EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 9 of the Constitution affirms that the State shall promote a just and dynamic social order that will ensure the prosperity and independence of the nation and free the people from poverty through policies that provide adequate social services, promote full employment, a rising standard of living, and an improved quality of life for all.

The present socio-economic condition of our country, however, runs counter to the aforesaid policy of the State. The Philippines has one of the highest levels of income inequality in Asia, with the poorest twenty percent (20%) of the population accounting for only five percent (5%) of total income or consumption. Poverty is most severe and most widespread in rural areas, where almost eighty percent (80%) of the country's poor people live. Most of them depend for a livelihood on subsistence farming and fishing. This unrelenting rise of poverty incidence coupled with the low economic growth in the countryside have resulted to migration to urban areas. Urban poverty in the Philippines, especially in Metro Manila, has increased over the past three (3) years from 17.9% to 20.4%.

Although there have been efforts to address the crisis of poverty through livelihood programs, with the direct involvement of government agencies and institutions, many problems persist. Lack of coordination among these agencies and wasteful duplication of efforts and initiatives are the most prominent of these problems.

In lieu of this, this bill seeks to establish a National Livelihood Development Council which is tasked to formulate a comprehensive and integrated livelihood development program for the country.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

- 4 SEC. 5. Powers and Functions. The Council shall have the following powers
- 5 and functions:
- 6 a. To formulate, in accordance with the bottom-up planning approach and in
- 7 consultation with the concerned sectors, an integrated and comprehensive national
- 8 livelihood development program;
- 9 b. To formulate, in consultation with the concerned sectors, policies, standards, and
- guidelines which shall govern the implementation of livelihood programs and
- projects, including the identification and coordination of various types of assistance
- that should be provided to ensure their effective implementation;
- 13 c. To review, amend, modify, and approves all livelihood programs submitted by
- implementing agencies including GOCCs, and to evaluate and recommend the
- budgetary allocations of resources for all livelihood programs and projects through
- the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), as well as review and endorse to
- the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA) all requests for foreign
- financing whether in the form of grants, donations, or loans;
- 19 d. To monitor and evaluate the implementation of livelihood programs and projects and
- 20 institute measures to address identified gaps, as well as decide on whether or not a
- certain livelihood program or project based on monitoring and evaluation results;
- 22 e. To establish effective unified mechanisms for program planning and implementation;
- 23 f. To review, amend, modify, and approve all provincial/city livelihood development
- programs with national funding to ensure that these conform and are consistent with
- 25 the various agencies plans and programs;
- 26 g. To provide and disseminate information and data on livelihood projects initiatives
- and concerns to agencies concerned and point out actual or possible duplication
- among livelihood projects;

- 1 h. To authorize expenditures of the Council as may be necessary for the proper, efficient
- and effective administration of the National Livelihood Development Program;
- 3 i. To promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary for the effective exercise of
- 4 the powers and functions of the Council;
- 5 j. To improve and recommend to the Department of Budget and Management the
- 6 annual and supplemental budgets for the Council;
- 7 k. To create form among themselves such working committees necessary for the
- 8 efficient and effective operation of the Council;
- 9 l. To support the promotion and marketing of livelihood enterprises; and
- 10 m. To provide a continuing education and information dissemination program on
- 11 enterprise management.

- 13 SEC. 6. Composition of the Council. The Council shall be composed of a
- 14 Chairman to be appointed by the President of the Philippines and the following as
- 15 members:
- 16 a. The most senior official directly responsible for the overall management of livelihood
- programs and projects of the following agencies: the Department of Social Welfare
- and Development (DSWD), the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), the
- 19 Department of Interior and Local Government, the Department of Agrarian reform
- 20 (DAR); and the Department of Environment and natural Resources (DENR).
- 21 b. Heads of the Livelihood Corporation and the Technology and Livelihood Resource
- 22 Center;
- 23 c. The most senior official of each Government Financing Institutions directly
- responsible for the overall management of the agency's livelihood assistance program
- and/or lending window;
- d. Head of the NEDA Social Development Committee;
- 27 e. Two (2) non-governmental organization representatives involved in livelihood
- programs, to be chosen by the same sector through a process designed by them;

- f. Five (5) private sector representatives designated by the private sector representatives
- designated by the Council coming from any of following sectors: agriculture,
- 3 industry, youth and finance/banking; and
- 4 g. Two (2) representatives of people's organization to be chosen by the same sector
- 5 through a process designated by them.
- 6 SEC. 7. Secretariat. To render technical and administrative support, the
- 7 Livelihood Corporation, created under the Executive Order No. 866, shall provide the
- 8 Secretariat which shall be headed by an Executive Director to be appointed by the
- 9 Chairman of the Council.
- The Secretariat shall work closely with the provincial/city livelihood committees
- on the aspects of monitoring and evaluating the implementation of livelihood programs.

- 13 SEC. 8. Local Livelihood Committees. The Provincial/City Livelihood
- 14 Committee shall be composed of the provincial/city representatives of the member
- 15 government agencies of the Council. The Committees shall report to the Secretariat with
- 16 respect to the implementation of livelihood programs of the respective agencies in line
- 17 with policies of the Council. The PLC shall be responsible for preparing a provincial/city
- 18 livelihood development plan for submission to and approval by the Council. The
- 19 provincial/city livelihood development plan shall be formulated and implemented with
- 20 maximum participation and involvement of NGOs and POs in the concerned
- 21 province/city.

- 23 SEC. 9. Implementing Guidelines. The Council shall formulate and issue
- 24 within six (6) months after the approval of this Act the necessary implementing
- 25 guidelines which shall include but not limited to the following:
- 26 a. Definition of Livelihood Programs and Projects

1	b. Livelihood programs and projects shall include all those activities and schemes
2	involving government funds that are allocated to non-government recipients in order
3	to generate income and employment; and
4	c. Eligibility Criteria
5	To be qualified for appropriate assistance, an individual or group proponent must belong
5	to any of the following categories:

- 7 1. Those who are barely able to survive because of severe material and/or social deprivation and with no regular sufficient income;
- 9 2. Those with regular but low income (i.e., minimum wage);
- 3. Micro entrepreneurs and wage earners with regular income above the minimum wage but not sufficient to maintain a family life; and
- 4. Small and starting entrepreneurs and professionals, farmers and fishermen with viable operations and projects needing some assistance to stabilize or expand their enterprises.
- The Council shall adopt a framework that recognizes the developmental stages inherent in the objective of graduating as many of the poor outside of the poverty continuum. In this regard, the Council is empowered to identify and/or specify the roles of each government financial institutions.

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- 20 SEC. 10. Powers and Functions of the Council Chairman. The Chairman shall
- 21 have the following powers and functions:
- 22 a. To preside over all meetings of the Council;
- 23 b. To exercise overall supervision of the activities of the Council; and
- c. To execute in behalf of the Council any contract or agreement as may be necessary
 for proper, efficient and effective administration of the Council.

SEC. 11. Powers and Duties of Executive Director. – The Executive Director shall exercise the following powers and duties:

1	a.	To execute the policies, guidelines and programs approved by the Council and to be
2		responsible for the efficient discharge of management and operational functions of
3		the Council;
4	b.	To recommend the organizational structure and staffing pattern of the Secretariat to
5		the Council;
6	c.	To review and submit for the consideration and approval of the Council proposed
7		measures, policies, guidelines, and programs, as s/he may deem necessary for the
8		effective implementation of this Act;
9	d.	To direct and supervise the day to day operations of the Secretariat; and
10	e.	To exercise such powers and functions and perform such other duties as may be
11		vested or imposed upon him by the Council.
12		
13		SEC. 12. Appropriations Such sums as may be necessary to carry out the
14	pro	ovisions of this Act shall be included in the General Appropriations Act of the year
15	fol	lowing its enactment into law and thereafter.
16		
17		SEC. 13. Annual Report The Council shall submit to the President of the
18	Se	nate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives an annual report on its operations
19	an	d accomplishments.
20		
21		SEC. 14. Repealing Clause All laws, executive orders, rules and regulations or
22	pa	rts thereof, inconsistent with this Acvt are hereby repealed, amended, modified
23	ac	cordingly. The provisions of this Act shall not be repealed, amended or modified,
24	un	less expressly so provided in subsequent general or special laws.

26		SEC. 15. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days

following its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
