

1 AN ACT TO REGULATE AGGRESSIVE DRIVING

2 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress*
3 *assembled:*

4 SECTION 1. *Definition.* A person is guilty of aggressive driving when:

5 (A) He or she recklessly operates a motor vehicle on a public highway in a manner that
6 creates a substantial risk of serious physical injury to another person; or

7 (B) He or she operates a motor vehicle on a public highway while displaying a deadly
8 weapon, dangerous instrument or what reasonably appears to be a pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun,
9 machine gun or other firearm in such a manner to place another person in reasonable fear of
10 death or serious physical injury; or

11 (C) He or she operates a motor vehicle on a public highway in such a manner to place
12 another person in reasonable fear of death or physical injuries.

13 (D) He or she tailgates, or drives on a road too closely behind another vehicle, such as
14 less than the travel distance in two seconds or, equivalently, one vehicle-length for every 8 km/h
15 (5 mph) of the current speed.

16 SECTION 4. *Penalty* – Any act of aggressive driving as enumerated in section 1 of
17 this Act shall be punishable by a penalty of Five Thousand Pesos (P5, 000.00) for the first
18 offense, Ten Thousand Pesos (P10, 000.00) for the second offense, and confiscation of the
19 offender's driver's license and a fine of Fifty thousand Pesos (P50,000.00) upon the third and
20 final offense.

1 SECTION 5. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts
2 thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified
3 accordingly.

4 SECTION 6. *Separability Clause.* – If, for any reason, any provision of this Act is
5 declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof which are not
6 affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

7 SECTION 7. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days
8 following its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
