## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article XIII, Section 12, provides:

"The State shall establish and maintain an effective food and drug regulatory system and undertake appropriate health manpower development and research, responsive to the country's health needs and problems."

This bill requires that food products treated with an additive, colorant, or any other method to enhance its appearance or flavor include a clear, conspicuous, and easily readable label on the packaging or menu stating so, and advising the consumer to check the ingredients to determine its possible detrimental effect. Additives such as sodium nitrate, monosodium glutamate and colorants are sometimes used so that the food served will last longer and taste better. Although the ingredients are necessary for consumer items sold in groceries, the practice of including ingredients in the menu or packaging served in food establishments is not observed.<sup>1</sup>

7	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be referred to as the "Food Establishment

18	SECTION 4. Penalty for non-observanceThe business license of the food establishment

20	SECTION 5. Separability Clause If any part or provision of this Act is held invalid or
21	unconstitutional, the other parts or provisions thereof shall remain valid and effective.
22	SECTION 6. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, proclamations, rules and
23	regulations or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed,
