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EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article II, Section 26, provides: "The State shall guarantee equal access to opportunities for public service....as may be defined by law."

Executive Order No. 292, otherwise known as the Administrative Code of the Philippines, provides for the recruitment and selection of employees. Section 21 further provides that "opportunity for government employment shall be open to all qualified citizens and positive efforts shall be exerted to attract the best qualified to enter the service."

Government invests heavily in education through state colleges and universities. Hence, priority should be given to qualified honor graduates of public schools in the recruitment of civil service personnel. This would also serve as an incentive for students in government-funded schools to excel academically.*

AN ACT GRANTING PRIORITY TO HONOR GRADUATES OF STATE COLLEGES AND STATE UNIVERSITIES IN THE APPOINTMENT OF CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Public Honor Graduates

 Priority Act."
- SECTION 2. Priority in Appointment. In the appointment of civil service employees,
 priority shall be given to honor graduates of state colleges and state universities of the
 Philippines: Provided, that the employees possesses all the minimum qualifications for the
 position as required by law.
- SECTION 3. *Penalties*. In the exercise of its disciplinary authority, the Civil Service

 Commission shall impose the following administrative sanctions for any willful violation of this

 act: (1) First Violation suspension of one (1) month without pay; (2) Second Violation –

 suspension of two (2) months without pay; and (3) Third violation and subsequent violations

 hereof suspension of six (6) months without pay.
- SECTION 4. Rules and Regulations. The Civil Service Commission shall prescribe the rules and regulations necessary to implement this Act. The Civil Service Commission shall furnish the House of Representatives a copy of the rules and regulations within ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act.

- SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
- 2 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
- 3 valid and subsisting.
- 4 SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
- 5 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent
- 6 with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
- 7 SECTION 7. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
- 8 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
