EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 11, Section 15 provides that "State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them."

Milk consumers are improperly informed about the contents of the milk they acquire from the market. There are also no uniform standards as to the contents of the skim milk, low fat milk, and milk as beverage in final package.

In accordance with this constitutional mandate, this bill provides for the proper labelling of milk products indicating distinctly in its package the non-fat and protein content of the milk and sets standards on the contents of milk solids that are fat in the classification of skim milk, low fat milk and milk as beverage. With this innovation it is expected that the consuming public will be informed about the nutritional contents and value of the milk they consume. The quality of milk will likewise be upgraded in order to conform to proper nutritional standards.¹
