## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Republic Act No 7898 was enacted in 1995 with the grand purpose of modernizing our Armed Forces. Sadly, the envisioned modernization never really gained ground due to several concerns such as lack of funding, circuitous procurement system, devaluation of the Philippine Peso vis-à-vis the American Dollar, the 1997 Asian economic slump, among other factors.

In order to address some of the concerns which were experienced in the implementation of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) Modernization Act, the proposed Bill advances the following amendments thereto, to wit: 1) fixing the annual appropriation for the AFP Modernization Act in an amount not less than three-tenths of one per centum (0.3%) of the last officially-reported gross national product: 2) as part of the Self-Reliant Defense Posture (SRDP) Program, establishing a continuous research and development program designed to utilize new technology and upgrade existing AFP inventory of equipment and weapon systems; 3) expanding the sources of funding for the AFP Modernization Act Trust Fund to include the proceeds from the lease and/or joint venture agreements and such other dispositions pertaining to former military camps; 4) adopting a simplified Defense Acquisition System which shall be separate and distinct from the procurement system applicable to other departments of government; 5) creating the office of the Undersecretary in the Department of National Defense for Resource Management and Capability Development which will be tasked with contract negotiation, acquisition and procurement of the equipment and non-equipment requirements of the AFP; 6) exempting the AFP Modernization projects, undertaking, activities and programs from all fees, taxes, duties and assessments imposed and/or required by government and nongovernment agencies; and, 7) making the modernization of the AFP a continuing effort and not merely for fifteen (15) year period, as originally prescribed by law.

While the above amendments will not totally eliminate all obstacles to the modernization of the AFP, it will no doubt be a good start. For these reasons, the immediate passage of the bill is most earnestly sought before this August Chamber.

### AN ACT

# AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7898 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "AFP MODERNIZATION ACT"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled

1	SEC. 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No 7898 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14	[(b)] (c) To develop its capability to assist civilian agencies in the preservation of the
15	national patrimony, including the country's living and nonliving marine, submarine,
16	mineral, forest and other natural resources located within its territory and its
17	Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ);
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[(c) ](d) To enhance its capability to fulfill its mandate to protect the Filipino people not 1 only from armed threats but from the ill effects of life-threatening and destructive 2 consequences of natural and man-made disasters and calamities, including typhoons, 3 earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, major accidents in far- flung or inaccessible terrain 4 or at sea and all forms of ecological damage; 5 6 7 [(d)] (e) To improve its capability to assist other agencies in the enforcement of domestic and foreign policies as well as international covenants against TERRORISM, piracy, 8 9 white slavery, smuggling, drug trafficking, hijacking of aircraft and sea craft and the transport of toxic and other ecologically-harmful substances taking place in or 10 through Philippine territory; 11 12 [(e)] (f) To enhance its capability to assist the Philippine National Police in law 13 enforcement and in internal security operations; 14 15 (g) To enhance its capability to fulfill the country's international commitments; 16 [(f)]17 and 18 [(g)] (h) To develop its capability to support national development. 19 20SEC. 2. Section 4 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows: 21 22 "Sec. 4 [Components of the AFP Modernization Program] PROGRAMS UNDER 23 THE AFP MODERNIZATION ACT - [The modernization program shall consist of the 24 following components] THE AFP MODERNIZATION ACT SHALL CONSIST OF THE 25 FOLLOWING PROGRAMS: 26 27 (a) Force restructuring and organizational development - The AFP modernization 28 [program] ACT shall develop the AFP into a compact, efficient, responsive and 29 modern force with the capability to engage in conventional and/or unconventional 30 warfare, disaster relief and rescue operations, and contribute to economic 31 32 development and other nontraditional military roles. 33 This component of the modernization [program] ACT shall likewise provide for the 34 35 identification, organization, training and development of reserve force and affiliated reserve units in the AFP especially in the Navy and Air Force [.] 36 37

1 (b) Capability, materi(a)El [,] and technology development - The AFP modernization 2 [program] ACT entails the development and employment of certain capabilities that 3 can address the assessed threats[:] Provided, That the acquisition of air force, navy and army equipment and materiel of such types and quantities shall be made in 4 accordance with the need to develop AFP capabilities pursuant to its modernization 5 objectives[:] Provided, further, That the acquisition of new equipment and weapons 6 7 systems shall be synchronized with the phase-out of uneconomical and obsolete 8 major equipment and weapons systems in the AFP inventory. Provided, even further, 9 That, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF LOCALLY-MANUFACTURED MAJOR EQUIPMENT AND WEAPONS SYSTEM WHICH ARE OF PROVEN QUALITY 10 AND RELIABILITY, no major equipment and weapons system shall be purchased if 11 the same are not being used by the armed forces in the country of origin or used by 12 13 the armed forces of at least two countries[:] Provided, furthermore, That only offers 14 from suppliers who are themselves the manufacturers shall be entertained[:] Provided, 15 finally, [t]That no supply contract shall be entered into unless such contract provides for, in clear and unambiguous terms, [an] after -sales services and the availability of 16 17 spare parts.

19 (c) Bases/support system development - The AFP modernization [program] Act shall 20 entail the development of permanent bases for land, air [,] and naval forces to 21 conform with national defense strategies and the government's socioeconomic thrust; 22 provide a systematic relocation of AFP units to enhance their capability in the performance of their mission; provide adequate support systems and housing facilities 23 to AFP units and personnel; provide training grounds for maneuver and territorial 24 25 forces as well as the reserve components, and develop bases and camps along 26 standard criteria for space allocations, zoning and efficient correlation of land areas 27 and structure.

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- (d) Human resource and development The human resource development component of the AFP modernization [program] ACT shall have the following objectives:
  - (1) To strengthen the patriotic spirit and nationalist consciousness of the military[,] and respect for people's rights in the performance of [their] ITS duty;

11	(6) To improve the quality of life of soldier and their families and reorient values
12	of all personnel in the AFP TOWARDS THE ENHANCEMENT OF THE

15	(e) Doctrines development – The transition of the AFP [from an internal security-oriented
16	force to an external security-oriented force] TO A MULTI-MISSION CAPABLE
17	FORCE requires the review, evaluation and validation of its present set of doctrines for
18	the purpose of formalizing such doctrines. Towards this end, the Department of National
19	Defense and the [g]General [h]Headquarters, AFP shall be responsible for the generation,
20	evaluation, consolidation and formalization of doctrines; the conduct of periodic review
21	and validation of doctrines through field application, testing and exercises; and the
22	dissemination of approved doctrines at all levels of command.
23	
24	The Secretary of National Defense shall formulate guidelines to
25	implement this section in accordance with the objectives of the modernization

  36 being the country's first line of external defense, shall develop its air defense
