of approval therefore from any nationalagency, for the holding of activities for any charitable or welfare purpose,

1 excluding prohibited games of chance or shows contrary to law, public policy 2 and public morals;

(vi) Require owners of illegally constructed houses, buildings or other 3 4 structures to obtain the necessary permit, subject to such fines and penalties as may be imposed by law or ordinance, or to make necessary changes in the .5 construction of the same when said construction violates any law or ordinance. 6 or to order the demolition or removal of said house, building or structure 7 8 within the period prescribed by law or ordinance;

(vii) Adopt adequate measures to safeguard and conserve land. 9 10 mineral, forest and other resources of the City;

(viii) Provide efficient and effective property and supply management 11 in the City and protect the funds, credits, rights and other properties of the 12 13 City: and

14 (ix) Institute or cause to be instituted administrative or judicial 15 proceedings for violation of ordinances in the collection of taxes. fees or charges, and for the recovery of funds and property: and cause the City to be 16 17 defended against all suits to ensure that its interests, resources and rights shall 18 be adequately protected.

- 19 (4) Ensure the delivery of basic services and the provision of adequate 20 facilities and, in addition thereto, shall:
- 21 (i) Ensure that the construction and repair of roads and highways 22 funded by the national government shall be, as far as practicable, carried out in 23 a spatially contiguous manner and in coordination with the construction and 24 repair of the roads and bridges of the City; and

25 (ii) Coordinate the implementation of technical services, including 26 public works and infrastructure programs, rendered by national offices.

(5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
 powers, as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, and those
 that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

4 (6) During his incumbency, the city mayor shall hold office in the city 5 hall.

6 SEC. 9. The City Vice Mayor. – There shall be a city vice mayor who 7 shall be elected in the same manner as the city mayor and shall at the time of 8 his election, possess the same qualifications as the city mayor. He shall hold 9 office for three years, unless sooner removed, and shall receive a monthly 10 compensation corresponding to Salary Grade twenty-six (26) as prescribed 11 under the Salary Standardization Law and the implementing guidelines issued 12 pursuant thereto.

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The city vice mayor shall:

(1) Be the presiding officer of the sangguniang panlungsod and sign all
warrants drawn on the city treasury for all expenditures appropriated for the
operation of the sangguniang panlungsod;

(2) Subject to civil service law, rules and regulations, appoint all
officials and employees of the sangguniang panlungsod, except those whose
manner of appointment is specifically provided for under existing laws:

20 (3) Assume the office of the city mayor for the unexpired term of the21 latter in the event of permanent vacancy;

(4) Exercise the powers and perform the duties and functions of thecity mayor in cases of temporary vacancy; and

(5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
powers as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, and those
that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

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ARTICLE IV

THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD

3 SEC. 10. The Sangguniang Panlungsod. - (a) The sangguniang 4 panlungsod, the legislative body of the City, shall be composed of the city vice 5 mayor as the presiding officer, the regular sanggunian members, the president 6 of the city chapter of the liga ng mga barangay, the president of the 7 panlungsod na pederasyon ng mga sangguniang kabataan and the sectoral 8 representatives, as members.

(b) In addition thereto, there shall be three sectoral representatives: one 9 from the women; and, as shall be determined by the sangguniang panlungsod 10 11 within ninety (90) days prior to the holding of the local elections, one from the agricultural or industrial workers; and one from the other sectors, including the 12. 13 urban poor or disabled persons.

(c) The regular members of the sangguniang panlungsod and the 14 15 sectoral representatives shall be elected in the manner as may be provided for 16 by law.

SEC. 11. Powers. Duties, Functions and Compensation. - (a) The 17 sangguniang panlungsod, as the legislative body of the City, shall enact 18 19 ordinances, approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants pursuant to Section 16 of the Local Government 20 21 Code and in the proper exercise of the corporate powers of the City as 22 provided for under Section 22 of the Local Government Code, and shall:

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(1) Approve ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an efficient and effective city government, and in this connection, shall: 24

(i) Review all ordinances approved by the sangguniang barangay and 25 executive orders issued by the punong barangay to determine whether these 26 are within the scope of the prescribed powers of the sanggunian and of the 27 28 punong barangay;

(ii) Maintain peace and order by enacting measures to prevent and
 suppress lawlessness, disorder. riot, violence, rebellion or sedition and impose
 penalties for the violation of said ordinance:

4 (iii) Approve ordinances imposing a fine not exceeding Five thousand
5 pesos (P5.000.00) or an imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or
6 both, at the discretion of the court, for violation of a city ordinance;

7 (iv) Adopt measures to protect the inhabitants of the City from the 8 harmful effects of man-made or natural disasters and calamities and to provide 9 relief services and assistance for victims during and in the aftermath of said 10 disasters or calamities and in their return to productive livelihood following 11 said events;

12 (v) Enact ordinances intended to prevent, suppress and impose appropriate penalties for habitual drunkenness in public places, vagrancy, 13 mendicancy, prostitution, the establishment and maintenance of houses of ill-14 repute, gambling and other prohibited games of chance. fraudulent devices and 15 16 ways to obtain money or property, drug addiction, maintenance of drug dens, 17 drug pushing, juvenile delinquency, the printing, distribution or exhibition of 18 obscene or pornographic materials or publications, and such other activities inimical to the welfare and morals of the inhabitants of the City; 19

20(vi) Protect the environment. To this end, it may set aside at least ten percent (10%) of its development funds for the purpose of maintaining and 21 enhancing ecological balance of the City. It may also impose appropriate 22 23 penalties for acts which endanger the environment, such as dynamite fishing and other forms of destructive fishing, illegal logging, smuggling of logs, 24 25 smuggling of natural resources products and of endangered species of flora and fauna, slash-and-burn farming and such other activities which result in 26 pollution, acceleration of eutrophication of rivers and lakes or of ecological 27 imbalance: 28

(vii) Subject to the provision of the Local Government Code and
 pertinent laws, determine the powers and duties of officials and employees of
 the City;

4 (viii) Determine the positions and the salaries, wages, allowances and 5 other emoluments and benefits of officials and employees paid wholly or 6 mainly from city funds and provide for expenditures necessary for the proper 7 conduct of programs, projects, services and activities of the city government;

8 (ix) Authorize the payment of compensation to a qualified person not 9 in the government service who fills up a temporary vacancy in a concurrent 10 capacity at the rate authorized by law;

11 (x) Provide a mechanism and the appropriate funds therefor, to ensure 12 the safety and protection of all city government property, public documents or 13 records such as those relating to property inventory, land ownership, record of 14 births, marriages, deaths, assessments, taxation, accounts, business permits and 15 such other records and documents of public interest in the offices and 16 departments of the city government;

(xi) When the finances of the city government allow, provide for
additional allowances and other benefits to judges, prosecutors, public
elementary and high school teachers, and other national government officials
stationed in or assigned to the City;

(xii) Provide legal assistance to barangay officials who. in the
 performance of their official duties or on the occasion thereof, have to initiate
 judicial proceedings or defend themselves against legal actions; and

(xiii) Provide for group insurance or additional insurance coverage for
all barangay officials, including members of barangay tanod brigades and
other service units, with public or private insurance companies, when the
finances of the city government allow said coverage.

1 (2) Generate and maximize the use of resources and revenues for the 2 development plans. program objectives and priorities of the City, with 3 particular attention to agro-industrial development and city-wide growth and 4 progress:

5 (i) Approve the annual and supplemental budgets of the city 6 government and appropriate funds for specific programs, projects, services 7 and activities of the City, or for other purposes not contrary to law, in order to 8 promote the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants:

9 (ii) Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code 10 and the applicable laws, and upon the majority vote of all the members of the 11 sangguniang panlungsod, enact ordinances levying taxes, fees and charges, 12 prescribing the rates thereof for general and specific purposes, and granting 13 tax exemption, incentive or relief;

(iii) Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code
and upon the majority vote of all the members of the sangguniang panlungsod.
authorize the city mayor to negotiate and contract loans and other forms of
mdebtedness:

(iv) Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code
and applicable laws, and upon the majority vote of all the members of the
sangguniang panlungsod, enact ordinances authorizing the floating of bonds or
other instruments of indebtedness, for the purpose of raising funds to finance
development projects;

(v) Appropriate funds for the construction and maintenance or the
rental of buildings for the use of the City and, upon the majority vote of all the
members of the sangguniang panlungsod, authorize the city mayor to lease to
private parties such public buildings held in a proprietary capacity, subject to
existing laws, rules and regulations;

(vi) Prescribe reasonable limits and restraints on the use of property ł 2 within the jurisdiction of the City;

(vii) Adopt a comprehensive land-use plan for the City and that the 3 4 formulation, adoption or modification of said plan shall be in coordination 5 within the approved provincial comprehensive land-use plan:

6 (viii) Reclassify lands within the jurisdiction of the City, subject to the pertinent provisions of the Local Government Code: 7

8 (ix) Enact integrated zoning ordinances in consonance with the 9 approved comprehensive land-use plan, subject to existing laws, rules and regulations: establish fire limits or zones, particularly in populous centers: and 10 regulate the construction, repair or modification of buildings within said fire 11 limits or zones in accordance with the provisions of the Fire Code: 12

13 (x). Subject to national law, process and approve subdivision plans for residential, commercial or industrial purposes and other development 14 15 purposes, and to collect processing fees and other charges, the proceeds of 16 which shall accrue entirely to the City: Provided however, That where approval of a national agency or office is required, said approval shall not be 17 18 withheld for more than thirty (30) days from receipt of the application Failure 19 to act on the application within the period stated above shall be deemed as 20 approval thereof;

(xi) With the concurrence of at least two-thirds (2/3) of all the 21 members of the sangguniang panlungsod, grant tax exemptions, incentives or 22 23 reliefs to entities engaged in community growth-inducing industries, subject to the provisions of the Local Government Code; 24

25 (xii) Grant loans or provide grants to other local government units or to national, provincial and city charitable, benevolent or educational institutions: 26 27 *Provided*. That said institutions are operated and maintained within the City;

1 (xiii) Regulate the numbering of residential, commercial and other 2 buildings; and

3 (xiv) Regulate the inspection, weighing and measuring of articles of
 4 commerce.

5 (3) Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government 6 Code, enact ordinances granting franchises and authorizing the issuance of 7 permits or licenses, upon such conditions and for such purposes intended to 8 promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and, pursuant to this 9 legislative authority, shall:

(i) Fix and impose reasonable fees and charges for all services
 rendered by the city government to private persons or entities;

(ii) Regulate or fix license fees for any business or practice of
profession within the City and the conditions under which the license for said
business or practice of profession may be revoked and enact ordinances
levying taxes thereon;

(iii) Provide for and set the terms and conditions under which public
utilities owned by the City shall be operated by the city government, and
prescribe the conditions under which the same may be leased to private
persons or entities, preferably cooperatives:

20 (iv) Regulate the display of and fix the license fees for signs.
21 signboards or billboards at the place or places where the profession or
22 business advertised thereby is, in whole or in part, conducted;

(v) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, authorize and license the
 establishment, operation and maintenance of cockpits, and regulate
 cockfighting and commercial breeding of gamecocks: *Provided*, That existing
 rights should not be prejudiced;

(vi) Subject to the guidelines prescribed by the Department ofTransportation and Communications, regulate the operation of tricycles and

1 grant franchises for the operation thereof within the territorial jurisdiction of 2 the City; and

3 (vii) Upon approval by a majority vote of all the members of the 4 sangguniang panlungsod, grant a franchise to any person, partnership, 5 corporation or cooperative to do business within the City: establish, construct, 6 operate and maintain ferries. wharves, markets or slaughterhouses; or 7 undertake such other activities within the City as may be allowed by existing 8 laws: *Provided*. That cooperatives shall be given preference in the grant of 9 such franchise.

(4) Regulate activities, relative to the use of land, buildings and
structures within the City in order to promote the general welfage and, for said
purpose, shall:

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(i) Declare, prevent or abate any nuisance;

(ii) With the concurrence of a majority of the members of the
sangguniang panlungsod, a quorum being present, deny the entry of legalized
gambling by ordinance into any part of the City or regulate its location in the
City ;

18 (iii) Require that buildings and the premises thereof and any land within 19 the City be kept and maintained in a sanitary condition: impose penalties for 20 any violation thereof: or, upon failure to comply with said requirement, have 21 the work done at the expense of the owner, administrator or tenant concerned: 22 or require the filling up of any lands or premises to a grade necessary for 23 proper sanitation;

24 (iv) Regulate the disposal of clinical and other wastes from hospitals.25 clinics and other similar establishments;

(v) Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of cafes.
 restaurants, beerhouses, hotels, motels, inns, pension houses, lodging houses
 and other similar establishments, including tourist guides and transports;

(vi) Regulate the sale, giving away or dispensing of any intoxicating
 malt, vino, mixed or fermented liquors at any retail outlets;

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3 (vii) Regulate the establishment and provide for the inspection of
4 steam boilers or any heating device in buildings and the storage of
5 inflammable and highly combustible materials within the City;

6 (viii) Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of any 7 entertainment or amusement facilities, including the theatrical performances, circuses, billiard pools, public dancing schools, public dance halls. sauna 8 9 baths, massage parlors and other places for entertainment or amusement; regulate such other events or activities for amusement or entertainment, 10 particularly those which tend to disturb the community or annoy the 11 12 inhabitants, or require the suspension or suppression of the same; or prohibit certain forms of amusement or entertainment in order to protect the social and 13 moral welfare of the community; 14

(ix) Provide for the impounding of stray animals: regulate the keeping
of animals in homes or as part of a business, and the slaughter. sale or
disposition of the same; and adopt measures to prevent and penalize cruelty to
animals; and

19 (x) Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of funeral
20 parlors and the burial or cremation of the dead, subject to existing laws, rules
21 and regulations.

(5) Approve ordinances which shall ensure the efficient and effective
 delivery of the basic services and facilities as provided for under the Local
 Government Code and, in addition to said services and facilities, shall:

(i) Provide for the establishment, maintenance, protection and
 conservation of tree parks and greenbelts;

(ii) Establish markets, slaughterhouses or animal corrals and authorizethe operation thereof by the city government; and regulate the construction and

operation of private markets, talipapas or other similar buildings and 1 2 structures:

- 3 (iii) Authorize the establishment, maintenance and operation by the city government of ferries, wharves, and/or other structures intended to accelerate 4 productivity related to marine life in the preservation thereof; 5
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(iv) Regulate the preparation and sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, 7 fruits, fresh dairy products and other foodstuffs for public consumption:

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(v) Regulate the use of streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, 9 parks and other public places and approve the construction, improvement, 10 repair and maintenance of the same; establish bus and vehicle stops and terminals or regulate the use of the same by privately-owned vehicles which 11 12 serve the public; regulate garages and operation of conveyances for hire; 13 designate stands to be occupied by public vehicles when not in use; regulate 14 the putting up of signs, signposts, awnings and awning posts on the streets; and 15 provide for the lighting, cleaning and sprinkling of streets and public places;

16 (vi) Regulate traffic on all streets and bridges, prohibit encroachments 17 or obstacles thereon and, when necessary in the interest of public welfare, authorize the removal of encroachments and illegal constructions in public 18 19 places:

20 (vii) Subject to existing laws, establish and provide for the maintenance, repair and operation of an efficient waterworks system to supply 21 22 water for the inhabitants and to purify the source of the water supply; regulate the construction, maintenance, repair and use of hydrants, pumps, cisterns and 23 reservoirs; protect the purity and quantity of the water supply of the City and, 24 25 for this purpose, extend the coverage of appropriate ordinances over all 26 territory within the drainage area of said water supply and within one hundred meters (100 m.) of the reservoir, canal, conduit, aqueduct, pumping station or 27

watershed used in connection with the water service; and regulate the
 consumption, use or wastage of water and fix and collect charges therefor;

3 (viii) Regulate the drilling and excavation of the ground for the laying of water, gas, sewer and other pipes and the construction, repair and 4 5 maintenance of public drains, sewers, cesspools, tunnels and similar structures; 6 regulate the placing of poles and the use of crosswalks, curbs and gutters; 7 adopt measures to ensure public safety against open canals, manholes, live 8 wires and other similar hazards to life and property; and regulate the 9 construction and use of private water closets, privies and other similar 10 structures in buildings and homes:

(ix) Regulate the placing, stringing, attaching, installing, repair and
construction of all gas mains, electric telegraph and telephone wires, conduits,
meters and other apparatus; and provide for the correction, condemnation or
removal of the same when found to be dangerous to the welfare of the
inhabitants;

16 (λ) Subject to the availability of funds and the existing laws, rules and 17 regulations, establish and provide for the operation of vocational and technical 18 schools and similar post-secondary institutions and, with the approval of the 19 DepEd and subject to existing laws on tuition fees, fix and collect reasonable 20 tuition fees and other school charges in educational institutions supported by 21 the city government;

(xi) Establish a scholarship fund for the poor but deserving students
in schools located within its jurisdiction or for students residing within the
City;

(xii) Approve measures and adopt quarantine regulations to prevent
 the introduction and spread of diseases;

(xiii) Provide for an efficient and effective system of solid waste and
 garbage collection and disposal and prohibit littering and the placing or
 throwing of garbage, refuse and other filth and wastes:

4 (xiv) Provide for the care of disabled persons, paupers, the aged, the 5 sick, persons of unsound mind, abandoned minors, juvenile delinquents, drug 6 dependents, abused children and other youth below eighteen (18) years of age, 7 and subject to the availability of funds, establish and provide for the operation 8 of centers and facilities for the said needy and disadvantaged persons:

9 (xv) Establish and provide for the maintenance and improvement of 10 jails and detention centers, institute a sound jail management program and 11 appropriate funds for the subsistence of detainees and convicted prisoners in 12 the City;

(xvi) Establish a city council whose purpose is the promotion of
culture and the arts, coordinate with government agencies and
nongovernmental organizations and, subject to the availability of funds,
appropriate funds for the support and development of the same; and

17 (xvii) Establish a city council for the elderly and senior citizens which 18 shall formulate policies and adopt measures mutually beneficial to the elderly 19 and to the community; provide incentives for nongovernmental agencies and 20 entities and, subject to the availability of funds, appropriate funds to support 21 programs and projects for the benefit of the elderly.

(6) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
powers as provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, and those
that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

(7) The members of the sangguniang panlungsod of the City of Batac
 shall receive a minimum monthly compensation corresponding to Salary
 Grade twenty-five (25) as prescribed under the Salary Standardization Law
 and the implementing guidelines issued pursuant thereto.

2	PROCESS OF LEGISLATION
3	SEC. 12. Internal Rules of Procedure (a) On the first regular session
4	following the election of its members and within ninety (90) days thereafter,
5	the sangguniang panlungsod shall adopt or update its existing rules of
6	procedure.
7	(b) The rules of procedure shall provide for the following:
8	(1) The organization of the sanggunian and the election of its officers
9	as well as the creation of standing committees which shall include, but shall
10 -	not be limited to. the committees on appropriations, revenues. engineering and
11	public works. education and health, women and family, human rights. youth
12	and sports development, environmental protection, peace and order and traffic,
13	and cooperatives: the general jurisdiction of each committee: and the election
14	of the chairman and members of each committee;
15	(2) The order and calendar of business for each session;
16	(3) The legislative process;
17	(4) The parliamentary procedures which include the conduct of
18	members during sessions:

(5) The discipline of members for disorderly behavior and absences without justifiable cause for four consecutive sessions for which they may be censured, reprimanded or excluded from the session. suspended for not more than sixty (60) days, or expelled: Provided, That the penalty of suspension or expulsion shall require the concurrence of at least two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the sanggunian members: Provided, further, That the member convicted by final judgment to imprisonment of at least one year for any crime involving moral turpitude shall be automatically expelled from the sanggunian: and

(6) Such other rules as the sanggunian may adopt.

SEC. 13. Full Disclosure of Financial and Business Interests of 1 2 Sangguniang Panlungsod Members. - (a) Every sangguniang panlungsod member shall, upon assumption to office, make a full disclosure of his 3 business and financial interests. He shall also disclose any business, financial. 4 5 professional relationship or any relation by affinity or consanguinity within the fourth civil degree, which he may have with any person, firm or entity affected 6 by any ordinance or resolution under consideration by the sanggunian of which 7 he is a member, which relationship may result in conflict of interests. Such 8 9 relationship shall include.

10

(1) Ownership of stock or capital, or investment in the entity or firm to which the ordinance or resolution may apply; and 11

12 13

(2) Contracts or agreements with any person or entity which the ordinance or resolution under consideration may affect.

In the absence of a specific constitutional or statutory provision 14 applicable to this situation, "conflict of interest" refers in general to one where 15 16 it may be reasonably deduced that a member of a sanggunian may not act in the public interest due to some private, pecuniary or other personal 17 considerations that may tend to affect his judgment to the prejudice of the 18 19 service or the public.

(b) The disclosure required under this Act shall be made in writing and 20 submitted to the secretary of the sanggunian or the secretary of the committee 21 of which he is a member. The disclosure shall, in all cases, form part of the 22 23 record of the proceedings and shall be made in the following manner:

(1) Disclosure shall be made before the member participates in the 24 deliberations on the ordinance or resolution under consideration: Provided, 25 That if the member did not participate during the deliberations, the disclosure 26 shall be made before voting on the ordinance or resolution on second and third 27

readings; and 28

1 (2) Disclosure shall be made when a member takes a position or makes 2 a privilege speech on a matter that may affect the business interest, financial 3 connection or professional relationship described herein.

4 SEC. 14. Sessions. - (a) On the first day of the session immediately 5 following the election of its members, the sangguniang panlungsod shall, by 6 resolution, fix the day, time and place of its sessions. The minimum number of 7 regular sessions shall be once a week for the sangguniang panlungsod, and 8 twice a month for the sangguniang barangay.

9 (b) When the public interest so demands, special sessions may be 10 called by the city mayor or by a majority of the members of the sanggunian.

(c) All sanggunian sessions shall be open to the public unless a closeddoor session is ordered by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
present, there being a quorum, in the public interest or for reasons of security,
decency or morality. No two sessions, regular or special, may be held in a
single day.

(d) In the case of special sessions of the sanggunian, a written notice to
the members shall be served personally at the members' usual place of
residence at least twenty-four (24) hours before the special session is held.

Unless concurred in by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the sanggunian
members present, there being a quorum, no other matters may be considered at
a special session except those stated in the notice.

(e) The sangguniang panlungsod shall keep a journal and record of its
 proceedings, which may be published upon resolution of the majority of its
 members.

SEC. 15. Quorum. ~ (a) A majority of all the members of the
 sanggunian who have been elected and qualified shall constitute a quorum to
 transact official business. Should a question of quorum be raised during a

session, the presiding officer shall immediately proceed to call the roll of the
members and thereafter announce the results.

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3 (b) Where there is no quorum, the presiding officer may declare a 4 recess until such time a quorum is constituted, or a majority of the members 5 present may adjourn from day to day and may compel the immediate 6 attendance of any member absent without justifiable cause by designating a 7 member of the sanggunian, to be assisted by a member or members of the 8 police force assigned in the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Batac, to 9 arrest the absent member and present him at the session.

(c) If there is still no quorum despite the enforcement of the
immediately preceding subsection, no business shall be transacted. The
presiding officer, upon proper motion duly approved by the members present.
shall then declare the session adjourned for lack of quorum.

14 SEC. 16. Approval of Ordinances. - (a) Every ordinance enacted by 15 the sangguniang panlungsod shall be presented to the city mayor. If the city 16 mayor approves the same, he shall affix his signature on each and every page 17 thereof; otherwise, he shall veto it and return the same with his objections to 18 the sanggunian, which may proceed to reconsider the same. The sanggunian 19 may override the veto of the city mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all its 20 members, thereby making the ordinance or resolution effective for all legal 21 intents and purposes.

(b) The veto shall be communicated by the city mayor to the
sanggunian within ten (10) days; otherwise, the ordinance shall be deemed
approved as if he had signed it.

SEC. 17. Veto Power of the City Mayor. - (a) The city mayor may veto
 any ordinance of the sangguniang panlungsod on the ground that it is ultra
 vires or prejudicial to the public welfare, stating his reasons thereof in writing.

(b) The city mayor shall have the power to veto any particular item or ł items of an appropriations ordinance, an ordinance or resolution adopting a 2 local development plan, any public investment program or an ordinance 3 directing the payment of money or creating liability. In such case, the veto 4 5 shall not affect the item or items which are not objected to. The vetoed item or items shall not take effect unless the sangguniang panlungsod overrides the 6 veto in the manner herein provided; otherwise, the item or items in the 7 appropriations ordinance of the previous year corresponding to those vetoed, 8 9 if any, shall be deemed enacted.

10 (c) The city mayor may veto an ordinance or resolution only once. The 11 sanggunian may override the veto of the city mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote of 12 all its members, thereby making the ordinance effective even without the 13 approval of the city mayor.

14 SEC. 18. Review of City Ordinances by the Sangguniang 15 Panlalawigan. – (a) Within three days after approval, the secretary to the 16 sangguniang panlungsod shall forward to the sangguniang panlalawigan for 17 review, copies of approved ordinances and the resolutions approving the local 18 development plans and public investment programs formulated by the local 19 development councils.

(b) Within thirty (30) days after receipt of copies of such ordinances 20 2 E and resolutions, the sangguniang panlalawigan shall examine the documents or 22 transmit them to the provincial attorney or the provincial prosecutor for 23 prompt examination. The provincial attorney or the provincial prosecutor shall, within a period of ten (10) days from the receipt of the documents. 24 25 inform the sangguniang panlalawigan in writing of his comments or recommendations, which may be considered by the sangguniang panlalawigan 26 in making its decision. 27

1 (c) If the sangguniang panlalawigan finds that such an ordinance or 2 resolution is beyond the power conferred upon the sangguniang panlungsod 3 concerned, it shall declare such ordinance or resolution invalid in whole or in 4 part. The sangguniang panlalawigan shall enter its action in the minutes and 5 shall advise the corresponding city authorities of the action it has taken.

6 (c) If no action has been taken by the sangguniang panlalawigan within 7 thirty (30) days after submission of such an ordinance or resolution, the same 8 shall be presumed consistent with law and therefore valid.

9 SEC. 19. Review of Barangay Ordinances by the Sangguniang 10 Panlungsod. - (a) Within ten (10) days after its enactment, the sangguniang 11 barangay shall furnish copies of all barangay ordinances to the sangguniang 12 panlungsod for review as to whether the ordinance is consistent with law and 13 city ordinances.

(b) If the sangguniang panlungsod fails to take action on barangay
ordinances within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, the same shall be
deemed approved.

(c) If the sangguniang panlungsod finds the barangay ordinances inconsistent with law or city ordinances, the sangguniang panlungsod shall, within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, return the same with its comments and recommendations to the sangguniang barangay concerned for adjustment, amendment or modification: in which case, the effectivity of the barangay ordinance is suspended until such time as the revision called for is effected.

SEC. 20. Enforcement of Disapproved Ordinances or Resolutions. – Any attempt to enforce any ordinance or any resolution approving the local development plan and the public investment program after the disapproval thereof, shall be sufficient ground for the suspension or dismissal of the official or employee concerned. 1 SEC. 21. Effectivity of Ordinances or Resolutions. - (a) Unless 2 otherwise stated in the ordinance or the resolution approving the local 3 development plan and the public investment program, the same shall take 4 effect after ten (10) days from the date a copy thereof is posted in a bulletin 5 board at the entrance of the City Hall of Batac, and in at least two other 6 conspicuous places in the City of Batac not later than five days after approval 7 thereof.

8 (b) The secretary to the sangguniang panlungsod shall cause the 9 posting of an ordinance or resolution in the bulletin board at the entrance of 10 the city hall in at least two conspicuous places not later than five days after 11 approval thereof.

12 The text of the ordinance or resolution shall be disseminated and posted 13 in Filipino or English and the secretary of the sangguniang panlungsod shall 14 record such fact in a book kept for the purpose, stating the dates of approval 15 and posting.

16 (c) The main features of the ordinance or resolution duly enacted or 17 adopted shall, in addition to being posted, be published once in a local 18 newspaper of general circulation within the City: *Provided*, That in the 19 absence thereof, the ordinance or resolution shall be published in any 20 newspaper of general circulation: *Provided*. *further*. That the gist of all 21 ordinances with penal sanctions shall also be published in a newspaper of 22 general circulation.

DISQUALIFICATION AND SUCCESSION OF ELECTIVE CITY OFFICIALS

ARTICLE VI

SEC. 22. Disqualifications of Elective Public City Officials. - The
 following persons are disqualified from running for any elective position in the
 City:

(a) Those sentenced by final judgment for an offense involving moral ł turpitude or an offense punishable by one year or more of imprisonment, 2 within two years after serving sentence: 3

4

(b) Those removed from office as a result of an administrative case:

7

(c) Those convicted by final judgment for violating the oath of 5 6 allegiance to the Republic of the Philippines:

(d) Those with dual citizenship;

(e) Fugitives from justice in criminal or nonpolitical cases here and 8 9 abroad.

(f) Permanent residents in a foreign country or those who have 10 . 11 acquired the right to reside abroad and continue to avail of the same right after the effectivity of the Local Government Code; and 12

13

(g) The insane or feeble-minded.

SEC. 23. Permanent Vacancy in the Office of the City Mayor and the 14 15 City Vice Movor. - (a) If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the city 16 mayor, the city vice mayor concerned shall become the city mayor. If a 17 permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the city vice mayor, the highest 18 ranking sangguniang panlungsod member or, in case of his permanent 19 incapacity, the second highest ranking sangguniang panlungsod member shall 20 become the city mayor or city vice mayor, as the case may be. Subsequent 21 vacancies in the said offices shall be filled automatically by the other 22 sanggunian members according to their ranking as defined herein.

23

(b) A tie between or among the highest ranking sangguniang 24 panlungsod members shall be resolved by drawing of lots.

25 (c) The successors as defined herein shall serve only the unexpired 26 terms of their predecessors.

27 (d) For purposes of this Act, a permanent vacancy arises when an elective local official fills a higher vacant office, refuses to assume office, fails 28

to qualify, dies, is removed from office, voluntarily resigns or is otherwise
 permanently incapacitated to discharge the functions of his office.

3 (e) For purposes of succession as provided in this Act. ranking in the
4 sanggunian shall be determined on the basis of the proportion of votes
5 obtained by each winning candidate to the total number of registered voters in
6 the City immediately preceding local election.

SEC. 24. Permanent Vacancies in the Sanggunian. - Permanent
vacancies in the sangguniang panlungsod where automatic succession as
provided above does not apply shall be filled by appointments in the following
manner:

11

(a) The governor shall make the aforesaid appointments;

12 (b) Only the nominee of the political party under which the sanggunian 13 member concerned had been elected shall be appointed in the manner herein 14 provided. The appointee shall come from the political party as that of the 15 sanggunian member who caused the vacancy and shall serve the unexpired 16 term of the vacant office. In the appointment herein mentioned, a nomination and a certificate of membership of the appointee from the highest official of 17 18 the political party concerned are conditions sine qua non, and any appointment 19 without such nomination and certification shall be null and void *ab iniuo* and 20 shall be a ground for administrative action against the official responsible 21 therefor:

(c) In case the permanent vacancy is caused by a sanggunian member
 who does not belong to any political party, the city mayor shall, upon the
 recommendation of the sangguniang panlungsod, appoint a qualified person to
 fill the vacancy; and

26 (d) In case of vacancy in the representation of the youth and the
27 barangay in the sangguniang panlungsod, said vacancy shall be filled
28 automatically by the official next-in-rank of the organization concerned.

SEC. 25. Temporary Vacancy in the Office of the City Mayor. - (a) 1 When the city mayor is temporarily incapacitated to perform his duties for 2 3 physical or legal reasons such as, but not limited to, leave of absence, travel 4 abroad and suspension from office, the city vice mayor or the highest ranking 5 sangguniang panlungsod member shall automatically exercise the powers and 6 perform the duties and functions of the city mayor, except the power to 7 appoint, suspend or dismiss employees which can only be exercised if the 8 period of temporary incapacity exceeds thirty (30) working days.

9 (b) Said temporary incapacity shall terminate upon submission to the 10 sangguniang panlungsod of a written declaration by the city mayor that he has 11 reported back to office. In case where the temporary incapacity is due to legal 12 cause, the city mayor shall also submit necessary documents showing the said 13 legal causes no longer exist.

(c) When the city mayor is traveling within the country but outside territorial jurisdiction for a period not exceeding three consecutive days, he may designate in writing the officer-in-charge of his office. Such authorization shall specify the powers and functions that the local official concerned shall exercise in the absence of the city mayor, except the power to appoint, suspend or dismiss employees.

(d) In the event, however, that the city mayor fails or refuses to issue such authorization, the city vice mayor or the highest ranking sangguniang panlungsod member, as the case may be, shall have the right to assume the powers, duties and functions of the said office on the fourth day of absence of the city mayor, subject to the limitations provided in subsection (c) hereof.

(e) Except as provided above, the city mayor shall, in no case.
authorize any local official to assume the powers, duties and functions of the
office, other than the city vice mayor or the highest ranking member of the
sangguniang panlungsod, as the case may be.

2	THE APPOINTIVE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY
3	SEC. 26. The Secretary to the Sangguniang panlungsod (a) There
4	shall be a secretary to the sangguniang panlungsod who shall be a career
5	official with the rank and salary equal to a head of a department or office.
6	(b) No person shall be appointed secretary to the sangguniang
7	panlungsod unless he is a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of
8	Batac, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in law,

10	and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent.
11	(c) The secretary to the sangguniang panlungsod shall take charge of

15	(2) Keep the seal of the City and affix the same with his signature to all
16	ordinances, resolutions and other official acts of the sangguniang panlungsod
17	and present the same to the presiding officer for his signature;
18	(3) Forward to the city mayor. for approval, copies of ordinances
19	enacted by the sangguniang panlungsod and duly certified by the presiding
20	officer;
21	(4) Forward to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM)
22	copies of the appropriation ordinances passed by the sangguniang panlungsod
23	as provided for under Section 326, Book II of the Local Government Code;
24	(5) Forward to the sangguniang panlalawigan copies of duly approved
25	ordinances in the manner provided in Sections 56 and 57 under Book 1 of the
26	Local Government Code;

(6) Furnish, upon the request of any interested party, certified copies of 1 records of public character in his custody, upon payment to the city treasurer 2 3 of such fees as may be prescribed by ordinance;

4

(7) Record in a book kept for the purpose all ordinances and resolutions enacted or adopted by the sangguniang panlungsod, with the dates 5 6 of passage and publication thereof;

7 (8) Keep his office and all nonconfidential records therein open to the 8 public during usual business hours:

(9) Translate into the dialect used by the majority of the inhabitants, all 9 ordinances and resolutions immediately after their approval, and cause the 10 11 publication of the same together with the original version in the manner 12 provided under the Local Government Code:

(10) Take custody of the local archives, and where applicable, the local 13 14 library and annually account for the same: and

(b) The city health officer shall receive such compensation,emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

(1) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city 17 mayor, implement the same particularly those which have to do with the 18 19 management and administration-related programs and projects which the city mayor is empowered to implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is 20 empowered to provide for under the Local Government Code; 21

(2) Be in the frontline of the delivery of administrative support 22 services, particularly those related to the situations during and in the aftermath 23 24 of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;

(3) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city 25 26 mayor on all matters relative to the management and administration of the .27 City; and

1 (4) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other 2 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are 3 prescribed by law or ordinance.

(b) The city veterinarian shall receive such compensation, emoluments 12 13 and allowances as may be determined by law.

14 (c) The city veterinarian shall take charge of the office of veterinary services, and shall: 15

16 (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the sangguniang 17 panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the 18 19 provisions of adequate facilities:

20 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city 21 mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with 22 veterinary-related activities which the city mayor is empowered to implement 23 and which the sangguniang panlungsod is empowered to provide:

(3) Be in the frontline of the veterinary-related activities, such as the 24 25 outbreak of highly-contagious and deadly diseases. and in situations resulting in the depletion of animals for work and human consumption, particularly 26 those arising from and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and 27 28 calamities:

(4) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city 1 mayor on all other matters relative to veterinary services which will increase 2 the number and improve the quality of livestock, poultry and other domestic 3 4 animals used for work or human consumption; and

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(5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other 6 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are 7 prescribed by law or ordinance

SEC. 41. The City General Services Officer. - (a) The city general 8 9 services officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree on public 10 administration, business administration and management from a recognized 11 college or university, and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent. 12 13 He must have acquired experience in general services, including management of supply, property, solid waste disposal and general sanitation for at least 14 three years immediately preceding the date of his appointment. 15

empowered to provide;

3 (3) Take custody of and be accountable for all properties, real or
4 personal, owned by the City and those granted to it in the form of donation,
5 reparation, assistance and counterpart of joint projects:

- 6 (4) Be in the frontline of general services related activities, such as the 7 possible or imminent destruction or damage to records. supplies, properties 8 and structure materials or debris. particularly during and in the aftermath of 9 man-made and natural disasters and calamities:
- 10 (5) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city11 mayor on all other matters relative to general services: and

(6) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are
prescribed by law or ordinance.

- SEC. 42. The City Environment and Natural Resources Officer. (a) 15 16 The city environment and natural resources officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac, of good moral character, a holder 17 18 of a college degree preferably in environment, forestry, agriculture or any 19 other related course from a recognized college or university, and a first grade 20 civil service eligible or its equivalent. He must have acquired experience in the 21 environment and natural resources management, conservation and utilization 22 work for at least five years immediately preceding the date of his appointment.
- (b) The city environment and natural resources officer shall receivesuch compensation, emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.
- 25 (c) The city environment and natural resources officer shall take26 charge of the environment service department, and shall:
- (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the sangguniangpanlungsod and provide assistance and support to the city mayor in carrying

out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the provisions of

 provided for under Section 17 of the Local Government Code:

SEC. 43. The City Architect. - (a) The city architect must be a citizen
of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac, of good moral character and
a duly licensed architect. He must have practiced his profession for at least
five years immediately preceding the date of his appointment.

(b) The city architect shall receive such compensation. emolumentsand allowances as may be determined by law.

(c) The city architect shall take charge of the office on the architecturalplanning and design, and shall:

1 (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the sangguniang 2 panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in 3 carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the 4 provisions of adequate facilities relative to architectural planning and design:

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5 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city 6 mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with 7 architectural planning and design programs and projects which the city mayor 8 is empowered to implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is 9 empowered to provide for under the Local Government Code:

(3) Be in the frontline of the delivery of services involving
architectural planning and design, particularly those related to the redesigning
of spatial distribution of basic facilities and physical structures during and in
the aftermath of manmade and natural disasters and calamities;

14 (4) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city
15 mayor on all matters relative to architectural planning and design as it relates
16 to the total socioeconomic development of the City; and

17 (5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
18 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are
19 prescribed by law and ordinance.

20 SEC. 44. The City Information Officer - (a) The city information 21 officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac, of 22 good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in journalism, 23 mass communication or any related course from a recognized college or 24 university, and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent. He must 25 have experience in writing articles and research papers, or writing for print, 26 television or broadcast media for at least five years immediately preceding the 27 date of his appointment.

(b) The city information officer shall receive such compensation. I 2 emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

(c) The city information officer shall take charge of the city 3 information and community relations department, and shall: 4

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(1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the sangguniang 6 panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in providing the information and research data required for the delivery of basic 7 services and the provisions of adequate facilities so that the public becomes 8 9 aware of said services and may fully avail of the same;

10 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with public 11 12 information and research data to support programs and projects which the city 13 mayor is empowered to implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is 14 empowered to provide;

(3) Be in the frontline in providing information during and in the 15 aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities, with special 16 17 attention to the victims thereof, to help minimize injuries and casualties during and after the emergency, and to accelerate relief and rehabilitation: 18

(4) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city 19 mayor on all matters relative to public information and research data as it 20 21 relates to the total socioeconomic development of the City; and

22 (5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are 23 24 prescribed by law or ordinance.

SEC. 45. The City Cooperatives Officer. - (a) The city cooperatives 25 officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac. of. 26 27 good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in business 28 administration with special training on cooperatives or any related course from

1 a recognized college or university, and a first grade civil service eligible or its 2 equivalent. He must have experience in cooperatives organization and 3 management for at least five years immediately preceding the date of his 4 appointment.

5 (b) The city cooperatives officer shall receive such compensation,
6 emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

7 (c) The city cooperatives officer shall take charge of the office for the 8 development of cooperatives, and shall:

9 (1) Formulate measures for consideration of the sangguniang 10 panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in 11 carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the 12 provisions of facilities through the development of cooperatives and in 13 providing access to such services and facilities:

14 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city 15 mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with the 16 integration of cooperative principles and methods in programs which the city 17 mayor is empowered to implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is 18 empowered to provide:

(3) Be in the frontline of cooperative organization, rehabilitation or
viability enhancement, particularly during and in the aftermath of man-made
and natural disasters and calamities, to aid in their survival and, if necessary,
subsequent rehabilitation;

(4) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city
 mayor on all other matters relative to cooperatives development and viability
 enhancement which will improve the livelihood and the quality of life of the
 inhabitants; and

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1 (5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other 2 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are 3 prescribed by law or ordinance.

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4 SEC. 46. The City Population Officer - (a) The city population officer 5 must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of Batac, of good 6 moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably with specialized 7 training in population development from a recognized college or university. 8 and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent. He must have 9 experience in the implementation of programs or population development or 10 responsible parenthood for at least five years immediately preceding the date 11 of his appointment.

12 13 (b) The city population officer shall receive such compensation. emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

14 (c) The city population officer shall take charge of the office of the15 population development, and shall:

16 (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the sangguniang 17 panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in 18 carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the 19 provisions of adequate facilities relative to the integration of population 20 development principles and in providing access to said services and facilities:

(2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with the integration of population development principles and methods in programs and projects which the city mayor is empowered to implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is empowered to provide; and

26 (3) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
27 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are
28 prescribed by law or ordinance.

1 SEC. 47. The City Agriculturist. – (a) The city agriculturist must be a 2 citizen of the Philippines. a resident of the City of Batac. of good moral 3 character, a holder of a college degree preferably in agriculture or any other 4 related course from a recognized college or university, and a first grade civil 5 service eligible or its equivalent. He must have practiced his profession in 6 agriculture or acquired the experience in a related field for at least five years 7 immediately preceding the date of his appointment.

8 (b) The city agriculturist shall receive such compensation, emoluments9 and allowances as may be determined by law.

10 (c) The city agriculturist shall take charge of the office for theagricultural services, and shall:

(1) Formulate measures for the approval of the sangguniang
panlungsod and provide technical assistance and support to the city mayor in
carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and the
provisions of adequate facilities relative to agricultural services;

16 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the city 17 mayor, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with 18 agricultural programs and projects which the city mayor is empowered to 19 implement and which the sangguniang panlungsod is empowered to provide:

20 (3) In addition to the foregoing duties and functions, the city21 agriculturist shall:

(i) Ensure that maximum assistance and access to resources in the
 production, processing and marketing of agricultural and aquacultural and
 marine products are extended to farmers, fishermen and local entrepreneurs;

(ii) Conduct or cause to be considered location-specific agricultural
 researches and assist in making available the appropriate technology arising
 out of and disseminating information on basic research on crops, prevention

and control of plant diseases and pests, and other agricultural matters which
 will maximize productivity;

- 3 (iii) Assist the city mayor in the establishment and extension services of
 4 demonstration farms or aquaculture and marine products;
- 5 (iv) Enforce rules and regulations relating to agriculture and 6 aquaculture; and

7 (e) Coordinate with government agencies and nongovernmental
8 organizations which promote agricultural productivity through appropriate
9 technology compatible with environmental integrity.

- (4) Be in the frontline of the delivery of basic agricultural services.
 particularly those needed for the survival of the inhabitants during and in the
 aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;
- (5) Recommend to the sangguniang panlungsod and advise the city
 mayor on all other matters related to agriculture and aquaculture which will
 improve the livelihood and living conditions of the inhabitants: and

16 (6) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other
17 powers as provided for under the Local Government Code, and those that are
18 prescribed by law or ordinance.

19 ARTICLE IX THE CITY FIRE STATION SERVICE, THE CITY JAIL SERVICE, 20 21 THE CITY SCHOOLS DIVISION AND THE CITY PROSECUTION SERVICE 22 SEC. 48. The City Fire Station Service. - (a) There shall be established in the City at least one fire station with adequate personnel, fire 23 fighting facilities and equipment, subject to the standards, rules and 24 regulations that may be promulgated by the DILG. The City shall provide the 25 necessary land or site of the station. 26

(b) The city fire station shall be responsible for the provision ofvarious emergency services such as the rescue and evacuation of injured

people at fire-related incidents and, in general, all fire prevention and
 suppression measures to secure the safety of life and property of the citizenry.

3 SEC. 49. *The City Jail Service*. – (a) There shall be established and 4 maintained in the City a secured, clean, adequately equipped and sanitary jail 5 for the custody and safekeeping of prisoners, any fugitive from justice, or 6 person detained awaiting investigation or trial and/or violent mentally ill 7 person who endangers himself or the safety of others, duly certified as such by 8 the proper medical health officer, pending the transfer to a mental institution.

9 (b) The city jail service shall be headed by a city jail warden who must 10 be a graduate of a four-year course in psychology, psychiatry, sociology, 11 nursing, social work or criminology who shall assist in the immediate 12 rehabilitation of individuals or detention of prisoners. Great care must be 13 exercised so that human rights of these prisoners are respected and protected, 14 and their spiritual and physical well-being are properly and promptly attended 15 to.

SEC. 50. The City Schools Division. - (a) There shall be established
and maintained by the DepEd a city school division of the City of Batac whose
area of jurisdiction will cover all the school districts within the City.

19 (b) The city school division shall be headed by a division
20 superintendent who must possess the necessary qualifications required by the
21 DepEd.

SEC. 51. *The City Prosecution Service.* – (a) There shall be established in the City of Batac a prosecution service to be headed by a city prosecutor and such number of assistant prosecutors as may be necessary, who shall be organizationally part of the DOJ, and under the supervision and control of the Secretary of Justice and whose qualifications, manner of appointment, rank, salary and benefits shall be governed by existing laws covering prosecutors in the DOJ. 1 (b) The city prosecutor shall handle the criminal prosecution in the 2 municipal trial courts in the City of Batac as well as in the regional trial courts 3 for criminal cases originating in the territory of the City, and shall render to or 4 for the City such services as are required by law, ordinance or regulation of the 5 DOJ.

6 The Secretary of Justice shall always ensure the adequacy and quality 7 of prosecution service in the City of Batac and for this purpose, shall, in the 8 absence or lack or insufficiency in number of city assistant prosecutors as 9 provided hereinabove, designate from among the assistant provincial 10 prosecutors a sufficient number to perform and discharge the functions of the 11 city prosecution service as provided hereinabove.

ARTICLE X

TRANSITORY AND FINAL PROVISIONS

14 SEC. 52. Municipal Ordinances Existing at the Time of the Approval 15 of this Act. – All municipal ordinances of the Municipality of Batac existing at 16 the time of the approval of this Act shall continue to be in force within the City 17 of Batac until the sangguniang panlungsod ordinance shall provide otherwise.

18 SEC. 53. Plebiscite. – The City of Batac shall acquire corporate 19 existence upon the ratification of its creation by a majority of the votes cast by 20 the qualified voters in a plebiscite to be conducted in the present Municipality 21 of Batac within thirty (30) days from the approval of this Act. The expenses 22 for such plebiscite shall be borne by the Municipality of Batac. The 23 Commission on Elections shall conduct and supervise such plebiscite.

SEC. 54. Officials of the City of Batac. – The present elective officials of the Municipality of Batac shall continue to exercise their powers and functions until such time that a new election is held and the duly-elected officials shall have already qualified and assumed their offices. The appointive officials and employees of the City shall likewise continue exercising their functions and duties and they shall be automatically absorbed
 by the City Government of the City of Batac.

3 SEC. 55. Succession Clause. - The City of Batac shall succeed to all
 4 the assets, properties, liabilities and obligations of the Municipality of Batac.

5 SEC. 56. Election of Provincial Governor and the Sangguniang 6 Panlalawigan Members of the Province of Ilocos Norte. – The qualified 7 voters of the City of Batac shall be qualified to vote and run for any elective 8 position in the elections for provincial governor, provincial vice governor, 9 sangguniang panlalawigan members and other elective offices for the Province 10 of llocos Norte.

SEC. 57. Jurisduction of the Province of Ilocos Norte. - The City of
 Batac shall, unless otherwise provided by law, continue to be under the
 jurisdiction of the Province of Ilocos Norte.

SEC. 58. Suspension of Increase in Rates of Local Taxes. - No
increase in the rates of local taxes shall be imposed by the City within the
period of five years from its acquisition of corporate existence.

17 SEC. 59. *Representative District.* –Until otherwise provided by law,
18 the City of Batac shall continue to be a part of the First Congressional District
19 of the Province of Ilocos Norte.

SEC. 60. Limitation. - Within three years from the approval of this
 Act, no new race track, jai-alai fronton, gambling casino or cockpit shall be
 licensed or allowed to operate in the City.

SEC. 61. *Reservation.* – Nothing herein contained shall preclude the determination by the appropriate agency or forum of boundary disputes or cases involving questions of territorial jurisdiction between the City of Batac and any of the adjoining local government units even after the effectivity of this Act. SEC. 62. Applicability of Laws – The provisions of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, and other laws pertaining to the Province of Ilocos Norte and such laws as are applicable to cities shall govern the City of Batac insofar as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 63. Exemption from Republic Act No. 9009. - The City of Batac
shall be exempted from the income requirement prescribed under Republic
Act No. 9009.

9 SEC. 64. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason or reasons, any part 10 or provisions of this charter shall be held unconstitutional, invalid or 11 inconsistent with the Local Government Code of 1991, other parts or 12 provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full 13 force and effect. Moreover, in cases where this Charter is silent or unclear, the 14 pertinent provisions of the Local Government Code shall govern, if so 15 provided therein.

SEC. 65. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
its complete publication in at least two newspapers of general and local
circulations.
