## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This Bill seeks to convert the Bato-Bato Lapid-Lapid Provincial Road in the Municipality of Panglima Sugala, Province of Tawi-Tawi into a national road which shall be under the supervision of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH).

Considering the vital role that roads play in the process of development, it is not enough that they are constructed; they must also be properly maintained. Without good roads, commercial transactions and other economic activities are unduly affected. Due to the limited financial capabilities of the provincial government of Tawi-Tawi, the abovemetioned routes could hardly be maintained thus transferred to the national government.

Consideration of this bill would stir up economic activities in the province as it would make trade, commerce and industry accessible to all, thereby opening better opportunities which will accelerate economic progress.

Approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

## AN ACT CONVERTING THE BATO-BATO - LAPID-LAPID PROVINCIAL ROAD IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF PANGLIMA SUGALA, PROVINCE OF TAWI-TAWI INTO A NATIONAL ROAD

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 4 Sec. 2. The Secretary of the Department of Public Works and Highways

- 8 a newspaper of general circulation.
