## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Republic Act No. 9147, also known as the "Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act" provides that it shall be the policy of the State to conserve the country's wildlife resources and their habitats for sustainability.

According to a study conducted in the United States, the ethic of hunting involves the consideration of fair chase, which allows the animal the opportunity to avoid the hunter. The study also showed that since exotic animals are clustered in a captive setting at unusually high densities, these animals attract disease more readily than more widely dispersed native species who roam freely. Thus, the transportation of captive exotic animals to commercial hunt operations can facilitate the spread of disease across great distances.

This bill seeks to prohibits the transfer, transport, or possession of a confined exotic animal, for the purposes of allowing the killing or injuring of that animal for entertainment or for the collection of a trophy. <sup>1</sup>

Short Title. - This Act may be cited as the "Exotic Animal Protection Act". 7 8 SECTION 2. Definition of Terms. – As used in this Act, the term: 9 (1) "Confined exotic animal" shall refer to "exotic species", as defined under the 10 Republic Act No. 9147 a.k.a. "Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act", that has 11 been held in captivity, whether or not the defendant knows the length of the captivity, for the 12 shorter of the majority of the animal's life, or a period of 1 year; and 13 (2) "Captivity" does not include any period during which an animal lives as it would in 14 the wild surviving primarily by foraging for naturally occurring food; roaming at will over an open area of not less than 1,000 acres; and having the opportunity to avoid hunters. 15 16 SECTION 3. Transport or Possession of Exotic Animals for Purposes of Killing or Injuring Them. - Whoever, in or substantially affecting domestic or foreign commerce, 17 knowingly transfers, transports, or possesses a confined exotic animal, for the purposes of 18 allowing the killing or injuring of that animal for entertainment or for the collection of a trophy, 19 20 shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00), and

SECTION 4. *Enforcement.* – Any person authorized by the Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) may:
