EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 14, Section 1 provides that:

SEC. 1. The State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all.

As our nation progresses further into globalization, we have continuously been challenged to improve our skills. Our students, instead of rising to the challenge, seem to be left behind, as evidenced by the poor national achievement test scores. As we take on the great information superhighway, or the Internet, we need to develop not only our skill to read, but also our skill to write in order to better communicate with the rest of the world.

Good writing skills are essential to employment, both locally and internationally. Furthermore, it is also important in the performance of civic duty and participation in the national development.

The Department of Education, for all their effort, at times has struggled to increase the quality of education due to lack of personnel and expertise. However, the Philippines have been blessed with numerous non-profit organizations that aims to develop the writing skills of our youth.

This bill seeks to encourage the cooperation between the government and the private sector in developing a program that will develop the writing skills of our youth.¹

1 2	AN ACT TO CREATE A NATIONAL WRITING PROGRAM
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4 5	Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
6	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "National Writing Program
7	Act."
8	SECTION 2. Purposes. – The purposes of this Act are –
9	A. to support and promote the expansion of a network of sites so that teachers in
10	every region of the country will have access to a national writing program;
11	B. to ensure the consistent high quality of the sites through ongoing review,
12	evaluation, and technical assistance;
13	C. to support and promote the establishment of programs to disseminate effective
14	practices and research findings about the teaching of writing; and
15	D. to coordinate activities assisted under this subpart with activities assisted under
16	this Act.
17	. SECTION 3. Authorization – The Secretary of Education, hereafter referred to as
18	"Secretary," is authorized to award a grant to a nonprofit educational organization that has as its
19	primary purpose the improvement of the quality of student writing and learning, hereafter
20	referred to as the "Grantee," to improve the teaching of writing and the use of writing as a part of
21	the learning process in our country's classrooms.

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SECTION 4. Grant Requirements. - The grant shall provide that--

1 A. the Grantee will enter into contracts with institutions of higher education or other 2 nonprofit educational providers, hereafter in this section referred to as "Contractors," 3 under which the contractors will agree to establish, operate, and provide the non-4 government share of the cost of teacher training programs in effective approaches and 5 processes for the teaching of writing; B. funds made available by the Secretary to the Grantee pursuant to any contract entered 6 7 into under this section will be used to pay the government share of the cost of 8 establishing and operating teacher training programs as provided in this Act; and 9 C. the Grantee will meet such other conditions and standards as the Secretary determines 10 to be necessary to assure compliance with the provisions of this Act and will provide 11 such technical assistance as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act. 12 SECTION 5. Teacher Training Program. - The teacher training programs described in 13 the previous section shall -A. be conducted during the school year and during the summer months; 14 15 B. train teachers who teach grades kindergarten through college; C. select teachers to become members of a writing project teacher network whose 16 members will conduct writing workshops for other teachers in the area served by each 17 18 writing project site; and 19 D. encourage teachers from all disciplines to participate in such teacher training 20 programs. 21 SECTION 6. Government Share. - Except as provided in paragraph A or B, the term 22 "government share" means 50 percent of such costs to the contractor. A. WAIVER- The Secretary may waive the provisions of this section on a case-by-case 23 basis if the National Advisory Board described in Section 7 determines, on the basis 24 of financial need, that such waiver is necessary. 25 B. MAXIMUM- The National Advisory Board shall determine the maximum amount of 26 27 the government share of the costs of teacher training programs conducted pursuant to 28 this Act.

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SECTION 7. National Advisory Board. - The National Writing Project shall establish 1 2 and operate a National Advisory Board. 3 A. COMPOSITION- The National Advisory Board shall consist of-4 1. national educational leaders: 5 2. leaders in the field of writing; and 6 3. such other individuals as the Grantee deems necessary 7 B. DUTIES- The National Advisory Board established pursuant to this section shall-8 1. advise the Grantee on national issues related to student writing and the 9 teaching of writing; 10 · 2. review the activities and programs of the Grantee; and 11 3. support the continued development of the Grantee. 12 SECTION 8. Evaluation. - The Secretary shall conduct an independent evaluation by 13 grant or contract of the teacher training programs administered pursuant to this subpart. Such 14 evaluation shall specify the amount of funds expended by the Grantee and each contractor 15 receiving assistance under this section for administrative costs. The results of such evaluation 16 shall be made available to the appropriate committees of Congress. 17 SECTION 9. Application Review. -A. REVIEW BOARD - The Grantee shall establish and operate a National Review 18 Board that shall consist of-19 20 1. leaders in the field of research in writing; and 2. such other individuals as the Grantee determines necessary. 21 B. The National Review Board shall-22 1. review all applications for assistance under this subsection; and 23 24 2. recommend applications for assistance under this subsection for funding by 25 the Grantee.

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1	SECTION 10. Appropriations To carry out the provisions of this Act, such amount as
2	hereby necessary is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the National Treasury.
3	SECTION 11. Separability Clause If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
4	unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
5	valid and subsisting.
6	SECTION 12. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
7	order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or is inconsistent
8	with the provision of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
9	SECTION 13. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
10	publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
