- AN ACT CONVERTING THE SOUTHERN LUZON POLYTECHNIC COLLEGE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF LUCBAN, PROVINCE OF QUEZON, ITS UNITS AND SATELLITE CAMPUSES IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF SAMPALOC, INFANTA, POLILLO, TAGKAWAYAN, ALABAT AND TIAONG, AND THE LUCENA DUAL-TECH LIVELIHOOD AND TRAINING CENTER IN THE CITY OF LUCENA, ALL IN THE PROVINCE OF QUEZON, INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE SOUTHERN LUZON STATE UNIVERSITY (SLSU) AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Conversion. – The Southern Luzon Polytechnic College 2 (SLPC) in the Municipality of Lucban, Province of Quezon, including its units 3 and satellite campuses in the municipalities of Sampaloc, Infanta, Polillo, 4 Tagkawayan, Alabat and Tiaong, and the Lucena Dual-Tech Livelihood and 5 Training Center in the City of Lucena, all in the Province of Quezon, is hereby 6 converted into a state university to be known as the Southern Luzon State

University (SLSU), hereinafter referred to as the University. The main campus 1 2 of the University shall be in Lucban, Quezon.

SEC. 2. General Mandate. - The University shall primarily provide 3 advanced education, professional, technological instruction in the fields of 4 allied medicine, education, engineering, agriculture, fisheries, forestry, 5 environment, arts and sciences, accountancy, cooperative, business and 6 7 entrepreneurship, technology and other relevant fields of study. It shall also undertake research and extension services and provide progressive leadership 8 9 in its areas of specialization.

10 SEC. 3. Curricular Offerings. - The University shall offer graduate and 11 undergraduate and short-term technical courses in the fields of allied medicine, education, engineering, agriculture, fisheries, forestry, environment, arts and 12 sciences, accountancy, cooperative, business and entrepreneurship, technology 13 and other degrees/courses within its areas of specialization and according to its 14 capabilities, as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its 15 objectives and in order to meet the needs of the Province of Quezon and 16 17 Region IV-A.

The existing high schools shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and 18 supervision of the Department of Education (DepEd): Provided. That the high 19 20 schools shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the 21 University until the existing students shall have completed their high school 22 education: Provided, further, That the University may operate a reasonably-23 sized laboratory school, if it has a College of Education.

24 SEC. 4. Administration - The University shall have the general powers of a corporation set forth in Batas Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise 25 known as the "Corporation Code of the Philippines". The administration of the 26 University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested exclusively 27 in the Board of Regents and in the president of the University. 28

1	SEC. 5. The Governing Board The governing board of the
2	University shall be the Board of Regents, hereinafter referred to as the Board,
3	which shall be composed of the following:
4	(a) The chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED),
5	chairperson;
6	(b) The president of the University, vice chairperson;
7	(c) The chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture
8	of the Senate, member;
9	(d) The chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical
10	Education of the House of Representatives, member;
11	(e) The regional director of the National Economic and Development
12	Authority (NEDA), member;
13	(f) The regional director of the Department of Science and Technology
14	(DOST), member;
15	(g) The president of the federation of faculty associations of the
16	University, member;
17	(h) The president of the federation of student councils of the
18	University, member;
19	(i) The president of the federation of alumni associations of the
20	University, member; and
21	(j) Two prominent citizens from the private sector who have
22	distinguished themselves in their profession or fields of specialization,
23	members.
24	The Board shall appoint the two prominent citizens from among a list of
25	at least five qualified persons in the Province of Quezon, as recommended by
26	the search committee constituted by the University president, in consultation
27	with the chairperson of the CHED and the other members of the Board, based
28	on the normal standards and qualifications for the position set by the Board.

1 The term of office of the president of the federation of faculty 2 associations, the president of the federation of student councils and the 3 president of the federation of alumni associations shall be coterminous with 4 their respective terms of office, as set forth in their respective constitutions and 5 bylaws.

6 7 The two prominent citizens shall serve for a term of two years from the date of appointment.

8 SEC. 6. *Promulgation and Implementation of Policies.* – The Board 9 shall promulgate and implement policies in accordance with the declared State 10 policies on education and other pertinent provisions of the Philippine 11 Constitution on education, agriculture, science and technology, as well as the 12 policies, standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic Act No. 7722, 13 otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994".

SEC. 7. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents. – The Board shall have the following specific powers and duties, in addition to its general powers of administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of directors of a corporation under existing laws:

18 (a) To promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry19 out the purposes and functions of the University;

(b) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided for the
support of the University in the manner it may determine in its discretion, in
order to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;

(c) To import duty-free economic, technical and cultural books and/or
publications, upon certification by the CHED that such imported books and/or
publications are for economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical,
historical or cultural purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Tariff
and Customs Code, as amended;

1 (d) To receive in trust legacies, gifts and donations of real properties of 2 all kinds and to administer and dispose of the same when necessary for the 3 benefit of the University, and subject to the limitations, directions and 4 instructions of the donor, if any.

5 Such donations shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall 6 be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income in the 7 computation of the income tax of the donor, in accordance with the provisions 8 of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC) of 1997, as amended: *Provided*, 9 That such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold;

10 (e) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school charges such as, 11 but not limited to, matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as 12 the Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultations with the 13 involved sectors.

Such fees and charges, including government subsidies and other income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized government depository bank, and all interests that shall accrue therefrom shall form part of the same funds for the use of the University.

Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulations to the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by the University from tuition fees and other charges, as well as from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants, shall be retained by the University, and may be disbursed by the Board for instruction, research, extension or other programs/projects of the University: *Provided*, That all fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purposes for which they are collected.

If, for reasons beyond its control, the University shall not be able to
pursue any project for which the funds have been appropriated and allocated
under its approved program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use

1 of said funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its discretion, may be necessary and urgent for the attainment of the objectives and goals of the 2 3 University:

4

(f) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of tuition and school fees for greater access to poor but deserving students; 5

(g) To authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machinery, 6 equipment and other facilities, and the purchase and acquisition of real 7 8 property, including necessary supplies, materials and equipment;

9 (h) To appoint, upon recommendation of the president of the University, vice presidents, deans, directors, heads of campuses, faculty 10 11 members and other officials and employees of the University:

12 (i) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative officials and employees, subject to the provisions of the Revised Compensation 13 14 and Position Classification System and other pertinent budget and 15 compensation laws governing hours of service and such other duties and 16 conditions as it may deem proper; to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such regulations as it may promulgate, any provision of existing 17 law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause in 18 accordance with the requirements of due process of law: 19

(i) To approve the curricula, instructional programs and rules of 20 21 discipline drawn by the administrative and academic councils herein provided;

22

(k) To set policies on admission and graduation of students;

23 (1) To award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of their 24 outstanding contribution in the fields of education, public service, arts, science 25 and technology, agriculture or in any field of specialization within the 26 academic competence of the University; and to authorize the awarding of 27 certificates of completion of nondegree and nontraditional courses;

1 (m) To establish and absorb nonchartered tertiary institutions within the 2 Province of Quezon as branches and centers in coordination with the CHED, 3 and in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), 4 and to offer therein programs or courses to promote and carry out equal access 5 to educational opportunities as mandated by the Constitution;

6 (n) To establish research and extension centers of the University where 7 such will promote the development of the latter;

8 (o) To establish professional chairs in the University and to provide
9 fellowships for qualified faculty members and scholarships to deserving
10 students;

(p) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided hereinabove to
the president and/or other officials of the University as it may deem
appropriate, so as to expedite the administration of the affairs of the
University;

(q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be
financed by the CHED, subject to the Commission on Audit (COA) rules and
regulations; and to institute reforms, including academic and structural
changes, on the basis of the audit results and recommendations;

(r) To collaborate with other governing boards of the state colleges and
universities within the Province of Quezon or Region IV-A, under the
supervision of the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and work towards
the restructuring of the University to become more efficient, relevant,
productive and competitive;

(s) To enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the
profitable development and management of the economic assets of the
University, the proceeds of which shall be used for the development and
strengthening of the University;

1 (t) To develop consortia and other economic forms of linkages with 2 local government units (LGUs), institutions and agencies, both public and 3 private, local and foreign, in the furtherance of the purpose and objectives of 4 the University;

5 (u) To develop academic arrangements for institutional capability 6 building with appropriate institutions and agencies, public and private, local 7 and foreign, and to appoint experts/specialists as consultants, part-time or 8 visiting or exchange professors, scholars or researchers, as the case may be;

9 (v) To set up the adoption of modern and innovative modes of 10 transmitting knowledge such as the use of information technology, the dual 11 learning system, open learning or distance education and community 12 laboratory for the promotion of greater access to education;

(w) To establish policy guidelines and procedures for participative
decision-making and transparency within the University;

15 (x) To privatize, where most advantageous to the University, the
16 management of nonacadeinic services such as health, food, building or grounds
17 or property maintenance and such other similar activities; and

18 (y) To extend the term of the president of the University beyond the 19 age of retirement, but not beyond the age of seventy (70), whose performance 20 has been unanimously rated by the Board as outstanding, based on the 21 guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the Board, after unanimous 22 recommendation by the search committee.

SEC. 8. Meetings of the Board – The Board shall regularly convene at
 least once every quarter. However, the chairperson of the Board may, upon
 three days' prior written notice, call a maximum of two special meetings
 whenever necessary.

A quorum of the Board shall consist of majority of all its members
holding office at the time of the meeting: *Provided, however*, That the

chairperson of the Board or the president of the University is among those 1 2 present in the meeting.

In the absence of the chairperson of the CHED, a commissioner of the 3 4 CHED, duly designated by him/her, shall represent him/her in the meeting with all the rights and responsibilities of a regular member: Provided, however, 5 That during this meeting, the president of the University as vice chairperson 6 shall be the presiding officer: Provided, further, That this proviso 7 notwithstanding, the chairperson of the CHED is hereby authorized to 8 designate a CHED commissioner as the regular chair of the Board, in which 9 case said CHED commissioner shall act as the presiding officer. 10

In case the chairpersons of the Congressional Committees on Education 11 12 shall not be able to attend the board meeting, they may duly designate their respective representatives to attend the said meeting, who shall have the same 13 rights and responsibilities as a regular member of the Board. 14

The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be 15 16 entitled to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either in their attendance to meetings of the Board or in connection with other official 17 business authorized by resolution of the Board, subject to existing laws and 18 19 regulations.

SEC. 9. The University President. - The University shall be headed by 20 a president who shall render full-time service. He/she shall be appointed by 21 the Board, subject to the guidelines, gualifications and/or standards set by the 22 Board, upon recommendation of a duly constituted search committee. He/she 23 shall have a term of four years and shall be eligible for reappointment for 24 another term: *Provided*. That in order to effect a smooth transition to a state 25 26 university, the incumbent president of the Southern Luzon Polytehnic College, 27 if qualified, shall serve as the first president of the University.

Within six months before the expiration of the term of office of the 1 2 incumbent president of the University, the Board shall constitute the Search 3 Committee for the Presidency (SCP).

In case of vacancy in the office of the president by reason of death, 4 5 compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the president to perform the functions of his/her office, the Board shall have the 6 authority to designate an officer-in-charge of the University pending the 7 8 appointment of a new president.

In case of vacancy in the office of the president as mentioned in the 9 immediately preceding paragraph, his/her successor or the officer-in-charge 10 11 shall serve only the unexpired portion of the term.

12 The powers and duties of the president of the University, in addition to 13 those specifically provided in this Act, shall be those usually pertaining to the office of the president of similar universities, and those delegated by the 14 15 Board.

The salary of the president of the University shall be in accordance with 16 the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and shall be 17 18 comparable to that being received by the presidents of similar educational 19 institutions.

20 The president of the University shall be assisted by a vice president for 21 academic affairs, a vice president for administrative and financial affairs and a 22 vice president for planning, research, extension, production and development, 23 who shall be appointed by the Board, upon the recommendation of the president. 24

25 SEC. 10. Heads of University Campuses. - Campus directors shall head the University campuses and they shall render full-time service. They 26 27 shall be appointed by the Board, upon the recommendation of the search committee and the University president, subject to the guidelines, 28

qualifications and/or standards set by the Board: Provided, That the incumbent 1 college administrators of the extension campuses shall serve as campus 2 directors of their respective campuses. 3

SEC. 11. The Administrative Council. - There shall be an 4 administrative council consisting of the president of the University as 5 chairperson, vice presidents, deans, directors and other officials of equal rank 6 as members, whose duty is to review and recommend to the Board the policies 7 governing the administration, management and development planning of the 8 University. 9

SEC. 12. The Academic Council. - There shall be an academic council, 10 to be composed of the president of the University, who shall act as chairperson, 11 and all academic staff with the rank of at least an assistant professor, as 12 13 members.

The academic council shall have the power to review and recommend 14 the curricular offerings and rules of discipline of the University, subject to the 15 approval of the Board. It shall fix the requirements for the admission of 16 students, as well as for their graduation and the conferment of degrees, subject 17 to review and/or approval by the Board through the president of the University. 18 19 It shall have the disciplinary power over students of the University and shall formulate academic policies and rules and regulations on discipline, subject to 20 21 the approval of the Board.

SEC. 13. The Secretary of the University. - The Board shall appoint a 22 secretary who shall serve as such for both the Board and the University and 23 shall keep all records and proceedings of the Board. He/she shall serve upon 24 each member of the Board the appropriate notices of the Board's meetings. 25

SEC. 14. The Treasurer of the University. - The Treasurer of the 26 Philippines shall be the ex officio treasurer of the University. 27

SEC. 15. Faculty. - No political beliefs, gender preference, cultural or
 community affiliation or ethnic origin, and religious opinion or affiliation shall
 be a matter of inquiry in the appointment of faculty members of the University:
 Provided, That said appointment shall be subject to the guidelines,
 qualifications and/or standards set by the Board: *Provided*, *further*, That no
 member of the faculty shall teach for or against any particular church or
 religious sect.

8 SEC. 16. Scholarship Program/Admission. -- The University shall 9 provide a scholarship program and other affirmative action programs to assist 10 poor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the University.

No student shall be denied admission to the University by reason of sex,
 religion, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin.

SEC. 17. Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy. – The
University shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant
to paragraph 2, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution of the Republic of
the Philippines.

SEC. 18. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus/Equipment/Supplies 17 and Detail of Personnel. - The heads of the bureaus and offices of the national 18 19 government are hereby authorized to loan or transfer, upon the request of the 20 president of the University, such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be needed by the University, and to detail employees for duty therein when, in the 21 22 judgment of the head of bureau or office, such apparatus, equipment, supplies 23 or services of such employees can be spared without serious detriment to the The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as 24 public service. required of them by the president of the University, and the time so employed 25 shall be counted as part of their regular services. 26

SEC. 19. Assets, Liabilities and Personnel. - All assets, real and
 personal, personnel and records of the SLPC, as well as liabilities or

obligations, are hereby transferred to the University. The positions, rights and 1 2 security of tenure of faculty members and personnel therein employed under 3 existing laws prior to the conversion into a university shall be respected.

4

All parcels of land belonging to the government occupied by the SLPC 5 are hereby declared to be property of the University, and shall be titled under 6 that name: Provided. That should the University cease to exist or be abolished or should such parcels of land aforementioned be no longer needed by the 7 8 University, the same shall revert to the LGUs concerned.

SEC. 20. Appropriations. - The amount necessary to carry out the 9 10 provisions of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations 11 of the Southern Luzon Polytechnic College, except the sums needed to 12 continue the operations of the existing high schools. Thereafter, such sums as 13 may be necessary for the continued operation and maintenance of the Southern 14 Luzon State University shall be included in the annual General Appropriations 15 Act.

SEC. 21. Development Plan, Management Audit, Organizational/ 16 Administrative/Academic Structure. - Within the period of one hundred twenty 17 (120) days after the approval of this Act, the University shall accomplish the 18 19 following:

20 (a) Submit a five-year development plan, including its corresponding program budgets to the CHED, for corresponding recommendation to the 21 22 DBM:

23

(b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with the CHED; and

24 (c) Accordingly set up its organizational, administrative as well as 25 academic structure, including the appointment of the University key officials.

SEC. 22. Filing of Report. - On or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the 26 27 second month after the opening of the regular classes each year, the Board 28 shall file with the Office of the President of the Philippines through the chairperson of the CHED, and with both Houses of Congress, a detailed report
 on the progress, conditions and needs of the University.

SEC. 23. Suppletory Application. – The provisions of Republic Act No.
8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997",
shall be an integral part of this Act and shall serve as part of the governing
charter of the University.

SEC. 24. Parity Clause. - All other powers, functions and privileges,
responsibilities and limitations to state universities and/or their officials under
existing laws shall be deemed granted to or imposed upon the University
and/or its officials whenever appropriate.

SEC. 25. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The Board, in
 consultation with the CHED, shall formulate the guidelines to fully implement
 the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 26. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any part or
provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining
parts or provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

- SEC. 27. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive
 orders, rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of
 this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 28. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
 its publication in two newspapers of general circulation.
