## EXPLANATORY NOTE

According to the World Health Organization, an estimated 1.2 million people worldwide are killed every year due to road accidents, and as many as 50 million are injured or disabled. The majority of these deaths, approximately 85 percent, occur in low to middle-income countries

Inexperienced Drivers cause many automobile accidents as they are unfamiliar on how to drive. Many drive too fast for conditions, fail to obey speed limits, and get themselves in dangerous situations by following too close or aggressive maneuvers that do not allow escape routes. Statistics and common sense tells us that every year there are far too many accidents caused by young novice drivers who are allowed by irresponsible vehicle owners to drive even without having the proper driver's license.

This bill seeks to penalize irresponsible vehicle owners who permit persons not authorized or licensed to drive a vehicle from driving their vehicles.\*

	SECTION 1. Short Title - This act shall be known as "Motor Vehicle Safety Act"			
SECTION 2. Prohibition - A person may not knowingly permit a motor vehicle owned or				
	controlled by him/her to be driven upon any street, road or highway by a person who does no			
	have a valid driver's license issued by the Land Transportation Office.			
	SECTION 3. Exceptions This act shall not apply to a person or corporation duly			
	licensed to engage in a driving school business.			
	SECTION 4. Penalties (a) Any person who shall violate any provision of Section 3 c			
	this Act shall upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than One thousand pesos			
	(P1,000.00) but not more than Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than			
	one (1) month but not more than six (6) mont	ths, or both up	on the discretion of the court.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part thereof, is held invalid or
unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
valid and subsisting.

5 SECTION 6. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive 6 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or inconsistent 7 with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

9 SECTION 7. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 10 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
