RESOLUTION

COMMENDING THE HONORABLE ALFREDO S. LIM FOR HIS EXEMPLARY PERFORMANCE DURING THE THIRTEENTH CONGRESS AND CONGRATULATING HIM FOR BEING ELECTED AS MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MANILA

WHEREAS, Senator Alfredo S. Lim served the first three (3) years of his term with competence and dedication to his sworn duty as legislator of the Republic;

WHEREAS, Senator Lim was able to accomplish the task of being Chairman of two vital committees: the Committee on Cooperatives and the Committee on Local Government. His dedication produced various legislations on strengthening local governance and empowerment of cooperatives;

WHEREAS, with public service foremost in his mind, Senator Lim introduced legislations seeking to institutionalize assistance to farmers and fishermen; mandating local governments to earmark a portion of their internal revenue allotments (IRAs) for free medicines to indigent patients in their localities, and exempting the benefits for senior citizens from the value added tax (VAT).
