RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, as Chairperson of the Committee on Health and Demography, she participated and helped in the enactment of vital health-related measures, namely R. A. 9241 or "The National Health Insurance Program", R. A. 9211 or the 'No Smoking Act", R. A. 9165 or the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002" and R. A. 9275 otherwise known as the "Clean Water Act;

WHEREAS, consistent with her belief in the empowerment of the marginalized sectors, she supported the passage of laws that address the growing needs of the less fortunate members of our society to lessen the degree of inequality in the distribution of social and economic opportunities;

WHEREAS, as Senator, she has steadfastly and devoutly upheld the dignity of women, the principle and decency of a lawmaker, and the industriousness and fortitude of a legislator, thus making her an exemplary member of this august Chamber: *Now, therefore, be it*
