EXPLANATORY NOTE

In 2007, GMA-7 aired a documentary entitled "Katay Kabayo" hosted and written by Ms. Sandra Aguinaldo. She discovered that when horses figure in accidents in the race tracks, like those who break their legs, some of them go straight to the butchers instead of receiving medical care.

Several illegal slaughterhouses reportedly surround the Sta. Ana Race Track, with staff just waiting for the next accident to happen. The injured race horses are violently killed, sometimes in the open street. After tying their legs together, the horses are hit on the head, then chopped into pieces. It is allegedly a lucrative trade as the horse owners sell the animals at a low rate to the traders, while the horse meat can go for as high as 140 pesos per kilo when sold at the market.

Hence, this bill seeks to prohibit certain conduct relating to the use of horses for human consumption.¹
