"AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL HOSPITAL FOR OVERSEAS FILIPINO WORKERS (OFWS) AND THEIR DEPENDENTS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title – This Act shall be known as the "Migrant
Workers Hospital Act of 2008".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy – It is the policy of the State to adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all people at affordable cost. Further, the State shall protect the interest and promote the well-being of Filipino overseas workers including their families and dependents through the provision of social and welfare services.

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SEC. 3. Creation of Special Hospital. – To carry out the above policy, there is hereby created a special hospital to be known as the Migrant Workers Hospital which shall be under the supervision and control of the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA).

SEC. 4. Objectives. - To ensure the availability, accessibility and
affordability of quality health care, Migrant Workers Hospital shall:

- 1a)Provide for a comprehensive/total health care services to2all migrant workers who are OWWA contributors3including their dependents;
- 4 **b)** Complement the existing package of services under the 5 Health Care Program so as to include preventive, 6 promotive, diagnostic, curative and rehabilitative 7 programs;
- 8 c) Conduct medical examination to ensure the physical and 9 mental capability of all the would-be overseas Filipino 10 workers duly covered by an approved job order;
- 11d)Set-up a system that will effectively monitor the condition12of patients and to generate relevant information and data13in aid of policy formulation.

14 **SEC. 5.** Administration and Composition of Board Members. – Upon 15 the effectivity of this Act, the powers and the administration of the Migrant 16 Workers Hospital shall be vested in a Board, which is composed of the 17 following members:

18	a)	The Secretary of the Department of Labor and
19		Employment as Ex-Officio Chairman;
20	b)	The Administrator of the Overseas Workers Welfare
21		Administration as Ex-Officio Vice Chairman;
22	C)	The Secretary of the Department of Health as Ex-Officio
23		Member;
24	d)	The Secretary of the Department of Social Welfare and
25		Development as <i>Ex-Officio</i> Member;
26	e)	The Administrator of the Philippine Overseas Employment
27		Administration as <i>Ex-Officio</i> Member;

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1 f) Two (2) representatives from OFWs sector (one from 2 landbased and another from sea-based) as Members. The two representatives from the OFWs sector shall be appointed by 3 4 the President of the Republic of the Philippines from a list of nominees 5 submitted by the *Ex-Officio* Chairman. The representatives appointed 6 shall serve for a term of three (3) years without re-appointment. 7 SEC. 6. Responsibilities and Powers. - The Board of Directors of the 8 Migrant Workers Hospital shall have the following responsibilities and 9 powers: 10 a) To formulate and implement measures and programs to 11 attain the Migrant Workers Hospital's objectives and purposes as 12 enunciated in Section 4 of this Act; 13 b) To enter into agreements and contracts in connection with its establishment, maintenance, operations and objectives; 14 15 c) To issue rules and regulations to carry out the objectives and purposes of this Act; 16 d) To perform such other duties and functions as may be 17 provided by law. 18 19 SEC. 7. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The Board shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act within sixty 20 21 (60) days from the date of its approval. 22 SEC. 8. Appropriation. - In addition to the seed money held in trust by the OWWA, the National Government shall contribute the amount necessary 23 for the establishment and initial operation of the Migrant Workers Hospital 24 25 which shall be taken from the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated. 26 Subsequently, its appropriation shall be included in the annual General 27 Appropriations Act (GAA).

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SEC. 9. Assistance from Government Offices, etc. - The Migrant 1 Workers Hospital may call upon any department, bureau, office, agency or 2 instrumentality of the Government, including government owned or 3 controlled corporations, for such assistance as it may need in the pursuit of its 4 5 purposes and objectives.

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SEC. 10. Exemption from Donor's Taxes, Customs and Tariff Duties. - All donations, contributions or endowments which may be made by persons 7 or entities to the hospital and the importation of medical equipment and 8 machineries, spare parts and other medical equipment not hereto mentioned 9 used solely and exclusively for the Migrant Workers Hospital shall be exempt 10 from income, gift, direct and indirect taxes, wharfage fees and other charges 11 12 and restrictions.

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SEC. 11. Annual Report. - The Migrant Workers Hospital shall render 14 to the President of the Philippines, to the Senate and to the House of Representatives an annual report of its activities and recommendations. 15

SEC. 12. Congressional Oversight Committee. - A Congressional 16 Oversight Committee, herein after referred to as the "Committee", is hereby 17 18 constituted in accordance with the provisions of this Act. The Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Labor, 19 20 Employment and Human Resources Development and the Chairman of the House of Representatives Committee on Overseas Workers Affairs and four 21 (4) additional members from each House to be designated by the President of 22 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives respectively. The 23 committee shall, among others in aid of legislation: 24

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1) Monitor and ensure the proper implementation of this Act;

2) Review the performance of the hospital; and 26

27 3) Review the proper implementation of the programs of the Hospital 28 and the use of its fund.

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In furtherance of the herein above cited objectives, the Committee is empowered to require the hospital to submit all pertinent information including but not limited to its performance data and its annual audited financial statement certified by the Commission on Audit.

5 **SEC. 13.** *Repealing Clause* - All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules 6 and regulations or part thereof deemed inconsistent with the provisions of this 7 Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

8 **SEC. 14.** *Effectivity Clause* - This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) 9 days from its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national 10 newspapers of general circulation.
