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## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This bill seeks to provide for disclosure of fire safety standards and measures with respect to campus buildings of higher learning by calling upon colleges and universities to report information on the level of fire safety on their campuses to the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and to the public

This legislation will help parents to identify schools that set a strong emphasis on fire safety. When selecting a school, students and parents must also consider the school's track record when it comes to fire safety. The Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know Act will provide them with the vital information they need to make an informed decision.<sup>1</sup>

SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the	e "Campus Fire S	Safety Right-to-

(1) Fire Safety Reports Required - Each eligible institution participating in any program									
under this title shall, beginning in academic next following the effectivity of this Act, and each									
year thereafter, prepare, publish, and distribute, through appropriate publications or mailings, to									
all current students and employees, and to any applicant for en	nrollment or em	ployment upon							
request, an annual fire safety report containing at least the follow	ving information	with respect to							
the campus fire safety practices and standards of that institution:									
(a) A statement that identifies each st	udent housing	facility of the							
institution, and whether or not that facility is equip	pped with a fire s	prinkler system							
or other fire safety systems, or both;									
(b) Statistics concerning the occurrence on	campus, during	the 2 preceding							
calendar years for which data are available, of	fires and false	fire alarms in							

student housing facilities.

1	(c) For each such occurrence, a statement of the numan injuries or deaths
2	and the structural damage caused by the occurrence.
3	(d) Information regarding fire alarms, smoke alarms, the presence of
4	adequate fire escape planning or protocols, rules on portable electrical appliances,
5	smoking and open flames (such as candles), regular mandatory supervised fire
6	drills, and planned and future improvement in fire safety.
7	(2) Rule of Construction - Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to authorize the
8	Chairman to require particular policies, procedures, or practices by institutions of higher
9	education with respect to fire safety.
10	(3) Reports - Each institution participating in any program under this title shall make
11	periodic reports to the campus community on fires and false fire alarms that are reported to local
12	fire departments in a manner that will aid the prevention of similar occurrences.
13	(4) Reports to the Chairman - On an annual basis, each institution participating in any
14	program under this title shall submit to the Secretary a copy of the statistics required to be made
15	available under paragraph (1)(B). The Chairman shall:
16	(a) review such statistics;
17	(b) make copies of the statistics submitted to the Chairman available to the
18	public; and
19	(c) in coordination with representatives of institutions of higher education,
20	identify exemplary fire safety policies, procedures, and practices and disseminate
21	information concerning those policies, procedures, and practices that have proven
22	effective in the reduction of campus fires.
23	SECTION 4. Report to Congress by the Chairman of CHED Within one (1) year after
24	the effectivity of this Act, the Chairman shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report
25	containing
26	(1) an analysis of the current status of fire safety systems in college and university
27	facilities, including sprinkler systems;
28	(2) an analysis of the appropriate fire safety standards to apply to these facilities, which
29	the Chairman shall prepare after consultation with such fire safety experts, representatives of

l	institutions of	higher	education,	and	other	government	agencies	as	the	Chairman,	considers
2	appropriate:										

- (3) an estimate of the cost of bringing all nonconforming dormitories and other campus buildings up to current new building codes; and
- 5 (4) recommendations from the Chairman concerning the best means of meeting fire 6 safety standards in all college facilities, including recommendations for methods to fund such 7 cost.
- 8 SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act is held invalid or 9 unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain 10 valid and subsisting.
  - SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
  - SECTION 7. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
