EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article II, Section 14 provides:

Section 14. The State recognizes the role of women in nation-building, and shall ensure the fundamental equality before the law of men and women.

Certain diseases, disorders, and conditions are peculiar to, or more serious, or more prevalent in women. For this reason, the factors of medical risk or type of medical intervention are different for them.

Unfortunately, the government fails to meet women's health needs. Perhaps due to its failure to understand that women have unique health conditions, the government could not provide health programs, specially designed for women.

To address this issue, this bill seeks to establish an office on women's health within the Department of Health in order to:

(1) Establish short-range and long-range goals and objectives and coordinate all activities within the Department of Health that relate to disease prevention, health promotion, service delivery, research, and public and health care professional education concerning women;

(2) Provide expert advice and consultation to the Secretary concerning scientific, legal, ethical, and policy issues relating to women's health; and

(3) Monitor the Department of Health offices, agencies, and regional activities regarding women's health and coordinate and stimulate activities of such departmental and agency offices on women's health.*

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1 AN ACT
2 ESTABLISHING AN OFFICE ON WOMEN'S HEALTH OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
3 HEALTH

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

4 SECTION 1. *Short Title.* – This Act shall be known as the “Women’s Health Office Act.”

5 SECTION 2. *Definition.* – As used in this section, the term “women’s health conditions”,
6 with respect to women of all age, ethnic, and racial groups, means all diseases, disorders, and
7 conditions –

8 (A) Unique to, more serious, or more prevalent in women; and

9 (B) For which the factors of medical risk or type of medical intervention are different for
10 women, or for which it is unknown whether such factors or types are different for
11 women.

12 SECTION 3. *Health Office on Women’s Health.* – There shall be established within the
13 Office of the Secretary an Office on Women’s Health, hereafter referred to in this section as the
14 “Office”. The Office shall be headed by an Assistant Secretary in an *ex officio* capacity.

15 SECTION 4. *Duties.* – The Office shall, with respect to the health concerns of women –

16 (A) Establish short-range and long-range goals and objectives and coordinate all
17 activities within the Department of Health that relate to disease prevention, health
18 promotion, service delivery, research, and public and health care professional
19 education concerning women;

- 1 (B) Provide expert advice and consultation to the Secretary concerning scientific, legal,
2 ethical, and policy issues relating to women's health;
- 3 (C) monitor the Department of Health offices, agencies, and regional activities regarding
4 women's health and coordinate and stimulate activities of such departmental and
5 agency offices on women's health;
- 6 (D) Establish a Department of Health Coordinating Committee on Women's Health to be
7 chaired by an Assistant Secretary for Women's Health which shall be composed of
8 senior level representatives from each of the agencies and offices of the Department
9 of Health;
- 10 (E) Establish a National Women's Health Information Center to --
- 11 (1) Facilitate the exchange of information regarding matters relating to health
12 information and health promotion, preventive health services, research
13 advances and education in the appropriate use of health care;
- 14 (2) Facilitate access to such information;
- 15 (3) Assist in the analysis of issues and problems relating to the matters described
16 in this paragraph; and
- 17 (4) Provide technical assistance with respect to the exchange of information,
18 including facilitating the development of materials for such technical
19 assistance;
- 20 (F) Coordinate efforts to promote women's health programs and policies in the private
21 sector;
- 22 (G) Through publications and any other means appropriate, provide for the exchange of
23 information between members of the Office, grantees of the office, and the general
24 public;
- 25 (H) Determine the current Agency level of activity regarding women's health, across age,
26 biological, and socio-cultural context, in all aspects of the Department's work,
27 including drafting technical practice guidelines, and conducting research into patient
28 outcomes, delivery of health care-services, and access to health care;

- 1 (I) Establish short-range and long-range goals and objectives for research important to
2 women's health and coordinate all other activities within the Department that relate
3 to health services and medical effectiveness research;
- 4 (J) Identify projects in women's health that should be conducted or supported by the
5 Department;
- 6 (K) Consult with health professionals, non-governmental organizations, consumer
7 organizations, women's health professionals, and other individuals and groups, as
8 appropriate, on the Department's policy with regard to women; and
- 9 (L) Identify the need for such research, and make an estimate each fiscal year of the
10 funds needed to adequately support the research.

11 SECTION 5. *Grants and Contracts Regarding Duties.* – In carrying out the Office's
12 duties, the Secretary, acting through the Office, may make grants to, and enter into cooperative
13 agreements, contracts, and interagency agreements with public and non-profit entities, agencies,
14 and organizations.

15 SECTION 6. *Evaluation and Dissemination.* – The Office shall directly or through
16 contracts with public and private entities, agencies, and organization, provide for evaluations of
17 projects carried out with financial assistance provided under the preceding section and for the
18 dissemination of information developed as a result of such projects.

19 SECTION 7. *Reports.* – Not later than January 31 of each year, the Secretary shall
20 prepare and submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a report describing the activities
21 carried out under this Act during the period for which the report is being prepared.

22 SECTION 8. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
23 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid
24 and subsisting.

1 SECTION 9. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
2 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent
3 with the provision of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

4 SECTION 10. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
5 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
