AN ACT AMENDING ARTICLE 359 OF ACT NO. 3815, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE REVISED PENAL CODE, AS AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Article 359 of Act No. 3815, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

> "Art. 359. Slander by deed. - The penalty of [arresto mayor in its maximum] PRISION MAYOR IN ITS MINIMUM period to [prision correccional in its minimum] ITS MAXIMUM period or a fine [ranging from 200 to 1,000 pesos] OF 100,000 PESOS, OR BOTH, shall be imposed upon any person who shall perform any act not included and punished in this title, which shall cast dishonor, discredit, or contempt upon another person, SUCH AS, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE INTENTIONAL FILING OF A FALSE COMPLAINT IN COURT OR IN ANY OTHER **GOVERNMENT EXERCISING QUASI-**AGENCIES **OF JUDICIAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS**. If said act is not of a serious nature, the penalty shall be [arresto menor] PRISION MAYOR IN ITS MINIMUM TO ITS MEDIUM PERIOD or a fine [not exceeding 200 pesos] OF 50,000 PESOS.

> IF DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION OR TRIAL IT IS PROVEN THAT THE ABOVE FALSE COMPLAINT HAS BEEN OR IS BEING USED BY THE COMPLAINANT AS A LEVERAGE AGAINST ANY PERSON IN ORDER TO GAIN ADVANTAGE OR TO RECEIVE A FAVORABLE DECISION, ACTION OR RESOLUTION ON ANY MATTER, THE MAXIMUM PENALTY PROVIDED HEREIN

SHALL BE IMPOSED." 24

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SEC. 2. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is declared invalid by a competent court, the remainder of this Act or any provision not affected by such declaration of invalidity shall remain in force and effect.

- SEC. 3. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, other executive issuances, rules and regulations or parts thereof are 2 hereby repealed amended or modified accordingly. 3
- SEC 4. Effectivity This act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 4 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of genera1 circulation. 5
