EXPLANATORY NOTE

P.D. 1866 which codifies laws on firearms, ammunition, or explosives does not contain any provision to make unlawful for any person to manufacture and sell a firearm which does not have as an integral part a device which prevents a child from discharging the firearm for any reason of strength, dexterity, cognitive skill, or other ability.

This bill seeks to reduce if not eliminate injuries and deaths caused by accidental firearm shootings by children by making safety devices in firearm a condition for their sale or importation.*

- (C) In the case of a handgun other than a revolver, clearly indicate whether the magazine or chamber contains a round of ammunition.
- SECTION 5. *Penalty*. Any violation of this Act shall be punished with a fine of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P 50,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than three (3) months or both at the discretion of the court. If the offense is committed by a corporation, trust, firm, partnership or association or other entity, the penalty shall be imposed upon the guilty offender upon the guilty officer or officers of such corporation, trust, firm, partnership or entity.
 - SECTION 6. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, the reminder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
 - SECTION 7. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or inconsistent with, the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
- SECTION 8. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
