

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Presidential Decree No. 1866, as amended, which codifies laws on firearms and explosives, does not contain any provision to make it unlawful for any person to manufacture, import, sell, ship, deliver, possess, transfer, or receive firearms that are not detectable by metal detectors used by police and military authorities.

The manufacture, importation and sale of such undetectable firearms contribute to the ever increasing crime rate in the country. If these undetectable firearms will not be prohibited, metal detectors, more particularly those being used in airports for public security and safety, will be of no purpose at all.


This bill seeks to reduce if not totally eliminate the crimes and the resulting deaths and injuries through the use of such undetectable firearms.¹

1 AN ACT
2 TO PROHIBIT CERTAIN FIREARMS ESPECIALLY USEFUL TO TERRORISTS

3
4 *Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in*
5 *Congress assembled:*
6

7 SECTION 1. *Short Title.* - This Act may be cited as the "Undetectable Firearms Act."
8

9 SECTION 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
10 protect public security and safety by prohibiting certain firearms especially useful to terrorists.
11

12 SECTION 3. *Definition of Terms.* -For purposes of this Act, the term:

13 (A) "Major component" means with respect to a firearm, the barrel, the slide or cylinder,
14 or the frame or receiver of the firearm;

15 (B) "Firearm" does not include the frame or receiver of any such weapon; and

16 (C) "Security Exemplar" means an object, to be fabricated at the direction of the
17 Secretary of National Defense, that is-

18 (1) Constructed of, during the 12-month period beginning on the date of the enactment
19 of this Act; and

20 (2) Suitable for testing and calibrating metal detectors.
21

22 SECTION 4. *Prohibitions.* - It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, import,
23 sell, ship, deliver, possess, transfer, or receive and firearm-

24 (A) That, after the removal of grips, stocks and magazines, is not detectable as the
25 Security Exemplar, by walk-through metal detectors calibrated and operated to
26 detect the Security Exemplar;

27 (B) Any major component of which, when subjected to inspection by the types of x-ray
28 machines commonly used at airports, does not generated an image that accurately
29 depicts the shape of the component.
30

31 SECTION 5. *Penalty.* - Any violation of this Act shall be punished with a fine of not less
32 than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than three (3) months or
33 both at the discretion of the court. If the offense is committed by a corporation, trust, firm,

1 partnership or association or other entity, the penalty shall be imposed upon the guilty officer or
2 officers of such corporation, trust, firm, partnership or association or entity.

3
4 SECTION 6. *Separability Clause.* - If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
5 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
6 valid and subsisting.

7
8 SECTION 7. *Repealing Clause.* - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
9 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule and regulation contrary to, or inconsistent
10 with the provisions of this Act, is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

11
12 SECTION 8. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
13 in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
