RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES TO FURTHER ADJUST THE EXISTING COMPENSATION AND POSITION CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM OF THE UNIFORMED PERSONNEL IN THE MILITARY SERVICE AND THE POLICE ESTABLISHMENT, AND THE TEACHERS AND NURSES IN THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE BY INCREASING THEIR COMPENSATION TO TWO SALARY GRADES HIGHER THAN WHAT THEY ARE CURRENTLY RECEIVING

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2009, the President signed into law Joint Resolution No. 4 that effectively modified the compensation and position classification system of civilian personnel and the base pay schedule of the military and uniformed personnel in the government;

WHEREAS, the Joint Resolution made the compensation of government employees in general more responsive to their and their respective family's economic needs, providing them with adequate incentives thus improving the quality of public services;

WHEREAS, the uniformed personnel in the military service and the police establishment, the teachers and the nurses in the government service are a class of their own in view of the vital role they play in internal or external security, or in providing social services to the people, taking into consideration the physical hazards, both natural and man-made, they face in the course of performing their mandated duties;

WHEREAS, these specified government employees should be given additional compensation to enable them the opportunity to compensate for the hazards they face in the course of performing their governmental functions.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Resolved by the Senate, To urge the President of the Philippines to further adjust the existing Compensation and Position Classification System of the uniformed personnel in the military service and the police establishment, and the teachers and nurses in the government service by increasing their compensation to two salary grades higher than what they are currently receiving.
