## AN ACT

AMENDING ARTICLE 341 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE REVISED PENAL CODE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled: SECTION 1. Article 341 of Republic Act No. 3815, as amended, otherwise known 1 2 as the Revised Penal Code, is hereby further amended to read as follows: 3 4 "Art. 341. White slave trade. - The penalty of RECLUSION TEMPORAL [Prision mayor] in its medium and maximum periods shall be imposed upon any 5 person who, in any manner, or under any pretext, shall engage in the business or 6 7 shall profit by prostitution or shall [enlist the services of any other for the purpose of prostitution]: 8 9 ENGAGE IN OR PROMOTE, FACILITATE OR INDUCE 10 PROSTITUTION WHICH INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE 11 **FOLLOWING:** 12 13 1. ACTING AS A PROCURER OF A PROSTITUTE; 2. INDUCING A PERSON TO BE A CLIENT OF A 14 PROSTITUTE BY MEANS OF WRITTEN OR ORAL ADVERTISEMENTS OR 15 OTHER SIMILAR MEANS: 16

11	RESORT, PLACE OF LEISURE AND/OR ENTERTAINMENT OR
12	ESTABLISHMENT SERVING AS A COVER OR WHICH ENGAGES IN
13	PROSTITUTION IN ADDITION TO THE ACTIVITY FOR WHICH THE
14	LICENSE HAS BEEN ISSUED TO SAID ESTABLISHMENT.
15	FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT, THE TERM PROSTITUTE SHALL
16	MEAN ANY PERSON WHO, FOR MONEY, PROFIT OR ANY FORM OF
17	MATERIAL CONSIDERATION OR ADVANTAGE SHALL HABITUALLY
18	OR WITH INTENT TO HABITUALLY ENGAGE OR INDULGE IN SEXUAL
19	INTERCOURSE OR LASCIVIOUS CONDUCT."

21	SEC. 2. Common Penal Provisions The penalty provided under this Act
22	shall be imposed in its maximum period if the offender:
23	(a) has been previously convicted under this Act or under Article 341
24	of the Revised Penal Code, as amended, in its form prior to its amendment by this Act;
25	(b) is, in reference to the prostitute, an ascendant, parent, guardian,
26	stepparent or collateral relative within the second degree of consanguinity or affinity;
27	(c) is a manager or owner of an establishment which has no license to
28	operate or its license has expired or has been revoked;
29	(d) is a foreigner, who shall likewise be deported immediately after
30	service of sentence and forever barred from entry to the Philippines; and
31	(e) is a public officer or employee, who shall likewise suffer the
32	penalty of perpetual or temporary absolute disqualification.
33	In addition to the penalty of imprisonment, a fine to be determined by the court,
34	which shall not be less than One Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php100,000,00), shall be
35	imposed. Said fine shall be administered as a cash fund by the Department of Social

- 1 Welfare and Development (DSWD) and disbursed, for the rehabilitation of each
- 2 prostitute victim and any immediate member of his/her family if the latter is the
- 3 perpetrator of the offense, in this order.
- When the offender is a corporation, partnership or association, the officer,
- 5 director, employee or agent thereof who is responsible for the violation of this Act shall
- 6 suffer the corresponding penalty imposed.

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- 8 SEC. 3. Rules and Regulations. Unless otherwise provided in this Act, the
- 9 Department of Justice (DOJ), in coordination with the DSWD, shall promulgate rules
- 10 and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

- **SEC. 4.** Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders,
- 13 rules and regulations which are contrary to the provision of this Act are hereby
- 14 repealed, amended and modified accordingly.

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- 16 SEC. 5. Separability Clause. If any part of this Act shall be held to be
- 17 unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected
- 18 thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

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- 20 SEC. 6. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
- 21 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
